MHA Eyeing More Units For Elderly

The Manchester Housing Authority last night authorized steps to provide for financing preliminary studies of a proposal to build 75 new units of housing for the elderly. The members voted authority to execute preliminary loan contracts and to issue preliminary notes for the project. The new units, if they are built, would bring to 275 the number in town. One hundred units are occupied in the original Westhill Gardens on W. Center St. and 100 more units are being completed in an adjoining addition. Members heard a progress report on that addition last night which indicated it is about 70 per cent complete. A summary of the report follows: Masonry: All completed except for washing down exterior walls. Roofs: All shingled, only flashings remain to be done. Builders: 14 of 16 installed and 8 of the 14 have been piped and cased. Rough plumbing: Cast iron work done in 18 units, copper work done in nine. Rough electrical work: Completed in the apartments, still to be done in basements. Rough heating mats and logs: Completed. Porch trim is 90 per cent done; interior insulation, 80 per cent; sheet rock, 50 per cent; glazing, 90 per cent; and finish flooring, 90 per cent.



Work is about 70 per cent complete on the 100-one-story units being built for the Manchester Housing Authority by Green Manor Construction Co. They are expected to be ready for occupancy by July.

Tolland State Accepts Proposal For Town Sewer Board

The formation of a town sewer authority, to operate a sewerage system to serve the existing and a proposed new Country Hills subdivision, was approved Monday by the State Water Resources Commission.

The commission tabled a proposal for a privately operated sewerage treatment plant in February, stating that such a plant must be under the control of the municipality.

Approval of the proposed 242-home Country Hills 66 subdivision is pending state approval of the proposed treatment plant. The planning and zoning commission reviewed the plans for the proposed development in January, and instructed the developer, Sol Levitt and David Weisberg, to make certain changes to the treatment plant for the area in operation before starting construction of any homes.

Residents have been reminded that a permit is required for the proposed Country Hills 66, the existing 90 Country Hills homes, and from a new school and other residential construction. Treating wastes from the plant would be dumped into the Willimantic River, which causes injury to the remedial districts in the state approval is required.

Ribicoff Attacks Auto Safety Bill

WASHINGTON (AP) - Sen. Abraham A. Ribicoff said today that President Johnson's proposed Traffic Safety Act is "seriously defective" because it would not make car safety standards mandatory.

The auto industry is producing almost 10 million cars each year and those cars must be made as safe as possible as soon as possible, the Connecticut Democrat said. "The time has come to recognize that safety is not a discretionary matter."

Ribicoff listed his criticisms in testimony prepared for the start of Senate Commerce Committee hearings on the legislation. Secretary of Commerce John T. Connor also was testifying. After the hearing, the committee was to go into closed session to act on another administration bill to establish safety standards for automobiles and other motor vehicle tires.

Under this measure, the Secretary of Commerce would be directed to establish minimum standards for automobiles and other motor vehicle tires. The bill also would provide federal grants to the states for driver education, traffic control and other highway safety measures and construction of a national highway safety research and test center.

Ribicoff described the administration proposal as basically a good bill but objected that under it, the Secretary of Commerce would only be authorized, after making certain findings, to set safety standards for motor vehicles.

Not only should the setting of standards be made mandatory, he said, but "the period of time allowed before any action can be taken is far too long."

He urged that an administrator of the proposed act be required to set safety standards within one year after enactment, and that these be made enforceable within one year of their issuance.

Space Walker's Tether Might Generate Power

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP)—When Air Force Maj. David R. Scott takes a walk in space Thursday, the 100-foot-long tether tying him to the Gemini 8 spacecraft could generate up to 10 volts of electricity as it cuts through the earth's magnetic field.

National Aeronautics and Space Administration officials said they recognize the possibility of an electrical charge, but a confident prediction is built into the systems aboard Gemini 8.

According to his studies, the line connecting Scott to the spacecraft would generate one-tenth of a volt per foot when the astronaut is either above or below the spacecraft.

Charles W. Matthews, Gemini program manager, also pointed out that the Gemini 8 spacecraft will whirl through a portion of the atmosphere called the ionosphere, which is highly ionized.

LOS ANGELES (AP) — "It per acre, compared to a county average of 7.4. Los Angeles," people said in heavy late August, as 34 per cent died and 40 million in Watts, looking for jobs, falling property was put to the torch in bloody race riots.
