






And this possible theory—that the State Highway Department has been facing an honest difficulty in its own efforts to find and locate and explain various routes and approaches—has been given some substantiation by the disclosure that the Department has recently, perhaps in response to public disdosures that Founders Bridge was hard to find, engaged a special committee of ordinary people to help it with its

There is another potential theory also in the running, however, and it happens to be a theory which seems to deserve additional attention, now that the Highway Department has found the talent and the site to erect one modest new sign on the approaches to the Connectieut River bridge and superhighway

This is a relatively small and modest sign, located perhaps a mile or so before one gets to the divergence of superhighways and the separation of routes and the still standing confusion of origi-

The new sign indicates that the State Highway Department does know where its bridges are, when it wants to, and does know how to tell people to get to a. certain bridge, when it wants them to.

It is a modest, clever little sign which tells motorists that they can get to Route 91, if they want to, by veering left at the next diversion of highways It is also an honest little sign, in that it carries the words toll bridge, which, of course, means Charter Oak Bridge to us local initiates. We local people, of course, know that we can also, if we ever find the way, get to Route 91 by using Founders Bridge, which is not a toll bridge. But for all those strangers who are fair game, the first direction to Route 91 they now receive as they approach the great bridge and superhighway complex from the East is one which takes them over Charter Oak, and

gets a toll out of them. We would not dream of being upon by such a subtle Connecticut means of drawing out-of-staters into the Charte Oak toll booths, where they are always
