"We have to do something drastic t keep industry from belching out so much potentially health-endangering ste into the atmosphere." If we ask the same question today, should get a divided answer. It is

till a need, in some instances, to keep dustry from polluting our air, and that is one of the emergency problems of our time and civilization. But there is now another angle of he same problem which is of even more rital importance to some industry than

As we progress more and more into the precision age, with more and more ophisticated products and production equipment, we find ourselves with a growing list of special industrial operations for which pure air is a necessity. We have come to the point where some very vital and important and resperous factories have to worry bout what their neighbor industries

may be putting into the air. The New York Herald Tribune, the other day, told the story of a very nice industry which is preparing to leave he Bronx because its processes require a spotlessness which can't be guaranteed in the foul air of New York City. "We seal all the windows, even on the ottest days, and it keeps coming in on se instruments, on the people. We must

The same problem is obviously growing to become more serious, as time goes on, and the standards for so many propesses and products become increasngly delicate, along the entire industrial seaboard. A Poll Discovers A Division

Public opinion polls are, in our standing estimate, not as expert as they should be at penetrating to the inner and decisive thoughts and verdicts of he people they question. And even were they always guaranteed accuracy, we would deplore very much use of their findings, and especially use by oliticians. We lose respect for politicians who predicate their own decisions and actions such as whether to run this year or not, whether to be yes or no on some specific issue on the results of special polls they have taken. We are distressed by the overbalenced concern the man now in the White House displays for how he is doing in the various polls, and by the way he sometimes eems to devise pageants in an effort to influence such polls.

All these qualifications and reserva dons having been stated, there must still be some significance left for the statistical fact that Dr. Gallup, in his latest finding, has reduced the perentage of "approval of the way Presisent Johnson is handling the situation n Vietnam" to 50 per cent. Our situation in Vietnam has now

gone so close to that of full and open war—American war—that any statis-tical finding that only half the Ameri-can people approve the fact that their

Commander-in-Chief is fighting it, or perhaps the way he is fighting it, must stand as unusual and unprecedented. But this is, statistically, only a reflection of what most Americans have already felt for themselves, in their bones, in the attitudes around themselves. We are, on this issue, a very troubled and divided people.

And when the President, realizing this, and seeking to cure it, wages his fight for a consensus with some of the weapons he has been seen using, the result has sometimes been to diminish public confidence still more rather than build it back. This is not a situation which is yielding to the normal blandishments, threats, and slogans of a Texas politician. The harder the President tries, by words and pageantry, to deal with the crisis of confidence, the more the crisis actually seems to deepen.

Rabbi Dies Long After His Attack

DETROIT (AP).—Rabbi Morris Adler, 59, shot in the head during Sabbath services nearly a month ago by a young member of his congregation, died today.

Adler never regained consciousness after the Feb. 12 shooting at Shaarey Zedek Synagogue in suburban Southfield. The rabbi was shot by Richard Wishnetsky, 23, who shot himself seconds after Adler fell to the floor. Wishnetsky died four days later. Adler underwent two opera-
