Steps Taken **Big Blackout**

NEW YORK (AP) - The New York State Power Authority said recently it made three steps to prevent any recurrence of the massive power failure that blacked out much of the Northeastern United States and part of Canada last Nov. 9. Two of the steps would serve o minimize the effects of a power surge which has been officially found the cause of the blackout, the Authority said is

In the first step, a temporary one, the Authority said additional power differential relays were installed between Ontario Hydro, the Authority and the Niagara Mohawk Power Corpo-All three are on the power grid which connects the areas nvolved in the blackout.

When the blackout began is Ontario, Canada, power generated but not used there was forced down the grid, overload ing circuits and automatically shutting them down. This forced still more power further south shutting down other facilities like a row of failing dominoes. The interim differential relays would be better able to handle such a surge. In addition, the Authority and Niagara Mohawk have contract-

ed with the General Electric Company to design and produce new relay equipment suitable for permanent installation. The Authority's annual report said further that it became a charter member of the Northeast Power Coordinating Council, formed by 22 utility systems after the blackout, to promote maximum reliability and efficiency of electric service in the Northeast. According to the Authority's report, the 22 utility systems represent 98 per cent of the gen-





Choosing The Weapons Now and then, thanks no doubt to that continual American inferiority complex, we get to thinking how much

more civilized, how much more same,

how much more mature, our good British cousins are. And any time we want to get ourselves a good example of their sanity, we will usually start looking at the editorial comment in the Manchester Guardian, Britain's great sane liberal

And sometimes, as we set off on such a search for reassurance about the future of intelligence in human affairs, we come upon such a Guardian editorial as the one the other day, in which that illustrious newspaper decided it owed it to itself, to its government, and to its readers to take a hand in a national debate raging over the question of whether Britain should buy itself a fleet of new bombers or a fleet of new

We quote a middle section of the editorial in which this famously intelligent newspaper wrestles with this mighty question. We quote as follows: Ought we, then, to have the carrier

force rather than the bombers? This is the hardest question to answer. In Atlantic waters a carrier force is vulnerable; but land bases for sircraft in Britain are just as vulnerable. Either force in fact is of limited value for possible use in Europe. This is a good resnon for buying only a few F-111 sireraft. and for simply not replacing most of become unserviceable. Outside Europe the bombers have one advantage over carriers; they can reach a distant point and be ready to operate there more quickly. Their disadvantage is that they have to have friendly sirflelds from which to fly. Given those airfields, a bomber force can be ready for action within days. A carrier, unless already fairly close, may need two weeks o more to position itself.

"Finally, is it a mistake to buy weapons whose use is primarily outside Europe? No: at least for a time Britain will have to accept a limited commitment east and south of Suez."

There is more to the Guardian's disassion, all nicely serious and deadly in earnest, and all winding up with their recommendation that the nation buy a mall number of planes—"thirty at How silly and inconsequential such

olemn deliberation seems, in this atomic world of ours! What matter with what implements we blow ourselves up? About all we can say is that we hope the future history of the world is so pleasant and uneventful and safe that ome day a few years from now we can all look back and think it really did matter, back in 1965, whether Britain

bought carriers or bombers.

But here, now, in 1966, with all that seems to be going on around us, the uestion seems so desdend and so negaive as to be almost too frivolous to engage the attention of the most intelligent editoral page in Britain. We find it hard to believe that it makes any real difference of any kind, for Britain's survival or for our own, whether the choice is bombers or carriers, and we suspect that the only real good choice Britain could make would he to decide not to play the game any onger, with either bombers or carriers.

Big Resolution For No Hits

Johnson Administration reliance on

the "Gulf of Tonkin Resolution" lately as turned attention back to that document, which was adopted by both houses of Congress by overwhelming margins on Aug. 7, 1964. This is the way the famous Resoludon opens:

"Whereas naval units of the Comnunist regime in Vietnam, in violation of the principles of the Charter of the United Nations and of international law, save deliberately and repeatedly attackd United States naval vessels lawfully present in international waters, and have enaby created a serious threat to inter-

mational peace;
"Whereas these attacks are part of a erate and systematic campaign of ggression that the Communist regime n North Vietnam has been waging against its neighbors and the nations joined with them in the collective deinse of their freedom."

That was the Resolution's justifica-

tion of itself, and of its pronoun of approval and support for the President to take "all necessary steps, including the use of armed force, to assist any member or protocol state of the Southeast Asia Collective Defense Treaty in defense of its freedom."

If any official disclosures since August, 1964, have revealed the actual inidents in the Gulf of Tonkin to be diferent than they were left to be in the news at that time, we have not encoun-

But as closely as anybody could state actual facts at that time, our destroyers were patrolling in the Gulf of Tonkin at a time when South Vietnamese small naval craft were raiding a North Vietnamese shore, and when it might have been a natural assumption, from the way our destroyers were hovering around, that they were protecting the attackers. Be that as it may, none of the alleged attacks upon our destroyers detected on their radar succeeded in finding any target, and the "attacks" of which the Congressional Resolution spoke never really emerged from the status of phantoms. Nonetheless, President Johnson responded to them with our first attack on North Vietnam installations, and Congress responded to that action and to the alleged attacks on our destroyers by passing the Resowhich did, of course, contain such sweeping powers for the President that he could start World War III, as he may have done in actuality, and claim to be within its provisions. All of which is quite a lot of history to have come from an alleged attack which never hit anything.

Don't Believe Every Robin

It has to be a pretty cold, wild, severe winter day to blast a winter robin out of his copse and into open flight or perch. Such is the terrible burden of intellectual and professional honesty this department recognizes in some matters, and particularly truly important matters like the weather, that it must report all harbingers, including not only the crocus and the leaf, which have come out too early, but also the false winter robin which, as we all know from experience, will always take any headline or editorial mention it can get. We present the news, as always. But, as often, we say don't quite believe it.

Ribicoff's Four Points

Senator Abraham Ribicoff has advanced a four point program designed to bring the Communists to the negotiating table at Geneva. He proposes that the Viet Cong be admitted to the pargaining table; the matched withtrawal of 10,000 troops each by the North Vietnamese and by us; the conduct of negotiations without an agenda and that prisoners be exchanged.

The Ribicoff proposals received a quick reaction from the White House. President Johnson, who has been trying in every way short of total surrender to the Communists to get negotiations, called the senator and exchanged views with him for 40 minutes by teleshone. The President told the senator that he would go to Geneva at anytime out that he felt the invitation shoul be issued by the co-chairmen of the conference, Russia and Britain. The President told Senator Ribicoff that once such a call was issued the United States would certainly attend.

The President said that if the Hano Communists would agree to sit down at conference table a way would b found to have the Viet Cong subversive seated, but he refused to recognize t Viet Cong, as the sole representatives of South Vietnamese people.

The President said that as a humani tarian he favored the prisoner exchange at any time. As to the senator's sug gestion that our negotiating team be made up of Ambassador Goldberg, Ar-thur Dean and Senators Mansfield and Dirksen the President said that he admired these men greatly. Senator Ribicoff was convinced that

the President is indeed devoted to ending the war which we never wanted to fight. The quick response to the sena-tor's proposals by the President not be ignored by those in charge of protocol in Geneva. The in vitation to negotiation should be made to all sides. The onus of continuing the war will then be on the side that doe not answer. Under any circumstances our senator has made an interesting proposal. He joins distinguished company in making an effort to find some way to end this conflict with honor. -STAMFORD ADVOCATE
