NOTICE

HOUSING ORDINANCE REGULATING SUPPLIED FACILITIES, MAINTENANCE AND OCCUPANCY OF DWELLINGS AND DWELLING UNITS

An Ordinance establishing minimum standards governing the condition and maintenance of dwellings; establishing minimum standards, governing supplied utilities and facilities and other physical things and conditions essential to make dwellings safe and fit for human habitation; establishing minimum standards governing the condition of dwellings offered for rent; fixing certain responsibilities and duties of owners and occupants of dwellings; authorizing the inspection of dwellings, and the condemnation of dwellings unfit for human habitation; and fixing penalties for violations.

WHEREAS in the Town of Country that

WHEREAS, in the Town of Coventry, there are or may in the future be dwelling structures which are so dilapidated, amende, dangerous, unhygienic, or unsanitary as to constitute a menace to the health and safety of the people of the Town of Coventry; and WHEREAS, such dwelling structures are a principal cause of deterioration and blight in residential areas essential to the well-being of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the owners and occupants of dwelling structures have certain responsibilities to prevent the blighting of residential areas and the burdens they create for the Town at large; WHEREAS, a Housing Code is essential to establish these responsibilities and to set minimum standards sufficient to protect public health and safety and to halt the spread of blight; BE IT THEREFORE ordained by the Inhabitants of the

Town of Coventry at a town meeting as follows: HOUSING CODE PROPERTY DEFENITIONS.

1.1 The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this ordinance:

1.1 BASEMENT shall mean a portion of a building located partly underground, but having less than half (1/2) of its clear floor-to-ceiling height below the average grade of the adjoining ground.

1.2 BUILDING INSPECTOR shall mean the legally designated

building inspector of the Town of Coventry.

1.3 CELLAR shall mean a portion of a building located partly or wholly underground, and having half or more than half of its clear floor-to-ceiling height below the average grade

of the adjoining ground.

DWELLING shall mean any building which is used or intended to be used in whole or in part for living or sleeping by human occupants; provided that temporary housing as hereinafter defined in subsection 1.22 shall not be regarded as a dwelling.

1.5 DWELLING UNIT shall mean any group of rooms locat within a dwelling and forming a single habitable unit with facilities which are used or intended to be used for living

sleeping, cooking, and eating.

EXTERMINATION shall mean the control and elimination of insects, rodents, or other pests by eliminating their harborage places; by removing or making inaccessible materials that may serve as their food; by poisoning spraying, fumigating, trapping, or by any other recognize and legal pest elimination methods approved by the Er

forcing Officer.

1.7 FIRE MARSHALS shall mean the legally designated Fire Marshals of the Town of Coventry or his designated assistant.

I.S GARBAGE shall mean the animal and vegetable waste resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking, and consumption of food.

2.15 OWNER shall mean any person who alone or jointly or severally with others:

(b) Shall have charge, care, or control of any dwelling or dwelling unit, as owner or agent of the owner, or as executor, executrix, administrator, administratrix, trustee, or guardian of the estate of the owner. Any such person thus representing the actual owner shall be bound to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, and of rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto, to the same extent as if he were the owner.

8.19 ROOMING HOUSE shall mean any dwelling, or that part of any dwelling containing one or more rooming units, in which space is let by the owner or operator to more than three persons who are not husband or wife, son or daughter, mother or father, or sister or brother of the owner or operator; provided that hospitals, homes for the aged, and other institutions licensed by the State Department of Health under Chapter 181 of the General Statutes shall not be regarded as rooming houses or as subject to the provisions of this ordinance.
2.20 RUBBISH shall mean combustible and non-combustible waste materials, except garbage; and the term shall include the residue from the burning of wood, coke and other combustible material, paper, rags, cartons, boxes, wood, excelsior, rubber, leather, tree branches, yard trimmings, tin cans, metals, mineral matter, glass, crockery, and dust or other items as specified by the Board of Health.

1.31 SUPPLIED shall mean paid for, furnished, or provided or under the control of the owner or operator.

1.22 TEMPORARY HOUSING shall mean any tent, trailer, similar structure which is used for human she in any calendar year.

Whenever the masculine pronoun is used, it shall also mean the feminine pronoun. EDUTION 2. INSPECTION OF DWELLINGS, DWELLING UNITS, ROOMING UNITS AND PREMISES

This Housing Ordinance shall apply to every structure used for dwelling purposes regardless of age.

The Building Inspector is hereby authorized and directed to make inspections to determine the condition of dwellings, dwelling units, rooming units, and premises located within this TOWN OF COVENTRY in order that he may within this TOWN OF COVENTRY in order that he may perform his duty of safeguarding the health and safety of the occupants of dwellings and of the general public. For the purpose of making such inspections the Building Inspector is hereby authorized to enter, examine, and survey at all reasonable times all dwellings, dwelling units, rooming units and premises. The owner, or occupant or person in charge thereof, shall give the Building Inspector free access to such dwelling, dwelling unit or rooming unit and its premises, at all reasonable times for the purpose of such inspection, examination, and survey. Each occupant of a dwelling, or dwelling unit shall give the owner thereof, or his agent or employe access to any part of such dwelling or dwelling unit, or its premises, at all reasonable times for the purpose of making such repairs and/or alterations as are necessary to affect compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

DECEMON S. ENFORCEMENT, SERVICE OF NOTICE AND OBDERS. CODE ENFORCEMENT COMMITTEE, HEARINGS.

There is hereby created a code enforcement committee which shall consist of the members of the Board of Health, one of whom shall serve as secretary; the Fire Marshal of the Town of Coventry; the Police Chief. in connection with the enforcement of any provision of this ordinance may request and upon the payment of ten dollar fee payable to the Treasurer of the Town of Coventry shall be granted a hearing on the matter before the Code Enforcement Committee created in Sub-section 3.1 of this ordinance; provided that such person shall file in the office of the Building Inspector a written petition requesting such hearing and setting forth a brief statement of the grounds thereof within 20 days after the day the notice was served. Upon receipt of such petition the Building Inspector shall set a time and place for such hearing and chall give the petitioner five days written notice thereof.

(a) Shall have legal title to any dwelling or dwelling unit, with or without accompanying actual possession thereof; or

(b) Shall have charge, care, or control of any dwelling deemed to have been revoked. Any such permit which has deemed to have been revoked. Any such permit which has been suspended by a notice shall be deemed to be automatically revoked if a petition for hearing is not filed in the office of the Building Inspector within 20 days after

such notice is served.

The proceedings at such hearing, including the findings and decision of the Code Enforcement Committee shall be summarized, reduced to writing, and entered as a matter of public record in the office of the Building Inspector and open to reasonable public inspection. Such record shall also include a copy of every notice or order issued in connection with the matter. Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Building Inspector or the Code Enforcement Committee may seek relief therefrom in any court of competent jurisdiction as provided by the laws of this State.

SECTION 4. MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR BASIC EQUIPMENT AND FACILITIES

4.0 No person shall occupy as owner-occupant or let to another for occupancy any dwelling or dwelling unit, for the purpose of living, sleeping, cooking, or eating therein, which does not comply with the following requirements:

4.1 Every dwelling unit shall contain a room or space for the storage, preparation and cooking of food, and shall include space for a stove or other cooking facilities and space for dry food storage and space for refrigerated food storage; and shall include a kitchen sink installed. The sink shall be in good working condition and properly connected to a hot and cold running water system under pressure and a sewer system shall be installed and maintained in a manner prescribed by ordinances, rules and regulations of manner prescribed by ordinances, rules and regulations of the TOWN OF COVENTRY.

Every dwelling unit shall be equipped with a complete bathroom fixture group consisting of an acceptable means of disposing of human waste, lavatory basin, and a bathtub or shower in good working condition and installed and 6.4 tub or shower in good working condition and installed and maintained in a manner prescribed by ordinances, rules and regulations of the TOWN OF COVENTRY.

Every dwelling unit shall be supplied with adequate rubbish storage facilities and with adequate garbage disposal facilities or garbage storage containers whose type and location are approved by the Building Inspector. It shall be the responsibility of the owner to supply such facilities or containers for all dwelling units in a multiple dwelling. In all other cases it shall be the responsibility of the occupants to furnish such facilities or containers. Garbage and rubbish shall be separated as specified by Town Ordinance.

The water-heater facilities necessary to provide the hot water required under Subsection 4.1, 4.2, 9.5, and 9.12 shall be properly installed and connected to the hot water lines required under these Subsections; shall be maintained in safe and good working condition, and shall be capable of heating water to such a temperature as to permit an adequate amount of water to be drawn at every required sink, lavatory basin, bathtub or shower at a temperature of not less than 120 degrees F. Such supplied water-heating facilities shall be capable of meeting the requirements of the Subsection when the dwelling, dwelling unit, rooming house, or room unit heating facilities required under the provisions of Subsection 5.5 are not in operation. Every dwelling unit shall have safe, unobstructed means of egress leading to safe and open space at ground level as required by the statutes, ordinances and regulations of the State of Connecticut and the TOWN OF COVENTRY.

ECTION S. MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR

5.0 No person shall occupy as owner-occupant or let to another for occupancy any dwelling or dwelling unit, for the purpose of living therein, which does not comply with the following requirements:

following requirements:

Every habitable room shall have at least one window facing directly to the outdoors. The minimum aggregate glass area of windows for habitable rooms shall not be less than one-tenth (1/10) of the floor area of the room served by them. Whenever walls or other portions of structures face a window of any habitable room and such light obstruction structures are located less than three (3) feet from the window and extend to a level above that of the ceiling of the room, such a window shall not be inthe ceiling of the room, such a window shall not be in-cluded as contributing to the required minimum total

window area.

Every habitable room shall have at least one window area. which can be easily opened, or such other device as will adequately ventilate the room. The total of the openable window area in every habitable room shall be equal to at

least 45 per cent of the minimum aggregate glass area of the window required in Subsection 5.1 except where there is supplied some other device affording adequate ventilation and approved by the Building Inspector.

Every bathroom and water closet compartment shall comply with the light and ventilation requirements for habitable rooms contained in Subsection 5.1 and 5.2 except where the bathroom or water closet compartment is adequately ventilated by a ventilation system which is kept in continuous or automatic operation and approved by the Building Inspector.

Building Inspector.

Every dwelling unit and all public and common areas shall be supplied with electric service outlets, and fixtures which shall be properly installed, shall be maintained in good and safe working condition, and shall be connected to the source of electric power in a manner prescribed by the ordinances, rules and regulations of the Town of Coventry. The capacity of such service and the number of outlets and fixtures shall be as follows:

(a) every habitable room shall have an electric service and outlets and/or fixtures capable of providing at least three (3) watts per square foot of floor area.

(b) every habitable room shall have at least one (1) floor-or-wall type electric convenience outlet for each sixty (60) square feet or fraction thereof of floor area, and in no case less than two (2) such outlets.

and in no case less than two (2) such outlets. (c) every water closet compartment, bathroom, laundry room, furnace room and public hall shall contain at least one supplied ceiling or wall type electric light

Every dwelling or dwelling unit shall be supplied with heat ing facilities which are properly installed; are maintained in safe and good working condition, and are capable of safely and adequately heating all habitable rooms, bathrooms and water closet compartments located therein to a temperature of at least 70 degrees F. at a distance three feet above floor level when cutdoes temperature in 10 degrees. feet above floor level when outdoor temperature is 10 degrees.

Every common hallway and stairway in every multiple dwelling shall be adequately lighted with lighting facilities sufficient to provide a light intensity of at least one (1) lumen at the floor or stair tread level at all times; every common hallway and stairway in structures devoted solely to dwelling occupancy and containing not more than four dwelling units may be supplied with conveniently located switches controlling an adequate lighting system which may be turned on when needed instead of full-time lighting may be turned on when needed, instead of full-time 5.7 During that portion of each year when the Building In Inspector deems it necessary for protection against mos quitoes, flies, and other insects, every door opening directly from a dwelling unit to outdoor space shall be supplied with screens and a self-closing device; and every window or other device with openings to outdoor space, used or in-tended to be used for ventilation shall likewise be supplied with screens; provided that such screens shall not be re-quired during such period in rooms deemed by the Building Inspector to be located bith amount in the

by the Building Inspector to have so few insects as to ren-der screens unnecessary. Every basement or cellar window used or intended to be used for ventilation, and every other opening to a basement which might provide an entry for rodents or other pests, shall be supplied with a screen or such device as will ef-fectively prevent their entrance.

SECTION 6. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS RELATING TO THE SAFE AND SANITARY MAINTENANCE OF PARTS OR DWELLINGS AND DWELLING UNITS.

No person shall occupy as owner-occupant or let to another for occupancy any dwelling or dwelling unit, for the purpose of living therein which does not comply with the following requirements: lowing requirements: 8.1 Every foundation, floor, wall, ceiling and roof shall be rea-

sonably weather-tight, water-tight and rodent-proof; and shall be capable of affording privacy; and shall be kept in Every window, exterior door, and basement hatchway shall be reasonably weather-tight, water-tight and rodent-proof; and shall be kept in sound working condition and good

Every inside and outside stair, every porch and every ap-purtenance thereto shall be maintained and kept in sound condition and good repair.

Every plumbing fixture and water and waste pipe shall be properly installed and maintained in good sanitary working condition, free from defects, leaks and obstructions. Every water closet compartment, floor surface and bath-room floor surface shall be constructed and maintained so as to be reasonably impervious to water and so as to permit such floor to be easily kept in a clean and sanitary con-

All rain water shall be so drained and conveyed from every roof so as not to cause dampness in the walls, ceilings or floors of any habitable room, or any bathroom or water closet compartment.

Every supplied facility, piece of equipment, or utility which is required under this ordinance shall be so constructed or installed that it will function safely and effectively, and

installed that it will function safely and effectively, and shall be maintained in satisfactory working condition.

No owner, operator, or occupant shall cause any service facility, equipment or utility which is required under this ordinance to be removed from or shut off from or discontinued for any occupied dwelling let or occupied by him except for such temporary interruption as may be necessary while actual repairs or alterations are in process, or during temporary emergencies when discontinuance of service is approved by the Building Inspector.

No owner shall occupy or let to any other occupant any vacant dwelling unit unless it is clean, sanitary and fit

SECTION 7. MINIMUM SPACE, USE, AND LOCATION RE-

7.0 No person shall occupy or let to another for occupancy any dwelling or dwelling unit, for the purpose of living therein, which does not comply with following requirements:
7.1 Every room occupied for sleeping purposes by one occupant shall contain at least 70 square feet of usable floor area, and every room occupied for sleeping purposes by more than one occupant shall contain at least 50 additional square feet of usable floor area for each additional occupant thereof.

Ceiling height shall conform to the standards as requ by Statutes, ordinances and regulations of the State of Connecticut and the Town of Coventry. No cellar space shall be used as a habitable room or dwell-

No basement space shall be used as a habitable room or dwelling unit unless, in addition to the other provisions of his ordinance: this ordinance:

(a) The floor and walls are impervious to leakage of underground and surface runoff water and insulated against dampness; and

(b) The minimum aggregate glass area of windows as re-

quired under subsection 5.1 is located entirely above the grade of the ground adjoining such window area.

7.5 No dwelling unit in a multiple dwelling shall contain less than two habitable rooms. Three shall be a minimum of 400 square feet of floor area for each two room dwelling unit and for each additional room the floor space shall be in-creased by at least 120 square feet. SECTION S. RESPONSIBILITIES OF OWNERS AND OC-

Every owner of a dwelling containing two or more dwell-ing units shall be responsible for maintaining in a clean and sanitary condition the shared or common areas of the dwell-

ing and premises thereof. 8.2 Every occupant of a dwelling or dwelling unit shall keep in a clean and sanitary condition that part of the dwelling, dwelling unit, and premises thereof, which he occupies and

Every occupant of a dwelling or dwelling unit shall dis-pose of all his rubbish in a clean and sanitary manner by placing it in the rubbish containers required by Subsection placing it in the rubbish containers required by subsection 4.3 of Section 4 of this ordinance.

Every occupant of a dwelling or dwelling unit shall dispose of all his garbage and any other organic waste which might be food for rodents, in a clean and sanitary manner, might be food for rodents, in a clean and sanitary manner, by placing it in the garbage disposal facilities or garbage storage containers required by Subsection 4.3 of Section 4 of this ordinance.

8.5 It shall be the responsibility of the owner to hang all screens for all dwelling units in a dwelling containing more than 2 dwelling units and for all dwelling units located on a premise where more than 2 dwelling units share the same

premises.

Every occupant of a dwelling containing a single dwelling unit shall be responsible for the extermination of any insects, rodents, or other pests therein or on the premises; and every occupant of a dwelling unit in a dwelling containing more than one dwelling unit shall be responsible for such extermination whenever his dwelling unit is the only dwelling unit within the dwelling that is infested. Whenever infestation is caused by failure of the owner to maintain a dwelling in a rat-proof or reasonable insect-proof condition, extermination shall be the responsibility of the owner. Whenever infestation exists in two or more of the dwelling units in any dwelling, or in the shared or common parts of any dwelling containing two or more dwelling units, extermination thereof shall be the responsibility of

Every occupant of a dwelling unit shall keep plumbing fixtures therein, in a clean and sanitary condition and shall be responsible for the exercise of reasonable care in the proper use and operation thereof, SECTION 9. BOOMING HOUSES

9.0 No person shall operate a rooming house, or shall occupy or let to another for occupancy any room unit in any room-ing house, except in compliance with the provision of Sec-tion 4 and Section 8.

No person shall operate a rooming house unless he holds a valid Rooming House Permit issued by the Building Inspector in the name of the operator and for the spe spector in the name of the operator and for the specific dwelling or dwelling unit. The operator shall apply to the Building Inspector for such permit, which shall be issued by the Building Inspector upon compliance by the operator with the applicable provisions of this ordinance. This permit shall be displayed in a conspicuous place within the rooming house, at all times. No such permit shall be transferable. Every person holding such a premit shall give notice in writing to the Building Inspector within 24 hours after having sold, transferred, given away, or otherwise disposed of ownership of interest in, or control of any disposed of ownership of, interest in, or control of any rooming house. Such notice shall include the name and ad-dress of the person succeeding to the ownership, or control of such rooming house. Every rooming house permit shall expire on the last day of June following its date of issuance, unless sooner suspended or revoked as hereinafter provided.

Any person whose application for a permit to operate a rooming house has been denied may request in writing and shall be granted a hearing on the matter before the Coo

Enforcement Committee under the procedure provided by Section 3 for the hearing of petitions relating to notices.

Whenever upon inspection of any rooming house the Building Inspector finds that conditions or practices exist which are in violation of any provisions of this ordinance, the Building Inspector shall give notice in writing to the op-erator of such rooming house that unless such conditions or practices are corrected within a reasonable period, to period the Building Inspector shall reinspect such rooming house, and if he finds that such conditions or practices have not been corrected he shall give notice in writing to the operator that the latter's permit has been suspended. Upor receipt of notice of suspension such operator shall imme liately cease operation of such rooming house and no person shall occupy for sleeping or living purposes any room-

Any person whose permit to operate a rooming house has been suspended, or who has received notice from the Building Inspector that his permit is to be suspended unless existing conditions or practices at his rooming house are corrected may request in writing and shall be granted a hearing on the matter before the Code Enforcement Committee under the procedure provided by Section 3; PRO-20 days following the day on which such permit was suspended, such permit shall be deemed to have been automatically revoked. At least one flush water closet, lavatory basin, and bath-

tub or shower, properly connected to a water and sewer sys-tem approved by the Building Inspector and in good condition, shall be supplied for each five persons or fraction thereof residing within a rooming house, including mem-bers of the operators family wherever they share the use of said facilities; PROVIDED that in a rooming house where rooms are let only to males, flush urinals may be substituted for not more than one-half the required number of water closets. All such facilities shall be located within the dwelling as to be reasonably accessible from common hall or passageway to all persons sharing facilities. Every lavatory basin and bathtub or shower shall be supplied with hot water at all times in accordance with the provisions of Subsection 4.4. No such facilities shall be located in a basement except by written approval of the Building In-

The operator of every rooming house shall change supplies, bed linen and towels therein at least once a week, and prior to the letting of any room to any occupants. The operator shall be responsible for the maintenance of all supplied bedding in a clean and sanitary manner. Every room occupied for sleeping purposes by one person shall contain at least 70 square feet of usable floor area and

every room occupied for sleeping purposes by more than one person shall contain at least 50 square feet of usable floor area as so defined for each additional occupant thereof. Every rooming unit shall have safe, unobstructed means of egress, leading to safe and open space at ground level, as required by the statutes, ordinances and regulations of the State of Connecticut and the TOWN OF COVENTRY. The operator of every rooming house shall be responsible for the sanitary maintenance of all walls, floors and callings and for maintenance of a sanitary condition in every other part of the rooming house; and he shall be further responsible for sanitary maintenance of the entire premises where the entire structure or building is leased or oc-
