

In a special message, Johnson announced he will soon appoint a commission on rural poverty charged with making recommendations to him within a year on means of extending the nation's abundance to poverty-ridden country areas. In the meantime, he proposed an extensive planning program, with federal aid and including pilot projects in an unspecifie

In the pilot counties, Johnson said, government departments especially labor, welfare and agriculture, would join in a concerted effort to bring social services to poor rural communi

Huge "Big 11 Powerloop" includes 11 new electric generating plants, 700 miles of power lines, serving all six states. New efficiencies to make additional rate reductions possible.



In October, 1967, a new atomic plant for generating electricity will "go on the line" at Haddam. Connecticut—adding 500,000 kilowatts to the power supply of the six New England states.

This is only the first step in the "Big 11 Powerloop," a seven year building project shared by the electric companies have joined forces to tackle this construction job, unparalleled by any industry in the Northeast.

As the map shows, the "Big 11 Powerloop" will be comprised of 11 big-capacity power plants, tied together by 700 miles of high voltage lines to ensure dependable service for our customers throughout New England.

To complete the job, we will invest about \$1,500,000,000 -or more than \$450 for every family we serve.

By 1973, the "Big 11 Powerloop" alone will be producing some 6,250,000 kilowatts of new power, about 65% of the electricity our customers will be using. And this power, produced and transmitted more efficiently, will allow us to continue our policy of reducing electric rates whenever possible.

Since the end of World War II, the average price of electricity in New England has dropped steadily, with rate reductions in the last three years totalling \$22,000,000 on an annual basis. We expect to continue this trend. As new plants go into operation, their economies will lead to lower electric rates. In fact, we foresee rates dropping at an accelerated pace in the next seven years.

Then, as now, you'll have all the power you need. And more if you want it-because we'll have a reserve capacity of about 15% on hand.

We believe the "Big 11 Powerloop" is real proof of our confidence in the future of New England. As New England citizens and taxpayers (we paid \$179,000,000 in federal, state and local taxes in 1964) we want to share in its future and contribute to its growth.


