These estimate that, during the past year, desertion from the South Vietnamese armed forces reached a new high total of as many as 113,000, which reduced, by the assumption that some of these find their way back into uniform during the same year, to a net of some 98,000 losses by desertion during the year.

In the previous year, the nat loss by desertion was calculated at 72,000. The disconcerting thing about this increase in South Vietnamese deserions is that it has taken place during this year of America's great escalation of its own participation in the war. This escalation, we were told, was designed, among other things, to give the South Viptnamese new heart and en-

thusiasm for their own war. In any discussion such as this, the alternative has to be suggested. It may be, of course, that if America hadn't escalated its own participation during the past year, the number of South Vietnamese desertions would have been much greater—even so much greater that the war might be over-as a de-




