It suggested that the Selectmen appoint their own committee to furnish the commission with a list of office space needs, a suggestion that was turned down by Morra. It then suggested that the selectmen themselves furnish the commi sion with the list.

After the first selectmen left the meeting, the commission decided to do its own inves-tigating, and drafted a letter which will be sent to all boards and commissions, asking for their space requirements for the foreseable future, and what special needs they might have. Morra said that the needs include a room for the tax collector and assessors, which could also be used for the board of tax review; a public safety room, to be used by the resident state trooper and the constables, and a room for a put lic health nurse.

Morra said that an office fo the tax collector is an immedlate need; all records must now kept at the tax collector's home. Eventually, he said, four or five rooms will be needed A town meeting last April set uside up to \$300 for the PBC for the "preparation of plans ions to the Community Hall." At that time, the PBC was asked by the selectmen to look into three possibilities: Constructing three offices along the rear of the basement (where it is at ground - level) and replacing the lally columns, which are wood, under the whole hall; doing a complete renovation by constructing th three rooms and making a recreation hall under the main building (which would involve clearing the area of lally col umns and installing beams to just replacing the lally columns which are getting feeble.
