### Steak House Denied Lot For Parking

The Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) last night denied a variance for the owners of Willie's Steak House, which would have permitted them to use the 50 by 125 lot at the northwest corner of W. Center St. and Henderson Rd. for parking cars.

Although the vote on the Willie's request was 3 to 2 for approval of an in effect a denial for ZBA rules require a minimum of four affirmative votes for passage of any motion.

The variance request was filed by William A. Olesinski and Walter J. Parnick, owners of the steak house which yesterday had purchased the adjoining Manchester Bottling Co. for expansion purposes.

Atty. John Mrosek, their counsel, told the ZBA that his clients had amended their request, and were asking for use of the corner lot only, instead of two adjoining lots, as per the original application.

He called the request "a reasonable application" based on twin parking lanes, "because of the loss of street parking and because of increased business."

The request for a variance in Residence Zone A, was opposed by several area residents and by Town Planner Joseph Tamsky.

Tamsky and Mrosek engaged in a discussion of zoning philosophies, after Tamsky said there's a need for parking, and that the request is not a proper matter to bring before this board.

He suggested that the owners of Willie's should apply to the Town Planning Commission for an extension of Business Zone II or Commercial Zone, but said that he would oppose such a request.

Tamsky said that the lot under consideration "is now a landscaped lot, as opposed to a parking lot, and, as such, serves as a buffer between the residence and Business Zone."

He said that the 50 by 125 foot lot, at best, could accommodate more than 25 cars.

Mrosek replied that "Tamsky's theory is beautiful in thought but not in practice." He said that a zone change would open the area "to undesirable Freedom Zone businesses, whereas a grant of a variance would limit the one lot only for parking to the use of the lot.

He said that his clients estimated that the lot would hold about 25 cars, sufficient for their needs.

Mrosek said to the ZBA members, "We all know that your function is to apply long, hard sense to the benefits and non-benefits for all businesses and to come up with the best solution."

"As a matter of fact," he added, "if you stick strictly to the regulations, you will not be able to approve any variance and any variance which you approved in the past year."

Speaking in opposition to Willie's request were three area residents.

Charles Utting of 88 W. Center St. said, "Approval would add to the business use of the neighborhood and would be unfair to the homeowners." He presented a petition, signed by 25 of the area residents, in support of the application.

Edward D. Werner of 11 Brennan Rd. said, "It would need spot zoning. The owners of Willie's own other property on Henderson Rd., already in Business II, which they can use for parking."

He blamed the board "for permitting business encroachments in Residence Zone," and said, "there is always a running battle between the zoning board and town residents."

Raymond Tweedie of St. W. Center St. opposed the application because "the result would be noisy and unwelcome."

In denying the application the ZBA ruled that the applicants had not proved "hardship" as required by regulations.

The six requests which were approved last night were:

1. George M. Pastanios of 23 Green Hill St., permission to diminish the parcel of land at Blaisell and Foster Sts., where a 21-unit apartment house stands, in order to create an additional undersized lot. The new lot will be located closer to the Foster sidewalk than regulations permit.

Pastanios proposes to construct, for his own use, a 50-foot ranch-type, single-family dwelling on the north lot, and to designate a boundary line between the two properties.

The request drew mild opposition from Bruno Akens of 5133 Blaisell St.

2. Robert W. Bridgeman of 75 Oak St., a variance to use the store at 115 Sprague St. for light industrial work. Approval was limited to the use specified in his application—making rubber stamps, sharpening tools, and the like.

3. Henry and Mary Denning of Glastonbury, a special exception to convert a two-family dwelling into three-family at 219-221 School St., plus a waiver used.

decision to place McDonald in maximum segregation, the government was bound to take the necessary steps to enforce that decision," Smith said. "In this respect it failed."

Smith said penitentiary authorities had placed McDonald in maximum security after he was involved in other assaults. McDonald, then 25, was serving two 10-year terms for forgery and assault with intent to murder. He was termed incapable of standing trial for attacking Cohen.

The judge said he determined the amount of the award in consideration of the fact that Cohen was in the medical center at Springfield, Mo., has received optimum recovery and his disability has been placed at 50 per cent minimum by specialists. Cohen will be lame and crippled for life, Smith said.

Cohen, 46, at the time of the assault, had been in the Atlanta Prison about seven months, having been transferred from Alcatraz, where that prison was closed. His full name is Meyer Harris Cohen.

The co-plaintiff was convicted about five years ago of evading approximately \$200,000 in income taxes.

Authorities said Cohen and McDonald had not known each other outside the prison and the motive for the assault was unclear.

The judge allowed attorneys fees of \$16,000 in addition to Cohen's award.

end of last year compared with 380 Feb. 1, 1965.

A number of Northern and Western states with stable Negro populations registered net losses in Negro guardmen.

Officials listed a number of possible reasons for what they said was apathy on the part of Negro youths toward serving with the National Guard.

For one thing, officials said, there still is a reluctance by Negroes to go into predominantly white Guard units.

Another reason, they said, is that many young Negroes must hold extra jobs to make ends meet and that service with the National Guard provides very little income.

Also figuring in the dearth of Negro guardmen is the failure of some men who want to serve to pass the armed forces qualification tests. It was stressed that some white applicants also had failed these tests.

Officials said that they had not received a single complaint from Negro groups to the effect that any Negro has been barred from joining the Guard.

## Preliminary Approval Granted For New Country Hills Tract

Preliminary approval for the construction of a 13-home subdivision, to be known as Country Hills 66, was granted to Elm Industries at last night's meeting of the planning and zoning commission.

The approval was subject to contingencies to be drawn up by Town Council member Robert King. The most immediate provision is that the developers, Sol Lavitt and David Webster, build and have operation of a sewage treatment plant to serve the new development and the 94 existing homes in Country Hills 65.

The next step will be to call a town meeting to establish a sewer authority, whose responsibility it will be to establish articles for the construction and operation of the plant, as well as to set user rates for homes using the service.

Herbert Hammarby, appearing for the developers, told the commission his clients could have a presentation prepared within a month. A preliminary meeting with residents of the existing Country Hills subdivision is planned in the interim, to answer any questions that may arise.

King requested William Fannon, engineer for the developers, to conduct the site plan for the proposed subdivision and the State Board of Health, requesting them to amend requirements for the town to conform to sewer questions that may arise.

The 242 homes would be built to conform with the recently approved zoning regulations, and will be located on Anthony Rd., connecting onto the present Country Hills development.

The plan for the subdivision is a minimum house size of 1,000 square feet, a first aid training room, a first aid room, and three quarters of an acre. The streets would be asphalted and would conform to the new road specifications.

In addition to constructing the sewerage treatment plant, the developers will provide a playground to the town, at no cost, upon which the town can build a future school to serve the area.
