very sharp practical test of just how much American thinking about China s changing under the impact of the open academic rebellion, 16 years later, against Senator McCarthy's simplicities. If, as Secretary Rusk seems to feel, we all feel that full military showdown etween the United States and Communist China is inevitable, then quite naturally we resent seeing our good friends add to China's future war potential by making it possible for China to produce

But if the theories of the academic experts are going to get, some kind of footing in our national mind, then we are going to lose a few of our certaintles and adventure forward into a few perimental thoughts of a more poste nature. We are going to stop puting on China labels we can't substantite in fact; we are going to conceive of e possibility that, just as revolutionary ssia and the United States have not destroyed each other, so possibly ven China and the United States may ove able to keep alive in the same orld; finally, we are going to concede least some faint gamble of a possility that helping China get itself a steel mill, which might build tractors s well as tanks, might also help China entrate on conquests it can make inde its own borders rather than on lower politics confrontations which bict the territories of other countries.

President Eisenhower once wondered thy in the world there was no open rican discussion of the problem of ina. Such discussion has now begun. but it will, in our guess, remain some ime before we find the men in office

When Is Obscenity Obscene? It is a rare decision day when the Supreme Court of the United States succeeds in hiding all trace that it is composed of a certain fixed number of in-

dividual human beings.

But on Monday, which was obscenity decision day, the mortal quality of our highest judges was especially evident. They ruled both for and against the legality of publication of material which, in itself, had only one concern, which was the narration, description, and repetition of various encounters be-

And as nearly as the fine point of their division can be located, it concerned the type of advertising and exploitation the publisher devised for his prod-

If he let the fame of his pornography spread by gossip, or by some elaborate pretense that it represented some kind of scientific study, the Supreme Court, Monday, was endorsing his freedom to

But if he acted and advertised as it he were deliberately publishing someexcitingly and shockingly naughty, the Supreme Court Monday was willing to let him go to prison for

The important point Monday, then, was not so much what was published as how it was advertised. Certain specialists in the field may, on the basis of Monday's decisions, consider themselves icensed to produce books which are filthier than ever, so long as the promotion is kept more subtle. But, since judges will continue to be human, the day might then come when the same Court would revise and extend its definition of what constitutes freedom of the press in prurience.

Meanwhile, the human being who happens to be sitting at this typewriter finds it difficult to avoid the thought that, if official judicial determination of such issues is going to be guided by such fine and shifting lines, perhaps the safest, as well as the freest, thing might be to let the old law of the free mar ketplace operate, and see just how far publications of the obscenity class would get by themselves if they were deprived of the type of advertising they so often get for free from watch and ward society crusades against them.

There will always be, as there always has been, and by stealth if need be, a and circulated. We happen to guess that the net amount involved is lowest when legal restriction is the least.
