

Navy Shifts Search Area For N-Bomb

MANCHESTER BEACH, Spain (AP)—A U.S. Navy task force is shifting to deeper waters of the Spanish coast in its search for a missing hydrogen bomb.

"We may be here for a considerable time," Rear Adm. William Guet, task force commander, told newsmen Wednesday.

The 15 ships are searching a 200-square-mile area of the Mediterranean. Navy officials said the ships so far have recovered 175 pieces of wreckage from the Jan. 17 collision and crash of a B-52 bomber and its jet tanker.

One of the four bombs that were aboard the bomber still is missing. Guet said the task force had to contend with a rugged underwater terrain of valleys and mountains.

Newsmen were invited aboard the USS Intrepid, the missile-firing cruiser, to see the search from the deck.

The admiral showed them the three deep-diving magnets he is using to search for the bomb. He said the magnets are being used to search for a piece of wreckage.

Mr. Gen. Delmar Wilson, commander of the U.S. 16th Air Force, said the search is yielding "administrative results." He said farmers now are permitted to work their fields again after 26 acres were "artificially cleaned" to avoid the possibility of radioactivity.

Other officials said the land search probably would last another month.

Mayor Foresees Balance In Grand List, Budget

Mayor James Thorne said at budget night's interagency meeting that while the current tax rate cannot be maintained for the coming fiscal year, the town is approaching a plateau where the grand list and expenses are coming into balance.

The mayor commented that the town has to work to bring in business and industry to moderate the tax rate to be able to afford increased services in coming years.

Town manager Terry V. Sprankel observed that the grand list for the coming year would maintain the average of the last four or five years. "This year there is a \$21,000 deficit in the transportation category," he noted.

Sprankel said that the general fund budget would be ready for the council consideration before March 31. The manager said the budget includes principal and interest payments on all outstanding bonds.

Some \$3.2 million worth of bonds are to be issued in intervals and principal payments will be made by the town. The high school addition bonds are the middle school modernization bonds and the town makes interest payments at six-month intervals and principal payments by making a check for the general government budget will include provisions for principal and interest payments on the high school addition and the high school modernization bonds.

He noted that industry accounted for some 29 per cent of the base grand list last year and might increase slightly this year. Sprankel cited the installation of sewers as a factor in bringing more industry into the town.

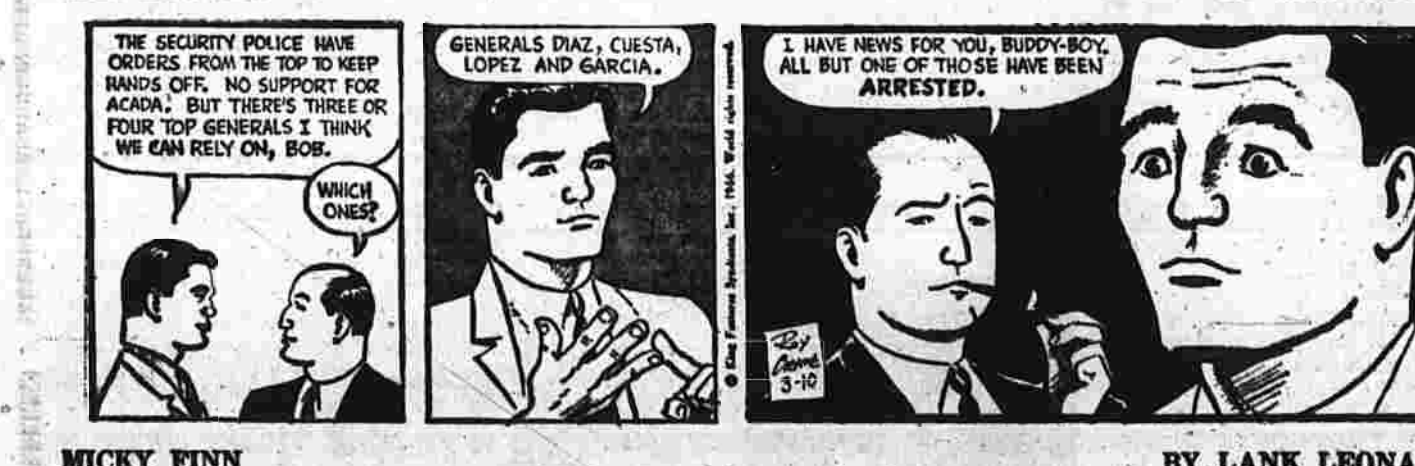
