And whereas American discussion of possible peace negotiations has revolved around the question of whether or not we would ailow representatives of the Vietcong to sit in on the negotiations for that part of South Vietnam they hold and control, President de Gaulle's position seems to question the legitimacy of the government in South Vietnam with which we now consider ourselves allied. In fact, President de Gaulle seems to take the position that there will be no true government of any kind in South

and elections can be held. This seems to amount to a recommendation that the United States wants peace in Vietnam ,it will even have to begin by scuttling the very government it has worked so hard to keep standing. There is, therefore, almost as much of

Vietnam until the fighting has stopped,

a gulf between President de Gaulle and the United States on the possible conditions of a peace in Vietnam as there s between the United States and North There are, unfortunately, two rather

compelling reasons why we cannot refuse to try to look across that gulf. First, France was in Vietnam before we were, and may still have a better sense of how things really are there than we do. Second, de Gaulle is the veteran of the negotiations and concessions and the bridging of great gulfs that had to be achieved before he could bring peace to Algeria, which seems, more and more, an uncannily precise pattern of what Vietnam has become for us.


In The Mirror

A few days after Soviet Russia made the grand stand play of permitting one dissident Russian writer to journey over to Britain to deliver lectures critics of the Russian way of life, the same Soviet Russia revived the atmosphere of Stalin's famous purges with the trial and punishment of two other authors whom it had decided not to tolerate.

The visa for the Russian writer going to Britain was an open grand stand play. The trial of the two writers back home in Moscow was a closed, summary process affair.

The big decisive difference between the two kinds of writing involved seems to have been that the two writers put on trial were clever enough and reckless enough and yet artistic enough to know how really to hurt when they composed their fantastic exaggerations of what life in Russia is like.

Apparently, they had developed, in usule, their own imitation of those riters on the American scene who spefaline in the literature of the "abard." No fantasy was too lurid, no ping charge against their own so-



There are undoubtedly a good many mericans who would like to take the American counterparts to these two Russians and put them out for a few years of hard labor. And there is in this country too, some instinct to punish and suppress the publication of anyhing that could be used against the reputation and political institutions of this country, which was the sin for which the two Russians were convicted But there is still some difference between our two countries, a very pre-cious difference. Perhaps the greatest if a satirist is clever enough to find the ways really to hurt and disturb us by is attacks on American society and American politics, we begin wondering if we are not, after all, providing him with some of his material. We may detest him, and wish we were rid of him. But at the same time, we are likely to begin looking things over once again, ust to be sure he doesn't have too much of some weird kind of right in what he says. We may detest our "absurdists" but they do make us steal a glance

If Russia looks at its mirror today, it sees a rather ugly image of that Stalinism once supposed to be disappearing from Russian life.

York and Louisiana are the only states in the union with a liquor-purchase age that low (Mississippi has no minimum at all) does not mean that 18 is too young. On the other hand, if a 21-year old or a 45-year-old shows poor judgment in drinking, it should not be concluded that an 18-year-old is no more indiscreet. There has to be a law Mississippi notwithstanding, and it has to draw a line somewhere. It is wiser to draw it at the age level where most young people have attained reasonable maturity than to be swaved by the example of this or that exceptional 18 year-old; or to yield to the old bromide that a boy old enough to fight for his country is old enough to drink beer. The training that makes him a good soldier does not make him a responsible drink-
