A Defense Of Missiles

Americans who have the time for it boday ought to steep themselves gently into the language and the logic used on their behalf, before the House Armed Services Subcommittee in Washington yesterday, by Defense Secretary Robert McNamara.

At first, an entry into the spirit and lingo of the McNamara discussion may seem a little strange and difficult, Ehrly in his testimony, for instance, one comes upon a paragraph like this: "For any given level of Soviet offensive capability, successive additions to each of our various damage-limiting systems have diminishing marginal value. The same principle holds for the damaging force as a whole; as additional forces are added, the incremental gain in effectiveness diminishes." The thing to do with a paragraph like that is to read it again, leave it alone, go on and read more of the Me-Namara testimony, and then come back to it. Eventually, one begins to adjust to the context. Eventually, it begins to

A little later on in his statement, Defense Secretary McNamara's vein of thought seemed to come a little clearor, almost to tell a story.

"Although no one can state with any degree of certainty how a general nuand the Soviet Union might evolve, for purposes of evaluating the assured destruction capabilities of our forces, we assume the worst possible case—that the Soviets strike first in a well-coordinated surprise attack. (Since a significant Chinese Communist nuclear threat to the Continental United States is not expected to develop any earlier than the 1975-1980 period, that threat can be omitted from this particular

"Even if the Soviets in the 1970 period were to assign their entire availble missile force to attacks on our strategic forces (reserving only refira missiles and bomber-delivered weapons for urban targets), our analysis shows that a very large proportion of our alert forces would still survive. And, for these surviving forces, a very large proportion could reliably deliver their payloads in their targets.

"The effective delivery of even onefifth of the surviving weapons to Soviet cities would destroy about one-third of the total population and half of the ndustrial capacity of the Soviet Union. By doubling the number of delivered weapons, Soviet fatalities and industrial capacity destroyed would be impressed by considerably less than one-

"Beyond this point, further increments of weapons delivered would not appreciably change the results, because we would have to bring under attack smaller cities, each requiring one deliv-"It is clear, therefore, that our

strategic offensive forces are for more than adequate to inflict unacceptable damage on the Soviet Union, even after absorbing a well-coordinated Soviet first strike against those forces. Indeed it appears that even a relatively small portion of these forces would furnish us with a completely adequate deterrent to a deliberate Soviet nuclear attack on the United States or its allies. "A considerably smaller number of reapons detonated over 50 Chinese urban centers would destroy half of the arban population (more than 50 million copie) and destroy more than one-half of their industry. Such an attack would also destroy most of the key governmental, technical and managerial personnel and a large proportion of the skilled workers.

"Thus, without any use of the bomber forces, the strategic missile forces recommended for the Fiscal Year 1967-71 period would provide substantially more force than is required for an assured destruction capability against both the Soviet Union and Communis hina simultaneously."

As the paragraph last quoted signaled quite clearly, Defense Secretary McNaara was, in this statement, all caught in technical arguments by which he as attempting to prove that missiles are superior to planes. All the things he said, in other words, were part of his

argument, not with Russis, not with China, but with members of Congress, and Air Force generals, who think the manned bomber should still be regarded as an essential and principal United States weapon. He was not threatening the destruction of Russia and China; he was merely discussing the technical problem of how to do it. If he displayed enthusiasm and dedication to the kind of strike which could produce 000,000 dead, his zeal was purely echnical and managerial. If he seemed downcast over the hard reality that smaller towns would each have to have a missile of their own, his feeling blue was not over the high cost of small town deaths, but over the inefficiency

Conceivably, all this is going to seem more threatening and less technical when it reaches readers in Moscow and

If it is not, and this does not epresent our nature and our purposes, now are we to make that clear?
