Weiss Urging Issue Of \$2.5 Million Bond

General Manager Robert E. Weiss is recommending a \$2.5 million bond issue for General Fund Capital Improvements, "in order to catch up with items so urgently required as to create a virtual emergency."

He is recommending a 20-year bond issue which he estimates would cost the town about \$188,700 per year in carrying charges, "or less than one mill."

He estimates that "costs for many of the properties (construction and improvement) have been increasing by about five per cent for each of the recent years."

The largest items in Weiss' recommended \$2.5 million bond issue are \$865,000 for the board of education, for renovations to the older school buildings; and \$700,000 for stormwater projects in all areas of town.

Although both programs had been recommended as five-year projects, Weiss is proposing a one-package bond issue for them and for other programs.

Instead Soviet economic growth rates have slowed. In the 1960s the U.S. and Soviet economies have been growing at about the same rate of 4 percent a year, according to Western figures. Since the United States economy is approximately twice as big, the absolute gap between them has grown in favor of the United States.

The reduced goals of the new Soviet plan indicate the Russians are concentrating on a steady growth of their own economy rather than on a crash program to overtake the United States.

The new plan also contains these major implications:

The Soviets are counting on the lack of a major war, despite the Viet Nam conflict, in order to complete what still is an ambitious program of economic reform and growth at home.

The Soviet consumer will get what Western specialists call a reasonably fair share of the economic pie, but the plan will increase the Soviet standard of living dramatically.

Perhaps the key question being studied here is just how realistic the goals of the new Soviet plan are.

Western economic specialists, working with incomplete Soviet figures, make calculations which differ slightly.

Nevertheless there is general agreement on one major point. Targets for 1966 are relatively low. This means that in order to meet the five-year goals the economy will have to grow at accelerated rates in the last years of the plan. Many of these rates are far higher than Soviet performance over the past five years. For this reason some specialists here call the plan unrealistic.

Total investment in the Soviet economy, for example, is supposed to increase by 41 per cent between 1966 and 1970.

The 1966 target is a 4.4 per cent increase. The plan calls for an average yearly investment increase of a much higher rate, 6.6 per cent, with added pressure coming in the later years.

The new figures tell only part of the story. The success of an investment plan depends largely on efficient use of invested funds. This raises another problem.

Premier Alexei N. Kosygin has charted a sweeping program of reforms covering the whole system of planning, pricing, administration, workers' bonuses and other factors. It puts new stress on profits and gives local factory bosses more freedom from the dictation of central planners in running their own shops.

Some specialists believe the optimistic goals of the Soviet plan, which assume a smooth-running economy despite the changeover to a new planning system, may be unrealistic.

The plan still emphasizes heavy industry.

But planned percentage increases in the light or consumer industries and in heavy industry are about the same — 45-46 per cent for the former and 40 per cent for the latter.

This would indicate that the consumption of goods is a major part of the planned economic growth.

After assuming power, Suharto placed Subandrio and 14 other pro-peoples' Cabinet members under protective custody.

It was not known whether Gen. Abdul Haris Nasution, Suharto's chief of staff, would be a member of the new Cabinet. Suharto fired him as defense minister Feb. 21 after Suharto led a bloody purge of Communists accused of backing the October attempted coup.

The sources said Suharto had proposed including Nasution in the Cabinet but did not insist after Suharto refused to accept him.

Indonesia's new military rulers have been trying to avoid alienating Suharto. They want to preserve his status as a figurehead and a rallying point to affirm the legality of the new regime, observers said.

Peking's official New China News Agency bitterly denounced the new Indonesian regime in a protest over the closing of the NKCA Jakarta office.

It was ordered closed Friday by the Foreign Ministry, which also revoked the credentials of NKCA correspondents. The Foreign Ministry said the Peiking news agency had conducted a hostile campaign in its coverage of Indonesian affairs.

"When announcing the closure of the NKCA branch, the Chinese agency said today in Tokyo, the Indonesian government brazenly alleged that it was preventing the free working of the amicable relations between Indonesia and People's Republic of China. This is a gross distortion of the facts," NKCA said.

Sheinwold on Bridge

One advantage of opening the bidding with a minimum hand is that it suggests a favorable opening lead to your partner. This advantage is nullified if your partner leads the right suit but the wrong card.

Opening lead—Four of Hearts. Even an inexperienced bridge player should lead the 10 usually leading his highest card in partner's suit.

If West leads the king of hearts, under the mistaken impression that this is the "book" lead, the defenders can get only two heart tricks. East will also get the ace of clubs, but these three tricks are not enough to defeat the contract.

The king is not the book opening lead when you hold K-x-x of partner's suit. You should lead the lowest card from three or four cards headed by the ace, the king or queen or jack. 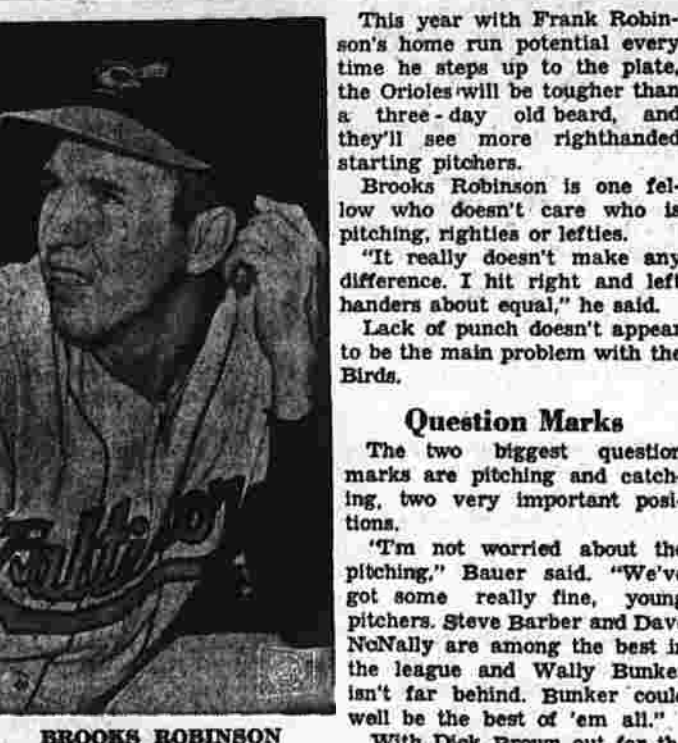

What's New for '67

Fewer Comedians, More Spies Coming

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—What will the next television season bring?

According to an NBC executive, the outlook is for less far-out comedy, status quo in Westerns, a slight increase in spies, and beautiful specials.

The spokesman is Grant Tinker, West Coast vice president for programming, an amiable chap without the usual close-to-the-vest attitude of network types.

He speaks his mind, as in his observation about canned vs. spontaneous television:

"I think we have gone about as far as we can go—or at least we have reached the peak—of

timed television. I believe the time has arrived for television to begin to deliver some of the promise it demonstrated in its earlier days.

"It's time for television to come up with some of the things that are unique to the medium—programs like 'Person to Person'—rather than things that are borrowed from earlier forms.

"What we need in television is more opportunity to fail, more chance to experiment rather than playing it safe all the time. I believe the new commands in the networks may have this in mind. I'm sure the people are ready for it to happen.

"I don't know whether it was the Kennedy assassination, Viet Nam, the Watts riots, the space shots or whatever. But whatever the reason, the fact remains that there are thinking people out there who want something more from television than normal entertainment."

Sad to say, television will not reflect this attitude in the 1966-67 season. NBC is the first network to lock up its schedule, and it appears to be offering more of the same. But NBC generally is admitted to present a wider variety of programming than its sister networks.

Tinker's own favorites among the new shows: "The Hero," misadventures of a television cowboy star (Richard Mulligan) who is "all-thumbs" at home; "Hay, Landlord," Will Hutchins and Sandy Baron in a comedy centered in a New York brownstone apartment building; a half-hour musical starring Roger Miller; "T.H.E. Cat," with Robert Loggia as a professional bodyguard.

NBC will continue with two movies per week, but Tinker admitted the supply may grow scarce in a couple of years.

"We've ordered six to eight two-hour features made especially for television by Universal," he added. "They will be used to help fill out the schedule, and it's entirely possible that they will help settle the pattern for supplying feature-length movies when we run out of Hollywood's old product."

No Crying At Van Dyke Final Show

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — This is the way the Dick Van Dyke show ends: Not with a bang, but a flock of wild tracks.

The many-Emmied series filmed its final show this week; it is quitting not because of bad ratings but because its key personnel want to pursue careers in feature films.

There were no speeches, no fanfares for the closing performance. After five years of work together, the cast spent the last minutes doing wild tracks, pieces of dialogue to be dubbed on film later.

"It's better this way," confided a production aide. "If we made any dramatic gestures, there would be all that crying."

I agreed that Mary Tyler Moore and Rose Marie seemed close to tears.

"It's the men I'm worried about," said the aide. "I hate to see grown men cry."

There was truth in his comment. At the Tahitian-type party following the last show, key members of the troupe, male and female alike, began to shake up at the thought of not doing another show.

Batman to Beethoven In a Single Evening

NEW YORK (AP) — The distance between "Batman" and Beethoven is, by any measure vast. But ABC bridged it neatly Wednesday night in an awesome demonstration of television's versatility and change of pace.

Taking last things first, there was a study of the great German composer's lonely, almost secret, struggle against deafness, done by great sensitivity, visual beauty and glorious sound.

Called "Beethoven: Ordeal and Triumph," the program was part of the network's "Saga of Western Man" series but was less a reflection on a society than a story of a man's victory over a terrible personal affliction.

The tale was told by using TV's now familiar biographical and documentary technique — filming actual sites and relics of the subject's life and circumstances as narration by an unseen speaker goes on. This time it was used with great skill.

The color photography was especially beautiful. Beethoven's soaring music, played by the Boston Symphony and pianist Claude Frank, was sometimes an almost inaudible background to the words and then swelled and roared. When the story reached the point where the young musician, at the peak of his talents, was losing his hearing, the experience was shared by the viewer. The voice of David McCallum, reading Beethoven's words, rose almost to a scream of agony. It was valid and very moving.

 physical as the program's set. This involves the show's commercials.
 The ABC network has trimmed up each half-hour episode so that four one-minute commercials are shown instead of the usual three. The total of four minutes falls within the commercial time limits set down in the television code of good practice, but it has run into resistance from some stations affiliated with the network.
 One station has refused to carry the show because of it. The extra minute was obtained by eliminating and tightening up some of the usual "clutter" — names and credits — that usually precede and follow each episode. The matter, which has caused considerable industry interest, will be thrashed out during the convention of the National Association of Broadcasters in Chicago starting this weekend.

But we'll let her decide, the way David and I did it. We asked the folks to be on their radio show. They didn't force it. I remember my first line—'Hi Mom, Hi Pop.'"
