South Viet Nam. The death-dealing Viet Cong mines were set off on a road 10 miles southwest of Tuy Hoa, on the central coast where the U.S. 101st Airborne, South Korean marines and South Vietnamese troops have been roaming the countryside for several weeks while the rice was being har-

An American spokesman said the first blast was touched off about 7:30 a.m., catching a busload of farmers and killing 27 and wounding 11.

The explosion left a crater nine feet deep in the road, hurled the bus into a canal and scattered bodies along the road-

About an hour and a half later, the spokesman said, a three-wheel vehicle used as a bus and jammed with passengers drove along the same stretch of road and touched off a second mine. Another 20 Vietwounded.


