





Manchester by Mr. and Mrs. Hugh Clark of 44 Pilgrim Lane. Their home is a replica of one on the little island in the Atlantic, and even the shingles look as if they had been seasoned by salt laden winds from the sea. This, Mrs. Clark said, was accomplished by using

special gray stain. Furthering the nautical look are dolphins which decorate a black wrought iron door knocker on the front door whose latch is made in a swordfish pattern. The door is a copy of an early 'Christian" door and is made with the form of the cross on it, the idea being to prevent evil spirits from entering the house. A hitching post in front of the house, and stepping stones leading to the door, came from Coventry and are said to be more than 200 years old. The parlor is to the right of the front entry hall, with a stairway to the unfinished second floor on the left. The hall widens at the rear of the house and adjoins the keeping room, borning room, master chamber with bath, gues chamber, and bath. Since their home and its decor go back to colonial times, the Clarks refer to rooms in the house by names used in that period. They are more commonly known as the dining room, den and bedrooms, respectively. A side entrance to the house is placed conveniently near the garages, and opens into the kitchen, opposite the

buttery (pantry). The Clarks began collecting antiques soon after they were married and designed their home to best show off their reasures. They have been living there about one and one-half years. Kitchen cabinets have been constructe of wood from an old dairy barn. Handhewn beams from the barn decorate the ceiling and fireplace in the keeping room, which has a window with shelves


turquoise. Bricks salvaged from an old farmhouse were used to make the keeping room fireplace, and more than 3,000 of them were used in the chimney. A pine chair table, circa 1750, is used for dining, surrounded by early Windsor

White paneling, and the fireplace in the 14 x 24 ft. parlor were copied from a home in Sturbridge Village, Many first editions and other rare books, left to Mrs. Clark by her father, fill the bookshelves covering one wall. A multicolor braided rug is on the floor, and the fireplace mantel is adorned with Staffordshire "Flowing Blue" plates, china dogs, and an old clock. A cherry bed with a type of "penci posts is in the master chamber and the bed has a handmade, double woven, blue and white coverlet, given to Mrs. Clark by a friend. A chest, made by a cabinetmaker who died in 1760, and a 1716 lowboy with full sunburst, are also in the room. The guest chamber is furnished with ladder-back twin beds, which were in Mrs. Clark's room before she was married. Each room; and every nook and

cranny in the house, bears evidence of the many, according to Mrs. Clark, "wonderful hours spent collecting things we love and hope to live with the rest of our lives." Mr. Clark is a metalurgist in market development with the International Nickel Co., Hartford.
