

wall papered in off-white paper with beige figures. A black and gold sunburst clock is over the table. Two bedrooms and a den open off a hallway that extends from the kitchen o the right side of the house. Modern furnishings are in the den, which has a black leather sofa, open bookcases, a globe shaped hanging lamp and gray and black figured carpeting. Large potted rhododendron plants stand in the corner of the room, next to the windows which are hung with gold drapes.

Mrs. Dymon says she hopes to redecorate the master bedroom to match the furnishings in the rest of her house. It now has traditional mahogany furniture, gold colored walls and matching quilted bed spreads with raspberry and orchid scatter pillows. The bathroom is done in pale peach with gold and tangerine accents.




