Area Folk See More UFOs

That Manchester gentleman who saw an object in the sky last Sunday evening that he could not identify is, apparently, not alone.

A Columbia woman reports that she and her husband were returning from the Bolton Drive-in one day this week, when she saw in the northern sky a lone red light. She could not tell, she says if it was moving.

A Vernon man had just finished reading a newspaper report about UFOs this week, and looked out the window of his home to see a bright, pear-shaped object, yellowish in color, moving in a northeasterly direction through the night sky.

As he was watching, the light vanished, as though, he says, it had been switched off. In neither case did anybody else see the objects in question.

A more visible UFO has been reported by residents along Vernon Rd. in Bolton.

### Key Photos Lacking in Police Show

NEW YORK (AP) — CBS News made a valiant effort Tuesday night to present a subject much in the headlines and plaguing a large segment of the civilian, law enforcement and legal community. It involves allegations of police brutality and disregard of the rights of the accused on one hand and stringent legal re-

on the other. "CBS Reports," presented the tangled and emotion-wrapped subject in some sort of understandable visual form. But it failed simply because it was impossible to get shots to illustrate the vital points.

"The Policeman's Lot" summarized the problem by narration and the usual statements by authorities and experts. It quoted the awesome statistics — 14 serious crimes per 1,000 population, a 13 per cent increase in crime last year over 1964, New York City police alone receiving more than four million telephone calls a year, most of them for help, 25 per cent of all big city arrests for drunkenness and vagrancy.

But when it comes to illustrating the heart of the matter, there were no pictures of policemen interrogating a suspect, and no film showing a suggestion of police brutality.

The program was at its best when it focused on the smaller, more human aspects of police work. There were shots made in a station house as the desk lieutenant handled an assortment of routine problems — family rows, street fights, drunks, cranks, small thieves and rapists.

The point made by the program was that our courts are becoming increasingly sensitive about the rights of the accused with the result that police are finding court-ordered restraints and directives increasingly frustrating. It might have been made more strongly and clearly in a dramatic show like the old "Defenders" series or even by a panel discussion.

## Lorne Greene Pays Full Price of Fame

NEW YORK — (NEA) — Lorne Greene, the World's Great Father Image, has discovered the price one must pay for fame.

"There are no more beaches to lie on," he says. Greene, as Bonanza's Ben Cartwright, is now seen in 61 foreign countries. The fantastically popular NBC-TV series is dubbed in 17 languages. If he were to walk down a street in Thailand, Ghana, Japan or Poland, he would be recognized.

We have agreed to sign five-year contracts after the original seven-year deal is up. That means the show could go on for 12 years. After that there would be 12 years' worth of network reruns, plus endless syndication. It's quite a thought."

A man who enjoys his fame and wears it well, Lorne is vitally interested in a wide range of subjects. He believes that a man "takes fate by the hand." Fate has led him from his native Canada, where he was a top announcer for the CBC to his worldwide fame as a television and recording star.

His fame has not left him jaded or caustic about his fans, however. He reads much of his fan mail, and tells of one man who wrote "the all-time tender, touching letter."

Lorne was appearing in San Francisco, when the letter came. "It was from a Polish professor, taking a post-doctorate at the University of Berkeley. He is married and has a daughter, 11, and a son, 5. They are back in Poland. He told me that he was walking down a street in San Francisco when he saw a poster advertising my appearance.

"Suddenly I saw a face from home," he wrote. He went on to tell me that, in his home in Poland, he can hear all the children playing in a nearby schoolyard on Saturdays. Then at four, when Bonanza comes on, it gets quiet as they all go home to watch."

Through the years, the principles of taxation have come in for like commentary by other noted philosophers and people of letters.

Sydney Smith, in his "On American Debts," noted that "Men prefer any load of infamy, however great, to any pressure of taxation, however light."

That taxation is here to stay was emphasized by Charles Dickens, who in "David Copperfield" sneaked in the line: "It was as true... as taxes is. And nothing's truer than them."

But there's no way to escape, as we have read and been told through the years. Elizabeth Barrett Browning, in "Aurora Leigh," commented: "Pay the income tax/ And break your heart upon it."

Summing it all up in one unique phrase is Benjamin Franklin's pointed observation: "In this world, nothing is certain but death and taxes."
