Will Local Lawyer Please Explain Police Chief James Reardon has rerealed that he, in his capacity as traffic authority, is about to place no parking signs on the north side of a stretch of Oak St., from Spruce St. east to Autumn St., and on both sides of Beach St., from High St. to Pleasant St., and that he is asking the State Traffic Commission to make a survey of South Main St. from the Country Club south to the Glastonbury line for the purpose of placing no parking signs on both

No one questions the competence of our traffic authorities, state or logal, in selecting those stretches of highway where the parking of cars represents a special traffic danger. We doubt that anyone questions, very much, the theory that consideration of traffic flow and safety should have the right to outrisk the privilege of parking.

It is something else which has been hothering some of us during all these

years of growth of the parking ban. Who compensates the property own-ers, or the businesses, unlucky enough to be hit by the spread of the parking If parking is to be banned just on one side of a street, what considerations determine which side of the street is to be favored with a continuation of its ancient parking privileges, and which side is suddenly to be stripped of them?

We can all drive around Manchester, in places where parking bans have been put into effect in the last decade, and see what has happened to some of the commercial properties involved. Their value and usefulness has, in many instances, been almost totally destroyed How does it happen that, in our great civilization of laws and justice and rights of all kinds, there is no conceivprivate property and investment by such decisions on the part of traffic au-

plain it for us, how public authority can, in this particular field, take so much away with no liability?

Where Were The Police? Burning a draft card is a violation of the law. It is punishable through the courts. However, much the great ma-

Action publicised their protest demonstration well in advance, reporters, TV cartersmen, and a crowd were on hand to witness it all. Where, then, were the police when the savage attack began? And why were their no arrests?
It is hard to avoid the impression that the police were sitting this one out, hop-ing that the demonstrators would get heir comeuppence. It is hard to distin guish the lack of police protection for these demonstrators from failures of the

police to protect civil-rights demonstra-tors on various occasions in the South. Are those who peacefully defy the law es conscientious grounds, or on any other grounds for that matter, to be de-prived of police protection from mob violence? Does not any citizen, however unpopular-his views, deserve such pro-

Many of us would disagree with the analysis of the situation which led the draft card burners to their unlawful act and many would disagree with their chosen means of protest. But there is evidence that they are willing to accept the full penalties of the law and are neither draft dodgers nor cowards but young man of deep moral conviction and young men of deep moral conviction and

considerable courage.

One announced: "I am a pacifist. I do what I believe is right as an individual... I believe in the law but when the law violated my con-science... His assailants prevented him from finishing. He later told a newsman that he was willing to die, if necessary, for this cause in which he so passionately believes.

It takes no courage for bullies, urge on by shouts of "kill them," to attack those who by their own convictions will not strike back. Society must do a much better job in teaching the fundamentals of democracy, constitutionalism, and citisenship. Young Americans must eltisenship. Before the owner or person in charge of such vehicle shall be permitted to remove the same from such vehicle pound, he shall furnish to the First Selectman (or such other police officer, sheriff or constable as the First Selectman shall designate) evidence of his identity, ownership or right of possession, and shall sign a receipt for the same, and he shall pay the reasonable costs. receipt for the same, and he shall pay the reasonable costs of removal, plus the reasonable cost of storage, for each day, or portion of a day, said vehicle is stored in the vehicle

The owner of any impounded vehicle shall be duly informed as to the nature and circumstances of the violation on account of which such vehicle has been impounded.
