The Rams, who were leading 21-10 at the end of the first half, were out of control after the break. They scored 17 points in the second half, including a 12-point run in the final 10 minutes. 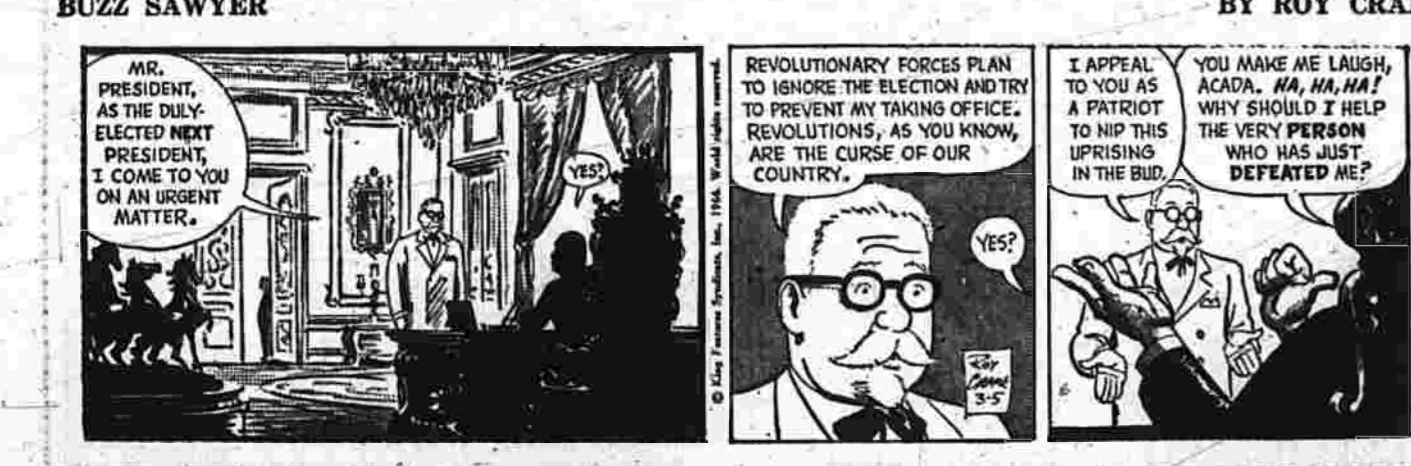

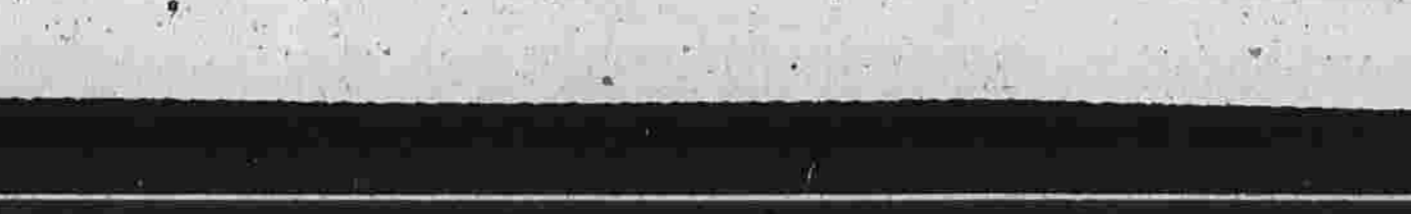

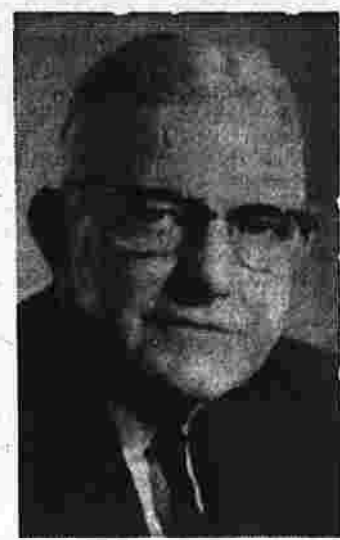

Even Poor Shows Can Prove Costly

It costs a lot of money to turn out television shows, even poor ones. Jackie Gleason's Saturday night hour, for example, has a production budget of around \$180,000 a week and the bill for the show when the cost of air-time is added, brings the tab well over \$300,000.

The so-called "cheap shows" — those with \$40,000 production budgets like "To Tell the Truth" and "I've Got a Secret" — build up expensively. With time costs they come to well over \$100,000 per evening show.

This season's crop of hour programs have budgets ranging from around \$130,000 per episode upwards. Variety shows with their needs for new sets and costumes weekly, not only run high, but do not have much reuse value. But the half-hour situation comedies, knocked out for sums ranging from \$55,000 to \$80,000, are like money in the bank. Not only can they be rerun during the summer season but can later be sold and resold profitably as syndicated series.

Approximately 40 per cent of the shows on the three major networks are dropped each year.

Next season, the usual need for 30-odd new series has been further reduced by CBS' decision to have two nights of feature films instead of only one, as it had this season. With NBC devoting two nights to movies, and ABC one, the public will be treated to five nights and 10 hours of films a week.

The old movie supply is running out in the face of the demand while the cost of acquiring recent good ones is increasing. CBS paid \$1 million for "The Music Man" and another, lesser effort, but presumably will be able to run it several times to average off its costs.

Lucille Ball, who each season flirts with the idea of quitting the weekly show grind, has once again come to terms with CBS for another season of "The Lucy Show."

The comedy team of Dan Rowan and Dick Martin will be Dean Martin's summer replacement, although he's no relation.

Gunsmoke 'Forever' Says Festus

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—"Gunsmoke" has been going for 11 years," observed Ken Curtis, "and I'd be perfectly delighted if it went on for another 11."

The grizzled Festus Hagen of the CBS Western added that he didn't speak for his fellow Gunsmokers, Jim Arness, Amanda Blake and Milburn Stone. After all, they have endured the entire 11 seasons; Curtis entered the scene as replacement for Dennis Weaver only three years ago.

If the regulars could bear up under the ordeal, it's entirely possible that "Gunsmoke" could last another 11 years. When Weaver left the team, it was feared his loss would hurt the show. Ratings stayed at a high mark.

When the series doubled to an hour's length, some predicted the beginning of the end. "Gunsmoke" kept rolling up the ratings, even with the competition of half-hour returns on prime network time.

Next season the show will appear in color and perhaps — according to rumor — at 90-minute length.

"I don't know how we'll manage that," said Curtis. "Obviously we'll need two companies, because the shows will require nine days to shoot, and there aren't that many days in the week. But I have an idea they'll figure it out. They always do."

Curtis' contentment is understandable. An authentic Westerner — he grew up on a Colorado ranch and his Pa was sheriff of Las Animas — Curtis came to Hollywood in 1938 as a singing cowboy. He had a run in Westerns such as "Don Daredevil Rides Again," later appeared in many of the films of his former father-in-law, John Ford.

Not only has Curtis found happiness with the scroungy Festus; together with Milburn Stone he has discovered the bonanza of personal appearances on the cow circuit. They comprise the hottest act for rodeos, averaging \$5,000 a day in towns some of us have never heard of.

"Milburn and I shell corn by the bushel," Curtis admitted. "It's strictly a cornball act, but boy! They sure eat it up. We've got offers from every top rodeo including Cheyenne, which has not booked entertainers."

"We work hard for our money. Milburn is an old song-and-dance man, and I used to sing with the Sons of the Pioneers, so we know how to put on a show."

Even the tame cats at Africa, U.S.A., where "Daktari" is filmed for presentation on the CBS Television Network, are not bothered while they eat. If a trainer must enter their cages at mealtimes for any reason, the food is removed first.

Nielsen Security Cracked

Real Life TV Mystery

NEW YORK (AP) — Television's best mystery this week isn't appearing on the living room screens. This is a real who-did-it: Who managed to crack the supersecret list of names of a research company's audience sample and ask about 33 families on its comment on the commercials of a single show?

The A. C. Nielsen Co. which reported to clients that its "security" had been breached, will identify neither the program involved nor the suspects.

But it did say that about 8 per cent of its sample of 500 families had received a questionnaire requesting comment on the commercials of a program broadcast between 8:30 and 9:30 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 18. Network shows being broadcast at that time were Carol Channing's special on CBS; "The Sammy Davis Jr. Show" on NBC, and "The Addams Family" and "Honey West" on ABC.

In its bulletin to clients, the Nielsen company said it had excluded all contacted homes from the statistics on which audience estimates are based.

Each family in the Nielsen sample is chosen the company

says, because its viewing choices are supposed to be typical of thousands of others. Thus if some families were asked to comment on the content of a specific show, they might tune in a program they would otherwise ignore. This, of course, could weight the ratings—a matter of intense concern to Nielsen, the networks, sponsors and even the Federal Trade Commission.

SERIES WITHDRAWN

Danny Thomas has decided to withdraw a series set for NBC's Saturday night line-up next season: "My 16 Blocks." The ostensible reason is Thomas' puzzling unhappiness about the show's position—after "Flipper" and before "Get Smart." This lovely spot between two hit shows is called a "cradle position" in the trade, the best of all possible locations.

The real reason, according to informed trade sources, is that the first show in the comedy series turned out to be a disaster. NBC convinced Thomas who had a firm commitment, that it would be wiser to pull out than risk hurting the excellent

Networks Revise Night Schedules

NBC has affirmed that "The Road West," a spin-off from "The Virginian" with Barry Sullivan, will take over Andy Williams' Monday night hour, which means that Williams show must move—probably into a late Sunday evening berth.

"To Tell the Truth," CBS' long-playing Monday evening game show, is expected to go to late Sunday afternoon to replace "Mr. Ed." "Gilligan's Island" will probably lead the Monday night schedule next season. A comedy series starring Jean Arthur is the probable show to replace "Hazel."

ABC is engaged in the most drastic revision of its schedule. It will probably drop 19 shows and replace them with 17 new ones. Its schedule is still fluid, but almost certainly on the docket are "Them Monroes," an hour Western, "That Girl," starring Danny Thomas, daughter Marjo, a spoof of Sherlock Holmes and a Western starring Robert Lansing.

NBC's fall schedule is expected to contain 10 new series. CBS will probably have eight, plus another two hours of old movies.

Altogether, that represents at least 20 new shows—a larger turn-over than usual.

Which Is Liberace?

Mr. Showmanship Or 'Wizard of Ooze'

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Liberace calls himself Mr. Showmanship. His detractors have called him the wizard of ooze. By any name he is a phenomenon in the entertainment industry.

By all logic, his career should now be limited to playing club dates in retirement cities. During the height of the Liberace craze his appeal seemed centered with geriatric set who wanted to grandmother him.

Yet Liberace is entering his second quarter-century as an entertainer and he possesses a large and diversified audience. He recently returned from a theater-in-the-round at San Carlos, Calif., where he drew almost \$90,000 a week from teenagers as well as the geriatric set. Saturday night he displays his opulent style as emcee on Hollywood Palace.

Liberace paused to reflect on his 25 years before the public as he devoured the calf liver special at Scandia Restaurant.

"My image in the beginning — during the white-heat period — was mocked and mimicked," he analyzed. "But as the years went on, people began to realize that I myself kidded the Liberace image."

"I make an act out of my image. As soon as people understand that I don't really walk down Sunset Boulevard in a gold lame cape and pants, then

they come over to my side. They're always surprised to find out I'm a nice guy."

Then he talked about the turning point in his career.

"It was after the white-heat period was over," he recalled, "and they were still trying to put me in 40,000-seat arenas and field houses."

"The climax was in Akron, where I was booked in a 40,000-seat place on Fourth of July at \$35,000."

"It rained, and I stayed over two days to fulfill the engagement. Well, the excitement of the Fourth of July had gone, and we drew 8,000. I received part of the fee, and when I got back to Hollywood, the check bounced."

"That's when I told my people to stop trying for the big houses and develop concerts. Once the word gets around that you drew 6,000 in a 40,000-seat place, you're dead."

During his silver-anniversary year, Liberace told his handlers he expected to work less and earn more. And by choosing his dates carefully he has been able to do just that. His concerts during the year reportedly grossed \$800,000.

"Now I can control my career, instead of the career controlling me," said he. "So I've been able to devote more time to other things I've wanted to do, such as my interior decorating shop."
