





Also on the same day, Senator Edward Kennedy of Massachusetts found himself quite angry over the fact that the State Department has been revealed to be "shadowing" certain Americans when they trayel abroad, a situation which came to light when it was rerealed that instructions for such shadowing had gone out in the case of Professor H. Stuart Hughes, professor of history at Harvard, grandson of the late Charles Evans Hughes. Professor Hughes is a gentleman whose unortho-doxies have included an inability to believe in the rightness of the war in Vietnam. In fact, he ran as an independent third party candidate in the last assachusetts election, against Senator

Such instances of snooping by corpo ration or by government, or, as in the case of the Russian diplomat, of regulations designed to control snooping, can be multiplied many times over. The White House, for a recent time at least, was spying on its own occupants, to see what telephone calls they might be receiving from whom. There have been many more fascinating dramss of industrial espionage than those which happen to get an airing before some

As for the roots and causes of such an age of snoopery, they have to be listed as several. The existence of a sold war in the world has perhaps not ncreased the regular standing amount of international espionage, but has called more attention to some of it. Domestic ideological differences, spawned by the cold war, have generated vigilants types of organizations which like to keep tabs on one another or on selected individuals. Science has proliferated the techniques of the shoop. And, sure smough, the hottest entertainment of the period, in print or in television, has the noop for its hero. Only a few sensitive sirits, here and there, pay much attention to any of this or are surprised to find that it is real government policy, eal industrial action, as well as fic-

minds. This is our best weapon." 'And, this, one can guess, is the course which, if Buddhists can hold themselves to it, will constitute the most unnerving and powerful kind of threat the Buddhists can maintain against the Ky-American rule of the country.

Force, in other words, is not invariably and forever the only language people understand and respect. The Bud hists strike most terror when their protest seems most passive. It is probably a fact that they could take over, by not lifting so much as a little finger. the country neither we nor the Vietcong can control with all our apparently unimited resources of blast and terror.
