Parents Get Left Out Again One of the casualties of the Senate's hectic day on the Johnson administr tion's tax program this week was Sen. Ribicoff's plan to grant a special tax credit to parents of college students.

Last year the Ribicoff plans was defeated on the argument that the revenue loss was unacceptable. At that time the Johnson administration was trying to keep the federal budget deficit down.

This time the administration again was opposing the program from the side-

The Connecticut Democrat's idea i to allow the students' parents to sub-tract from their income-tax bills a sum averaging about \$200 a family but ranging up to \$325 in some cases.
