Tolland Meeting on Sewer Agency To Hear Health Spokesman

First Selectman Carmelo Zanghi announced at last night's selectmen's meeting that a health representative from the State Board of Health will attend the town meeting, to be called to establish a sewer authority. This representative will be to establish criteria for the construction and operation of the sewer treatment plant to serve a proposed 24-home subdivision known as Country Hills 66 as well as the existing Country Hills home development.

Zanghi read a letter from Town Counsel Robert King, stating David Wiggins, an official from the State Board of Health, would attend the meeting if he was available that night. The meeting is tentatively planned for the latter part of May.

Zanghi was replying to a request from Mrs. Bruce Stewart, Danforth that a state official be present at the meeting.

Zanghi said Danforth's request to have copies of the town budget available a few days ahead of the annual meeting is tentatively planned for the latter part of May.

The budget figures have not been made available to residents before the annual meeting for several years. It has become a bone of contention with several residents who contend you cannot vote knowledgeably on a budget in excess of one million dollars unless you can study the budget for a few days beforehand.

Zanghi told Danforth that if he has any information, he will sell Danforth, in reply to Danforth's complaint that he has to submit an agenda in writing three days ahead of the meeting, without being informed what other business will come up at the meeting.

Events In Capital No Spacehips

WASHINGTON (AP) — Although thousands of people have reported sighting strange flying objects in the last 10 years, the secretary of the Air Force says there is no evidence any of them were spacehips.

As a matter of fact, Dr. Harold Brown told the House Armed Services Committee Tuesday, the Air Force has given an explanation for all but 66 of the 10,447 sightings it has investigated since 1947.

He blamed many gases, planes, comets, meteors, fireballs and auroral streamers as chief reasons for flapping, moving lights in the sky seen by so many.

"You might call the study a UFO's study in pavement," Brown said in explaining to the committee evidence for sightings the Air Force knew about unidentified flying objects.

"We are hiding nothing," he said.

The committee held a formal hearing on UFOs, prompted by a recent rash of sightings in Michigan.

English Mass
WASHINGTON (AP) — The Roman Catholic Church is trying to get agreement among English-speaking Christians on an English version of the Mass.

As a first step, two previously unpublished translations of the Mass were issued Tuesday for comment and criticism by churchmen and laymen. They are not for actual use in the Mass but as a basis for promoting discussion.

The translations were issued by the International Committee on English in the Liturgy.

NASA Budget
WASHINGTON (AP) — The House Science and Astronautics Committee has authorized a \$4,966,864,100 budget for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

Korean 'Dove' Units Help Win Viet War

QUY NHON, South Viet Nam (AP) — The 20,000 Koreans in Viet Nam are helping to win the war by spending as much time as the Vietnamese as they are shooting Viet Cong.

The bulk of the Korean outfit is made up of army regulars and national militia who are the largest foreign fighting force in Viet Nam after the Americans.

Backing them up are the "dove units" — construction crews building roads and bridges and medical units providing aid to civilians as well as soldiers.

Headquartered at Qui Nhon, a central Viet Nam port on the South China Sea, is South Korea's Eighth Army Division which has been backed up a notable battle force since it landed here in 1954.

"We have trained for the weather and the climate of Viet Nam and we have learned the Viet Cong tactics," said Maj. Gen. Myung Shin-cha, commander of Korean forces in Viet Nam.

Capt. Kwon Joon-tak, a member of the Tiger Division, said his men were especially trained in night fighting, as which the Communists have long excelled.

"The Viet Cong are good, but we are better," he said.

"The Korean market are stationed at Tuy Hoa, a sandy peninsula, surrounded in each direction Viet Nam not far from Viet Cong territory.

"When we go into battle, we have the advantage of long training and the highest morale," said Lt. Chung Jee-son of the marine's Blue Dragon outfit.

At Qui Nhon, 10 miles northeast of Saigon, are the self-styled "doves", a 2,000-man construction outfit that has been repairing roads and bridges, setting up medical dispensaries and playgrounds and carrying out other projects to show the Vietnamese that allied troops are their friends.

On one occasion the Koreans rebuilt a Buddhist temple that had been destroyed by guerrillas.

The construction crews are housed in an old French outpost with watchtowers spaced along a high brick wall.

"The most important part of our aid program is the treatment of the people themselves," said Brig. Gen. Cho Koon-whan, who set up the Korean installation at Qui Nhon.

Students' Politics An Age-Old Story

By WILLIAM L. RYAN

As the world's students are, they are also the world's politicians. They are, in fact, the most active political group in the world today, and their activities are spreading rapidly from the streets of the big cities to the remote villages of the world.

Political violence by students is as old as universities themselves. But in a day of swift communication it is far more contagious than ever before.

An idea travels around the world in minutes. Thus, although 10,000 miles separated a student uprising in Indonesia from one in Latin America, the Indonesian upheaval may have played a significant role in the overthrow of a Latin-American military junta.

In turbulent Ecuador, a paper gave spectacular front-page play last Sunday to a dispatch from Jakarta telling in detail of a student crusade which helped sweep Communists out of the Indonesian government. It was titled "These student leaders."

Ecuador already was in ferment, provoked by a strike of business and professional groups in Guayaquil, the country's second city, against the Junta's economic measures. This week students took to the streets, adding their not inconsiderable clamor to rising public dissatisfaction with the regime. Some in Quito, the capital, suggested that the news from Indonesia provided inspiration.

On Tuesday, Ecuador's Junta gave way. The military high command announced its dissolution and the transfer of power to a civilian as head of a provisional government.

Restless students are on the move around the world.

In South Viet Nam they have been turning out in the streets to demonstrate their dissatisfaction with lack of popular representation in a U.S.-backed military government preoccupied with war against a Communist revolution. The weight of their protests was sufficiently influential to bring promises of eventual civilian rule from the military leaders.

In South Korea over the past decade or more, students have clashed frequently with their government and today are a fountainhead of political unrest. They played a major role in bringing down the aged dictator, Syngman Rhee.

In Japan, students are in the forefront of violent political demonstrations.

Younger generation revolutionaries is a factor even in rigidly ruled Communist nations. Soviet authorities constantly are preoccupied with the activities of

DaNang Prosperity Ends When Marines Move Out

DA NANG, South Viet Nam (AP)—This port on the South China Sea 230 miles northeast of Saigon has 160,000 Vietnamese inhabitants, first-rate swimming beaches, second-rate hotels, third-rate restaurants—and a war.

The war brought about 26,000 U.S. Marines to the immediate area and prosperity to Da Nang's shabby weather-stained shops until political turmoil put the city off limits to U.S. military personnel.

Beggars shuffle along the littered streets. The bars are crowded with bar girls and prostitutes who have fallen on hard times now.

The cost of living is high, even higher than in Saigon, where living costs have skyrocketed during the past year.

Da Nang's main buildings are the Grand Hotel and numerous U.S. billets which still are maintained even though the city is out of bounds to all U.S. military personnel except when on official business.

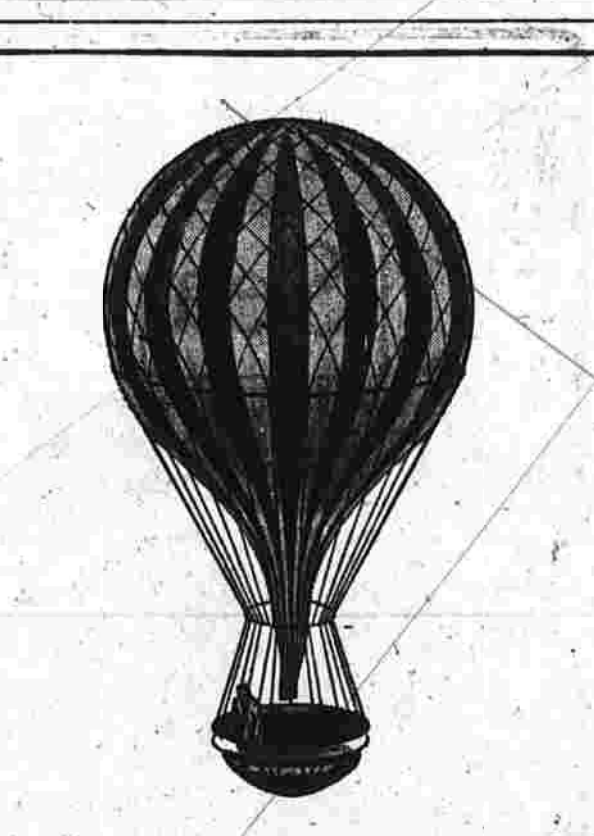

Tiede in Viet Nam Two Minutes to Live

LAI KIEP, Viet Nam (VNA)—Regardless of the importance placed on it, time is such that it is seldom accorded to men at war—unless they think they haven't much of it left.

Capt. Paul McCullum is an example.

Time almost ran out on him the other day.

But he used what appeared to him to be his final two minutes to save his own life.

He was in the air next time, the pilot of an Air Force jet fighter which was slipping and sliding through enemy ground fire.

His ship was a P-100 Super Sabre, a 38-47-foot, 700 m.p.h., \$800,000 flying blowtorch stuffed with 7,800 pounds of horsepower in the body, and carrying an additional 3,600 pounds of propellant in pods strapped under the wings.

McCullum had made two passes over the enemy before his tank sprung a flaming leak. Flying at 300 feet, he felt three pounds in the rear of the craft as it tumbled from a 50-caliber machine gun.

The engine fire indicator was flashing red. No. 4 bit about it. The jet's tail was badly burning.

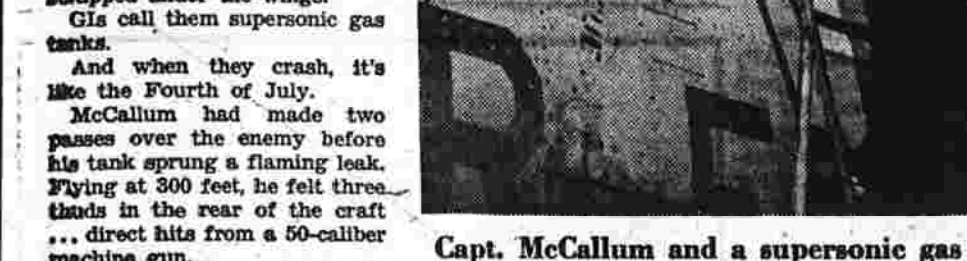

WINSTED (AP)—Thomas A. Haggerty, who has held continuous membership in the Knights of Columbus longer than any other Knight in Connecticut, has passed the 70-year mark.

The 82-year-old retired newspaperman joined the Knights of Columbus March 28, 1896, in North Adams, Mass., and for the past four decades has been a member of Winsted's Council in Winsted.

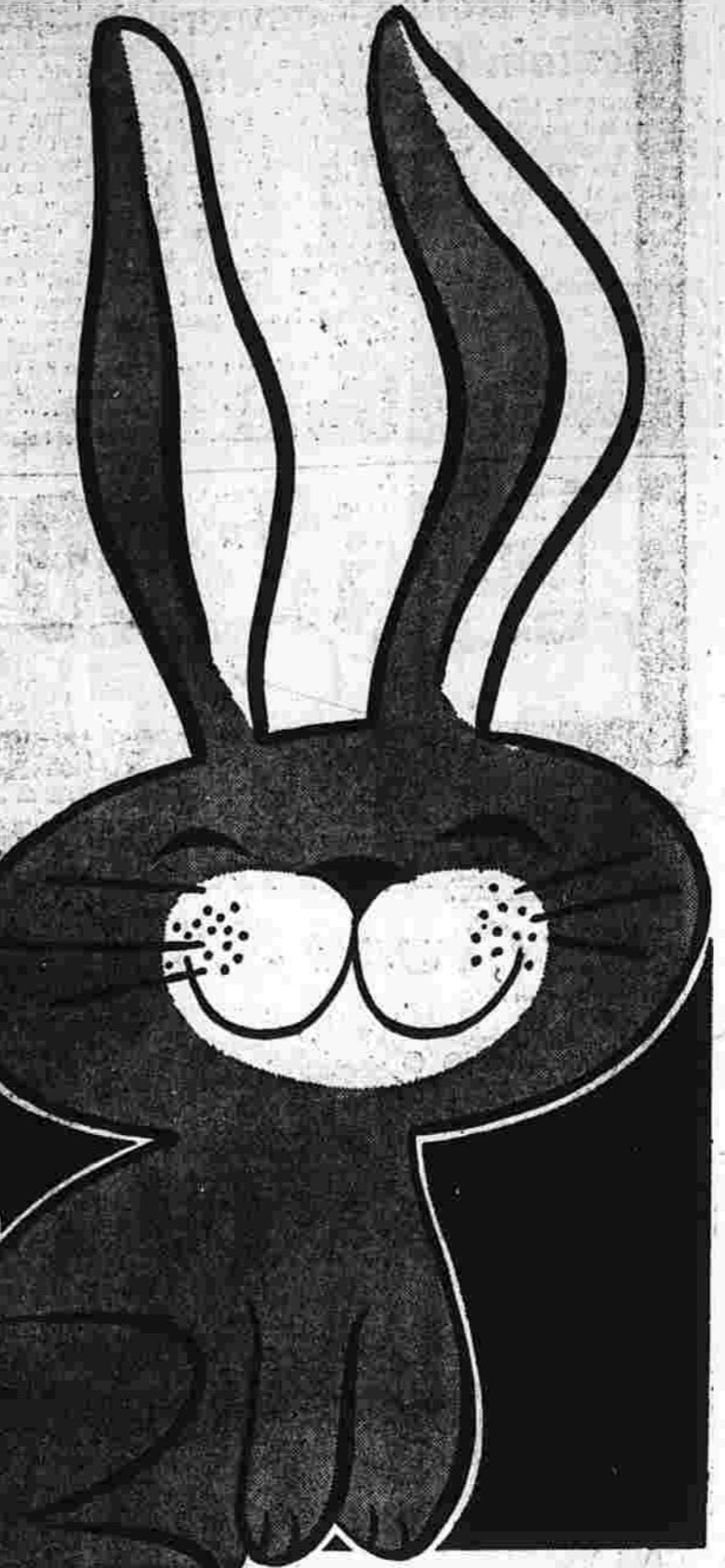

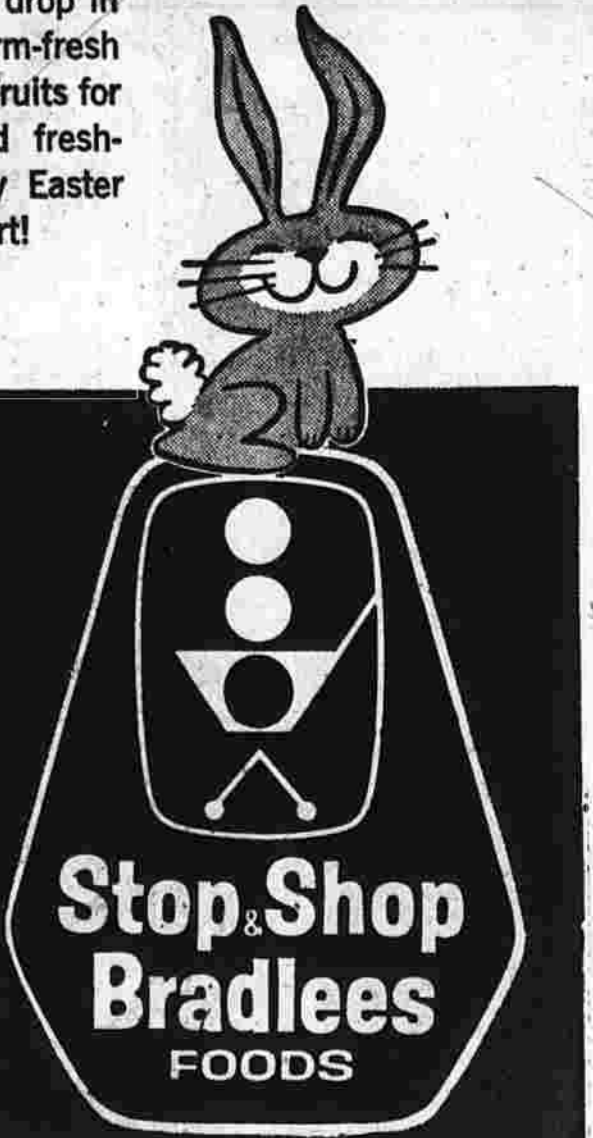

Two Lost As Stage Dumps II

WILMINGTON, Del. (AP) — "I heard a crack, like timbers breaking. The man slid off as if they were on a slippery board. It was a miracle that more men weren't lost."

So spoke a fellow worker Tuesday after watching helplessly while a scaffold on a new bridge across the Delaware River collapsed, tossing 11 workers 45 feet into the water or onto a concrete bridge under a large anchorage block. Two were missing and nine injured, one seriously.

"The thing happened so suddenly, the guys were in the water before we could do anything," said Orin W. Avison Jr., 41, Havre de Grace, Md. He was standing nearby when the scaffold collapsed.

The hunt was still under way for the missing men, Paul Artie, 41, Wilmington, a foreman on the job, and Edward Clark Jr., 47, Bridgeton, N.J.

Los Brown, 49, Wilmington, who suffered a fractured pelvis and internal injuries, was in serious condition at a hospital. Two others were admitted to hospitals for observation; the others were treated and released.

The men were working on a new, six-lane span adjacent to the Delaware Memorial Bridge.

The new span, like the present four-lane bridge will connect the New Jersey Turnpike with the Delaware Expressway.

Globe Reservoir Now at Capacity

Of the four town reservoirs, only one is filled to capacity, while the other three are still not filled, according to a report issued by Lawrence White, superintendent, Water and Sewer Department.

The report, showing reservoir capacity as of April 4, indicates that the Globe Hollow Reservoir, with 170 million gallons of water, is filled to capacity. The Porter Reservoir is nearly full, having in storage now slightly over 34 million gallons, with a capacity of slightly over 35 million gallons.

The Howard Reservoir is approximately 19 million gallons short of capacity, and the Rounding Brook Reservoir needs about 2 million gallons to fill it.

Storage in the reservoirs is a little over 50 million gallons, some this month that was the first of last month, even though rainfall for March was slightly below the average for the usual March. This March, 2.80 inches of rain fell, usually the month gets an average of 3.8 inches.

The reservoirs increased their storage in spite of this, since not as much water is used this time of year, as is in the summer months. Also, the reservoirs increased since the ground is hard, and not as much rainfall is absorbed by the ground, Whitehead says.

Stamps In the News

AP News Service

The 8-cent U.S. commemorative postage stamp dedicated to the "Human Treatment of Animals" will be issued April 9 in New York. It will make the 70th anniversary of the founding of the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

The design features a mongrel dog named Babe, who belongs to artist Norman Todhunter who designed the stamp.

Collectors desiring first-day cancellations may send addressed envelopes together with remittance to cover the cost of the stamps to be affixed to the Postmaster, New York, N.Y. 10001. Requests must be received prior to April 9.

Postmaster General Lawrence F. O'Brien announced plans to issue three additional commemorative stamps to the 1966 stamp. This brings to 12 the number of commemorative postage stamps on the agenda.

The three added stamps are: A salute to the United States Marine Corps Reserve, a dedication to "Beautiful America" and a tribute to 1,000 years of culture in Poland.

The Marine Corps Reserve stamp will help celebrate the 50th anniversary of this organization which came into being Aug. 29, 1916, under an act by President Woodrow Wilson.

The beautification stamp coincides with President Johnson's national beautification campaign and attack against unsightly conditions. His No. 1 aide in this campaign has been the First Lady.

The Polish commemorative halts 10 centuries of culture since that country came into existence and honors the many Polish-Americans now living here.

The 4-cent Lincoln stamp in coil form will be issued at Springfield, Ill., on May 28 during the Lincoln Society of Philately convention. The design and color will be identical to the recently issued Lincoln stamp in sheet form.

The stamp will be sold at post offices in full coils of 500 and 2,000. However, collectors may obtain the 4-cent coil stamps in any quantity desired from the Philatelic Sales Unit, City Post Office, Washington, D.C. 20504, on and after May 31, 1966.

Collectors desiring first-day cancellations may send addressed envelopes, together with remittance to cover the cost of the stamps to be affixed, to the Postmaster, Springfield, Ill., 62701. Since covers are considered cancellations, they must allow for the 8-cent rate in submitting their orders. A 3-cent stamp will be affixed by the Springfield Post Office, or collectors may affix their own additional postage to the envelopes, leaving the necessary space in the upper right hand corner for the new 4-cent Lincoln stamp.

First-day collectors are reminded that the envelopes to the Postmaster should be endorsed "First Day Covers Lincoln Coil Stamp." Cover requests must be postmarked by later than May 28.

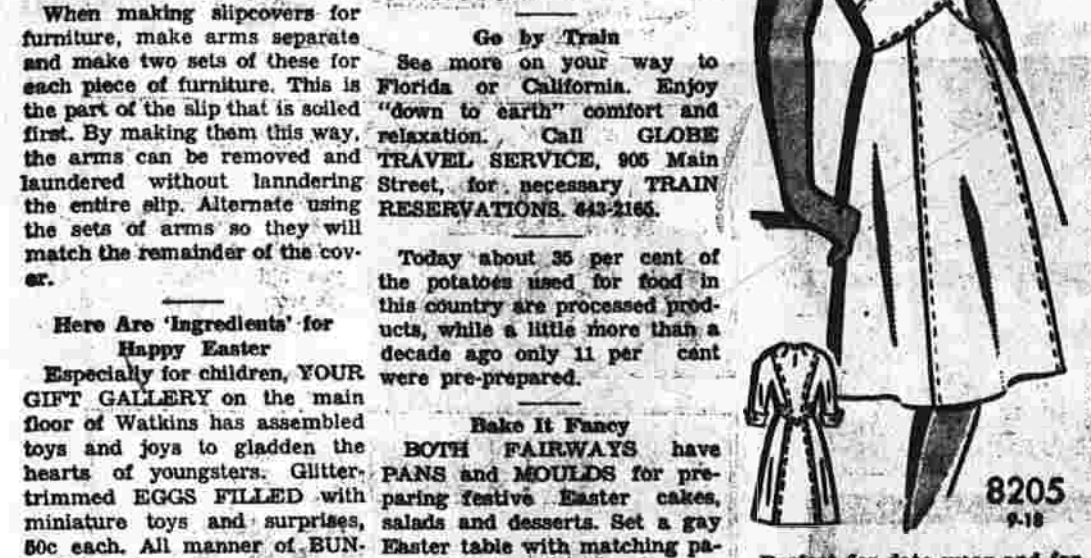
