Before We Create More Of It? Dr. Glenn T. Seaborg, chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission, delivered a lecture down at Georgetown University yesterday, with the title "Science in a World of Widening Horizons."

He offered his audience two enticing One was that man might be able to create life, in his laboratories, "before

the end of this decade." The second possibility he offered was that man "may well have reached that point in history, that stage in his development, where he has not only been made master of his fate, but where his technology and his morality have come face to face, where we now realize that we are essentially all in the same boat

As Dr. Seaborg expanded on this possibility, he included the prospect that man would learn to eradicate war, hunger, water shortages and pollution.

Would Dr. Seaborg mind very much if we held off on the creation of more life until we have indeed learned to do a mewhat more civilized job with what

history, and it would not be much fun if there were. The chain of events which make up history for us may occasionally dwindle in size so that sometimes the links seem so thin as to be almost nonexistent. But it is never really broken. There is always some consequence reaching forward to become part of some new cause.

By this theory, the battle of Jericho has had something to do with the battle of Stalingrad. We will not volunteer to trace the precise linkage, but it might be much easier than we think. Perhaps some of the sound effects in both battles were similar, from Joshua's trumpets to some diehard Russian radio station which kept blasting defiance to

By something of the same logic, there comes a headline now and then which suggests that finish has not yet been written to the glamorous story of how President Eisenhower and the cloak and dagger men of the CIA once manufactured and conducted an anti-Communist revolution in Guatemala and thereby saved that country for democracy and freedom. This action, as it now stands in the


informal history of our times, has the ranking of a bold and famous victory over the Communists, and any delicate considerations of the possibility that it might have been filegal, and a violation of pledged principles of conduct with our good neighbors have all been ruled out on the ground that the operation was a success and that this was an instance when, since we were dealing with Communists and defending free dom, the end justified the means.

But was there an end? When and what was it? The latest headline from Guatemala tells of the uneasiness that country is feeling as it struggles to evolve out of its present military dicatorship into some legitimate, elected, constitutional regime. A few hundred Communist terrorists, it is said, are nanaging to keep the country upset and in apprehensive turmoil. Since the famous Eisenhower coup for democracy, there has been no measurable improvement in the economy, the literacy, or the political stability of the people of

So, a decade later, the country reseued, Guatemala itself, is still in debatable shape. One can argue that it might have been in much worse shape, in total Communist subjection, if the CIA had not staged its little revolution. But one cannot, unfortunately, prove alternatives not tried. One can speculate upon, but not con-

clusively prove, other possible sequels to the Guatemalan coup.

Because of its successful coup in Guatemala, the Eisenhower adminis-tration, or the CIA, found themselves able to use Guatemala as the supposedly secret training place for the Cuban Subspendence forces which eventually

At this point in this editorial, which was written yesterday, we have to inrrupt and amend to take notice of a New York Times report, this morning, of an analytical speech delivered yeserday by Columnist James Reston. Ir speech, Reston advanced the theory that the failure at the Bay of Pigs, and the subsequent cockiness of Khrushchev at Vienna, were factors which led President Kennedy, for no other sharp reason at the moment than to show Khrushchev he wasn't beaten, to order that 1961 increase in American nilitary activity in Vietnam which Reston theorizes, was the prelude to our present plight there.

Similarly, without Guatemala, and without a Castro strengthened by the Bay of Pigs flasco, the Johnson administration, in its turn, might never have felt either privileged or required to invade the Dominican Republic, with whatever the long range hemisphere sequences of that action may prove to be. We still don't know whether, by our Dominican action, we preserved or lost Latin America.

Even those who proceed on the theory that the end justifles the means have to give history a lingering chance to decide whether or not they really obtained their ends after all.

Guatemala, and thereby Latin America, and perhaps thereby the world, may have been saved or may have been lost. It is still too early in the story to know for mure.

Holiday From Balance

The latest blackout was nothing vis-

ual, but purely statistical. It descended upon the checking accounts of one of the great New York City banks the other day. This bank had one master computer doing the work for its 135 metropolitan branches. When the computer went moody, and stayed that way for more than a day, despite the best efforts of the best repairmen, some hree billion dollars worth of checking accounts went into some sort of tem porary anarchy, in which nobody had any way of knowing what deposits were being made, what checks were being honored, or what balances were.

In an emergency situation like this, the bank was supposed to be able to call other computing equipment in other panks to help out. But the breakdown happened to come on a day when all the other computers in New York were busy with crowded transactions of their own. So darkness fell on a huge slice of the city's commercial life.

Eventually, however, the other computers did come to the rescue, and the bank in question could resume its busi-

The bank's paralysis, while it lasted, was an illustration of the dilemma posed by the advance of the computers. Without computers, present day modern banking couldn't begin to cope with the load of business it has to handle. Thanks to the computers, banks are also beginning to expand the variety of services they offer the community. But, as against this increased need for comouters, and this increased reliance on computers, there exists the weird nightmare of what happens when computers decide to take a little time off.

One of the more pleasant nightmares which suggests itself has a computer going berserk enough to wipe out all records, whereupon a bank and all its customers would have to sit down in an atmosphere of mutual trust, and make up fresh new balances for everybody.
