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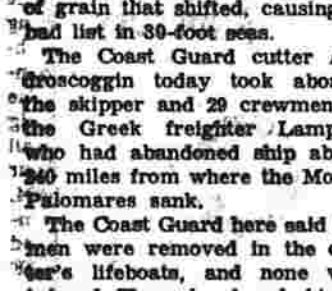

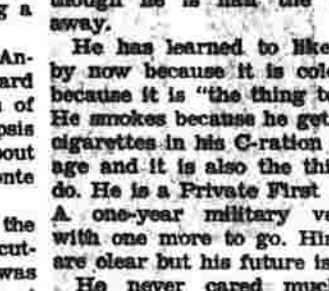

To meet this demand, the board has authorized the hiring of 59 new teachers, including 30 elementary school teachers, 15 high school teachers, and 14 special education teachers. Five Doctors Shift Practice To Emergency

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. (AP) — Five doctors have given up private practices to head together to staff the emergency room at Western Memorial Hospital on a round-the-clock basis.

"This is no place to retire to. This is hard work," says Dr. John F. Sigbee, 46, one of the five who called themselves the Western Emergency Associates.

"But it gives me a chance to do the kind of work I like to do," he adds. "And it puts me in the spot that I think is the only weak link in our otherwise very good medical services in this community."

Like many hospitals, Western was faced with a rising number of emergency room cases and not enough doctors to care for them. The hospital had no terms or residents.

Three years ago, Sigbee and three other doctors formed their emergency room association. They work in shifts, 48 hours a week.

Fifth joined the team last year as the number of cases treated in the emergency room rose from 50,000 to 264,000.

"The kind of service we are offering has attracted more patients," says Sigbee, "and more doctors are referring to us."

Pirates Quieted
CLACTON, England (AP) — A pirate pop radio station based aboard a converted minesweeper broke loose from its mooring today, drifted into British territorial waters and promptly went off the air.

"We have had to stop broadcasting because we have come within the three-mile limit. Programs will be resumed as soon as we are back in our correct position," said Philip Birch, managing director of the station known as Radio London.

The ship operates outside territorial waters to escape the British ban on commercial radio.

Escape Probed
BERLIN (AP) — The U.S. Army is investigating the case of two American soldiers accused of illegally supplying the American military uniforms which three East Germans used to escape to West Berlin.

A spokesman said Tuesday the outcome of the investigation will determine whether Pfc. Michael R. Herman, 21, of Portland, Ore., and Spec. 4 William G. Taylor, 22, of Hartsburg, Tenn., will be brought to trial. The two soldiers are under arrest.

The Democratic Socialists voted overwhelmingly Tuesday for the merger at the close of their national congress. The Socialists voted last November for a reunion. They now have to draw up and approve a common charter.

A united Socialist party would control 94 seats in the 630-seat Parliament compared to 260 for the Christian Democrats.

Lady Bird Gets Award

WASHINGTON (AP) — Mrs. Lyndon B. Johnson and Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller of New York led a list of 16 individuals and organizations receiving Whopping Crane awards Tuesday night for their efforts to preserve and conserve America's natural beauty.

MHA chairman Theodore Bramdour, in making the announcement last night, said that the units may be located at one or two or three sites in town, to follow the national trend of placing such housing in neighborhoods of all age groups.

He said that the MHA desires to apply for added units based on the number of applications on file for the 100 units being constructed off W. Center St.

He announced that the new addition to the existing 100-unit Westfall Gardens is scheduled for July completion - two months ahead of schedule.

The addition of 10 one-story buildings will contain 80 one-bedroom and 20 efficiency apartments.

The existing Westfall Gardens contains 50 one-bedroom, 40 two-bedroom, and 10 efficiency apartments.

Bramdour said that the two-bedroom apartment complex has proved impractical and that, on the recommendation of the PHA, no more of them will be constructed.

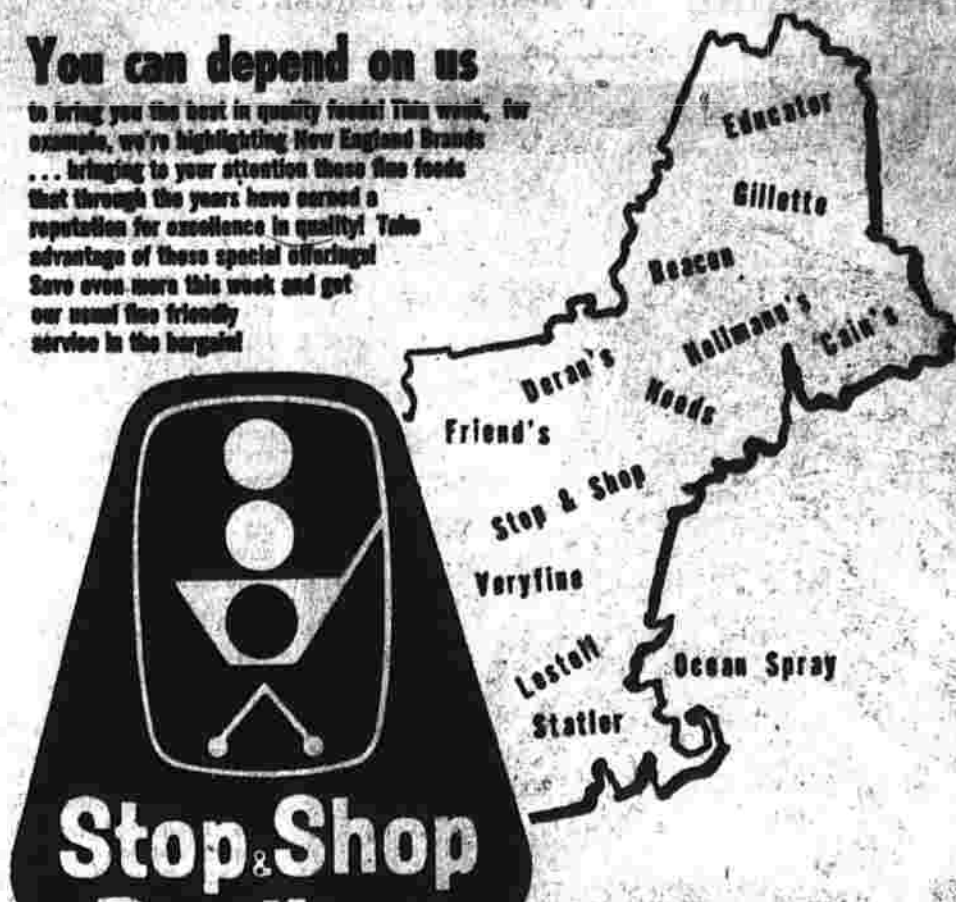

The American male is just now reaping the benefits of the fashion bill of rights which developed after World War II, says Robert L. Green of New York.

Green was on hand Monday night as producer of the Dallas presentation of the Caswell-Kilgus fashion awards, held here for the first time.

South Windsor School Board Sets Calendar, Will Consider METRO Plan

The school calendar for 1966-67 was approved by the board of education last night. The board also approved a motion expressing interest in studying an out-of-town pupil placement program (the Metro Plan) proposed by the Hartford-area superintendent's group. Mrs. Jane Romney, board chairman, was authorized to represent the board in discussions of the plan.

The board also decided that the kindergarten classes whose hours are being switched at mid-term will make the changes over on the last Monday in January. At that time, the first-term morning session will become the afternoon session, and vice-versa.

The school calendar, for the academic year beginning in September, provides a total of 183 teaching days. Any days lost to winter storms will result in extension of the calendar in June. If no time is lost due to weather conditions, schools will close on June 21, 1967.

A five-day vacation in February and a five-day vacation in April are planned for next year. School will open Sept. 8. Other holidays will be Oct. 25 (teachers conference); Nov. 8, 11, 24 and 25 (election day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving recess); Dec. 26 to Jan. 2 (Christmas recess); March 24 (Good Friday), and May 30 (Memorial Day).

Dr. Robert Larrick said the 183 day year is more than the state minimum requirement of 180 days, but is not so high as some area towns with as many as 185 days.

Mrs. Romney noted that the average length of the school calendar of surrounding towns is 183.6 days per year.

The board also set the date for the high school graduation to be held on the scheduled "day" of the school year.

Superintendent of Schools Charles Warner noted that in the past, the senior class has been out of school several days before the closing day of the year. He said this practice has necessitated scheduling examinations at different times from the rest of the high school.

The subject of graduation ceremonies at the eighth grade level was placed on the next agenda. Warner noted that the administration and board of education are in favor of de-emphasizing ceremonies for Grade 8.

He said the administration advocates an assembly program in the afternoon for eighth grade students, where awards and certificates of completion could be presented.

Open participation in discussion of the out-of-town pupil placement plan, part of the Metropolitan Water, Toward Regional Opportunity (METRO), was proposed by Warner. The program explores the possibility of initiating regional school programs.

The Hartford-area school superintendents association has requested the board of education to agree to include their interest in such a study.

The board discussed making a study on the proposed middle school to down residents.

David Morrison, James Arnold and the other board members were generally pleased and ready to do as much as possible to the date of the referendum on the middle school.

Michael Kelly of the South Windsor Educational Association (SWEA) said this application for the middle school is a "real need" and offered the association's assistance in preparing the plan. He said the cost of preparing the plan is \$25,000, and that the board accepted the application.

board's offer to pay one-half the cost.

Arnold said the public information subcommittee of the board recommended sponsoring spot announcements on the radio, reminding town residents to vote on the referendum question. These would be public service announcements and would be broadcast without charge, Arnold said.

B52 Bombing Raid Precision Operation

ANDERSEN AIR FORCE BOMBERS (AP) — Miles high more than two dozen B52 bombers — landed a cold war in the South Viet Nam today.

Other bombers in the B52 strike were struck other areas in the area.

The bomber is capable of sending out electronic signals to track enemy radar as it drives in to drop its bombs. This was Smith's job.
