More Fighting Men Bulk of Strength To Ground Forces

WASHINGTON (AP)—The vast bulk of the 115,000 additional fighting men sought by the Johnson Administration will be used to strengthen Army and Marine ground forces, it was learned today.

American ground forces are being expanded to 420,000 men, mostly for the combat role in the Viet Nam war.

The Navy and Air Force each will get only a few thousand more men in the new buildup, which will push total U. S. armed strength over the 3 million mark for the first time in a dozen years.

Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara told newsmen at the White House Monday that the Administration will use Congress to vote another \$12.246 billion to underwrite the hearing costs of the U. S. involvement in Viet Nam.

The White House said \$416 million will also be needed for economic aid to the Government of South Vietnam, bringing the supplemental total to \$12.742 billion.

McNamara provided few details, beyond disclosing the dollar figure and the new manpower increase in ground forces. The Pentagon took their cue from the defense secretary and refused to elaborate.

The new administration money request—hurried as long ago as last summer—will be sent to Capitol Hill Tuesday and McNamara will give the specifics in testimony before senators on Thursday.

This is the second major supplementary money request and the first since the Vietnam war began.

**Connecticut Yankee**  
 By A.H.O.

Here, in the middle of January, the single thing that is bothering me more than all the other things is the fact that the affairs of state and world is a relatively unimportant, almost private matter.

It is a very small brook which refuses to start.

We can see where the brook would be, if it were running, by an occasional drop of sleet; a few dried out old remnants of jewel weed, and by the two bridges we have over the years handcrafted across it. There are also, above and below our intimate acquaintance with its roots, its highway culverts for it to flow under when it flows.

It has never been a very lively stream, although during the famous brook of the Connecticut '60's, it did attain the temporary proportions of a raging creek.

Normally, it reaches its peak after the first big spring thaw, and then recedes faithfully to such spring rains come along, and then swindles out of sight some time in July, and then comes to life again with some good rain in November.

Then, sometime in December, it accumulates its first edges of ice, and it is transparent casing beneath which it runs with a musical gurgle, and by this time in January, it is still as hard as a hammer, impenetrable fortress, full of secret lairs for muskrat and variable currents which would bubble up, here and there, to form a sort of whirlpool eye in the ice and look up at the low blue of the winter sky.

For roughly two thirds of every year, then, in the normal course of events, our brook contributes to the sound and sight of our landscape. It is unassuming in its own way, but after all, a very small brook.

Our friendship with this small brook has now extended more than two decades, during which we have come to depend on it, as one depends on a friend, for its assurance of its being there, ready to offer companionship, life and animation in any moment of a need for company or conversation, or just the language of motion.

In all these years, the brook has never before been dry in January.

We find ourselves a bit lost without it. We are even tempted into comic thoughts about it. In this, perhaps, the quiet insignificant way landscapes have begun to change from verdure to desert—in the failure of some small brook to start up again in winter. But mostly our missing the brook is simple and elemental. We miss the conversation, and the motion, and the ice castles glistening in the sun, and there are enough to miss, and to worry about, for the moment, without going into the question of what is going to happen in New England if drought lasts this far into winter.

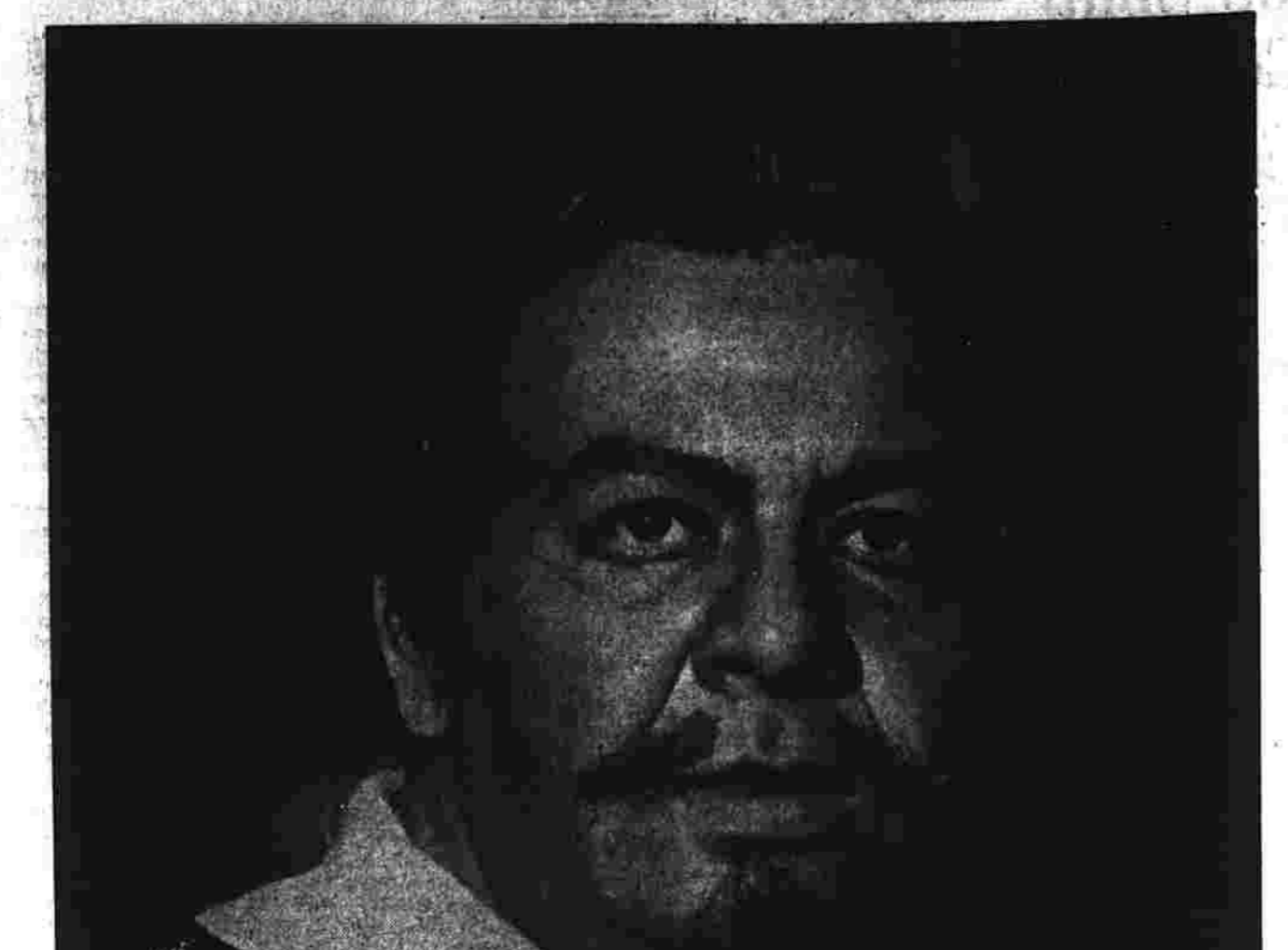

**Before We Create More of It?**

Dr. Glenn T. Seaborg, chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission, delivered a lecture down at Georgetown University yesterday, with the title "Science in a World of Widening Horizons."

He offered his audience two enticing possibilities.

One was that man might be able to create life, in his laboratories, "before the end of this decade."

The second possibility he offered was that man may well have reached that point in history, that stage in his development, where he has not only been made master of his fate, but where his technology and his morality have come face to face, where we now realize that we are essentially all in the same boat together.

As Dr. Seaborg expanded on this possibility, he included the prospect that man would learn to generate or cure a blackout.

The latest blackout was nothing visual, but purely statistical. It descended upon the checking accounts of one of the great New York City banks the other day. This bank had a master computer doing the work for its 135 metropolitan branches. When the computer went moody, and stayed that way for more than a day, despite the best efforts of the best repairmen, some three billion dollars worth of checking accounts went into some sort of temporary anarchy, in which nobody had any way of knowing what deposits were being made, what checks were being honored, or what balances were.

In an emergency situation like this, the bank was supposed to call on all on other computing equipment in other banks to help out. But the breakdown happened to come on a day when all the banks were busy with crowded transactions of their own. So darkness fell on a huge slice of the city's commercial life.

Essentially, however, the other computers did nothing to rescue, and the bank in question could resume its business.

The bank's paralysis, while it lasted, was an actual illustration of the dilemma posed by the advance of the computers. Without computers, present day modern banking couldn't cope with the load of business it has to handle. Thanks to the computers, banks are also beginning to expand the variety of services they offer the community. But, as against this increased need for computers, there exists the weird nightmare of what happens when computers decide to take a little time off.

One of the more pleasant nightmares which suggests itself has a computer going berserk enough to wipe out all records, whereupon a bank and all its customers would have to sit down in an atmosphere of mutual trust, and make up fresh new balances for everybody.
