In his first three exhibition games, playing only the first half of each, he has hit two home runs and shown two opposing base runners out at home plate.

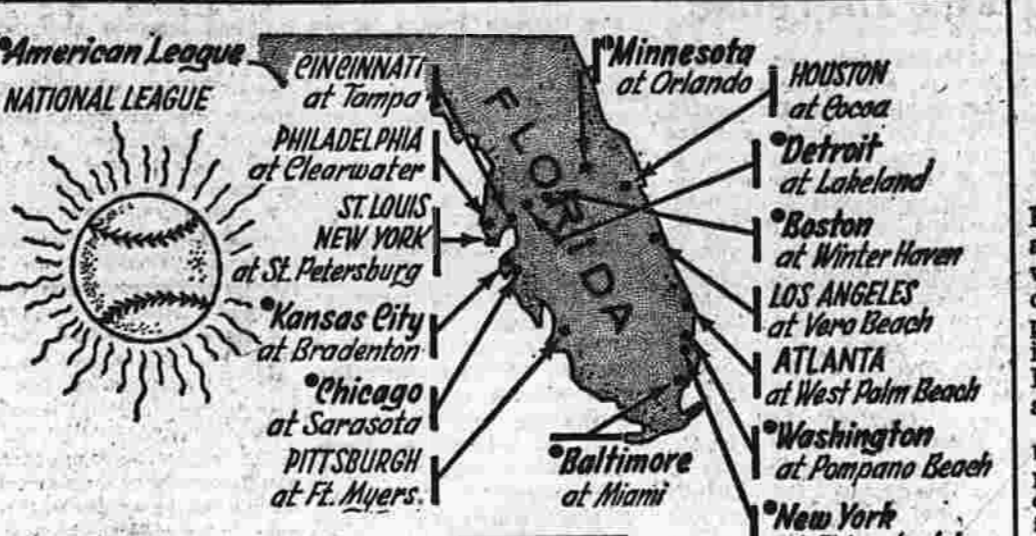
Despite the rigors of the winter banquet circuit, he reported to camp just four pounds over his usual playing weight of 184 and says he feels just great.

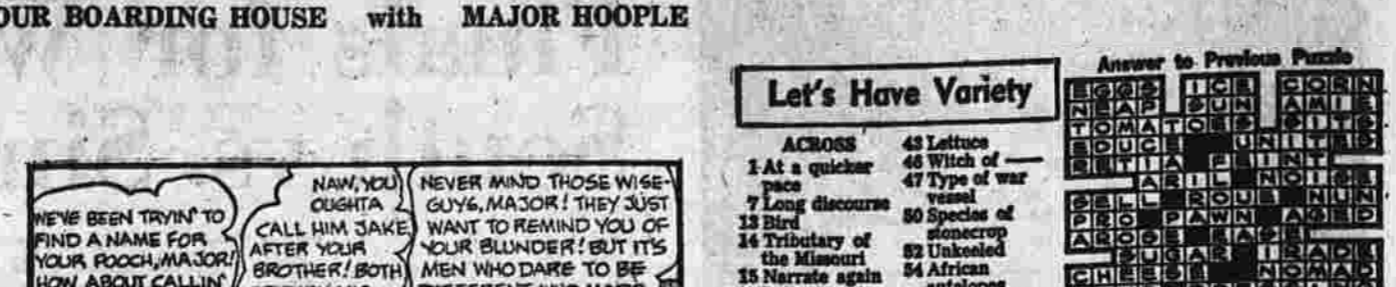

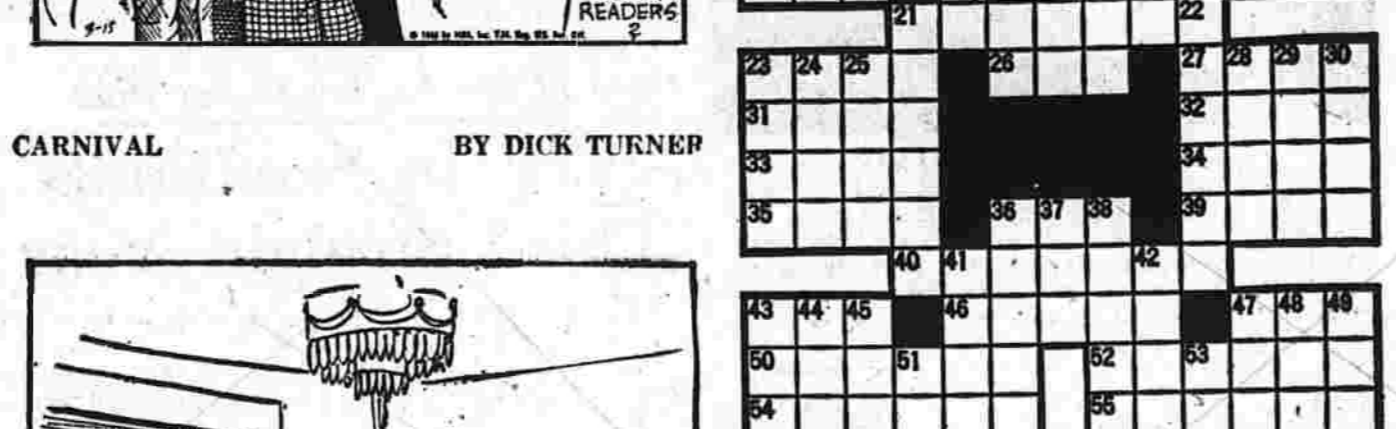

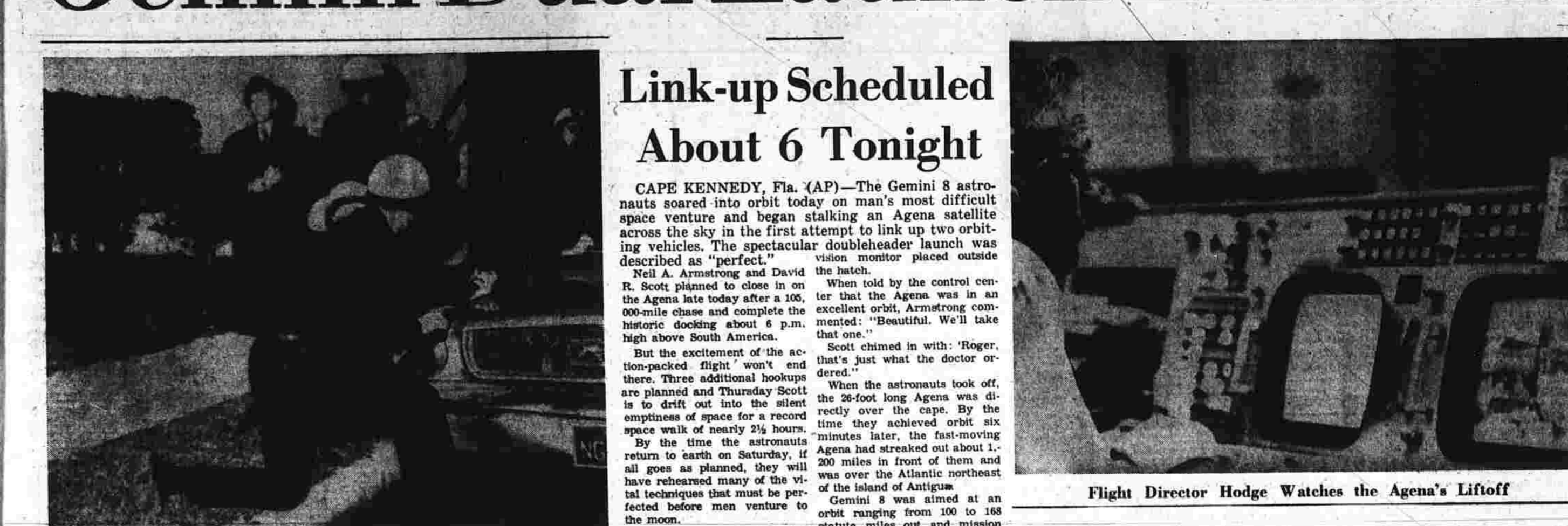

Gemini Dual Launch 'Perfect'



Flight Director Hodge Watches the Agena's Liftoff

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP)—The Gemini 8 astronaut soared into orbit today on man's most difficult space venture and began staking an Agena satellite across the sky in the first attempt to link up two orbiting vehicles.

Neil A. Armstrong and David White, who will be the first to land on the moon, were in the control room at Cape Kennedy when the Agena was launched.

Watts Erupts Again

LOS ANGELES (AP)—An estimated six hundred Negroes, rampaging for six hours, stormed violently through Watts—the south Los Angeles area that still shows scars of last August's bloody riots—leaving two dead and 26 injured.

Killed during the riot were a truck driver, a Negro who walked out of a building into a sniper's fire, police said.

A massive force of several hundred police moved in quickly to quell the outbreak. Officers armed with shotguns sealed off a 35-square-block section in the predominantly Negro district late Tuesday afternoon.

Police used tear gas and water cannons to clear the streets of mobs firing guns, hurling bottles, looting stores and upsetting cars.

Gov. Edmund G. Brown flew to Los Angeles, declared a state of emergency and ordered the National Guard and state police to take control for the time being.

Bylanders in the area, some in anguish, looked on as rioting mobs of mostly teen-agers led the charge.

Said one middle-aged Negro woman: "I spent all day down there talking to those kids, telling them to stay home, not to make trouble, but they just won't listen."

"You don't know what's going to happen down there," said a 21-year-old Negro.

As was the case last August, white people were potential human targets for the mob's wrath.

One blond reporter on the scene was warned: "I wouldn't go down there, lady. They're dangerous."
