



Casualties in war are doubly tragic, it seems to us, when the country being lought for and being wounded for and being died for is itself in doubt as to he rightness and the justness and the necessity of its own involvement. That is the situation of the United States with regard to the war in Vist-

No amount of debate, argument, persuasion is going to change it. It is what it is-a highly debatable

But, while the debate goes on, our men, and the men of the opposition, are already taking wounds, and they are already dying. Whatever the war turns out to be

will make a difference only to their memories, if the war takes their lives from them. In any war, there should be every urgency devoted to the purpose of

bringing war to an end with as little. carnage as possible. But in a war like this one that urgency is at least doubled over any nor-

The American nation does not like to bear the cross of asking its young men to die in a war on which the nation it-

self is not united. Yet to produce a nation which is united on this war is not a matter of persuasion, or argument, or propaganda, or having one side talk louder than

Only a Pearl Harbor, in which that enemy way over there on the other side of the world reached toward us and dealt us some surprise blow close to our heart and pride, could manage the busi-ness of uniting us. Realisation of this almost seemed to terrify one Washington columnist the other day, as he seemed to fear that, if this were the only method of unifying us, it would somehow come to pass.

If barring some Pearl Harbor-we cannot unify ourselves in our judgment as to how right, how just, how necessary this war is for us,—then we have ene mandate upon ourselves as a nation which is above all others. It is to find some way to bring it to a halt, before it takes more precious human lives beyond all debate.

While we debate, men die.
While we conduct hearings, men die.
While the President turns hard and

mentators commentate, the propa-gandists propagate, the diplomats maneuver, the statesmen prate of na-tional necessities and confrontations and a drawing of lines, men die.

They are not dying in what we may some day decide this war should be con-

Their sacrifice is as noble and high as sacrifice for country has ever been. It is their country which falters, which is in doubt, not through any particular fault of its own or through any particular fault of any particular leadership, but because of circumstance, condition. and intangibles over which nobody really has any firm control.

We are all lost, to a certain extent. But only some of us are called upon to lose our lives.
