

BONN, Germany (AP) — R's a long way from Saigon to Berlin, but Chancellor Ludwig Erhard's government now seems convinced that there is a link between those two endangered cities.

The United States has the equivalent of six divisions in West Germany, including the garrison in West Berlin. The Air Force has its European headquarters in Wiesbaden. Army and Air Force units are equipped with nuclear weapons, and make a more powe-ful force than the one in Viet Nam.

A year ago, Americans — including Sen. Robert F. Kennedy — were asking West Germans how they expected the United States to keep its pledge in their country if similar pledges were not kept on the other side of the world.
