Sunrise Services Herald Joyous Easter Observance

NEW YORK (AP) — Christians around the world prepare today to mark Easter with sunrise services and fashion parades in observance of the joyous holiday commemorating the Resurrection of Christ.

From the solemn splendor of St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City to thousands of lesser known places of worship in many lands, choirs will sing and people will gather to hear messages of hope for a better world.

Along with millions of fellow churchgoers of Western Christianity, two million Greek Orthodox worshippers and five million others from Eastern Orthodox churches will celebrate Easter Sunday, Not until 1974 will both Eastern and Western churches observe the holiday again on the same day.

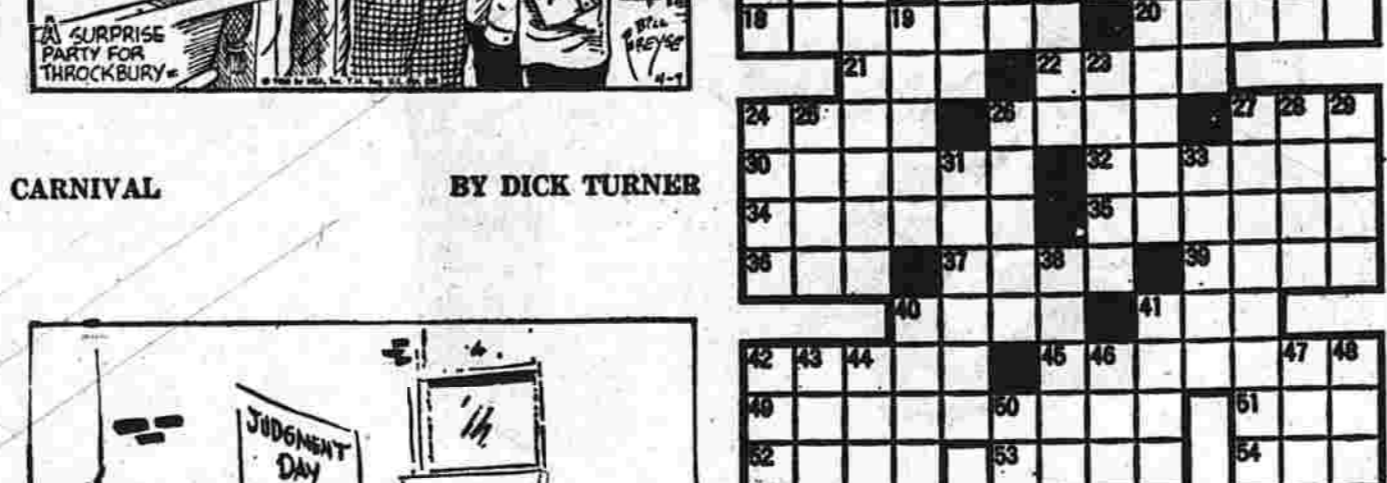

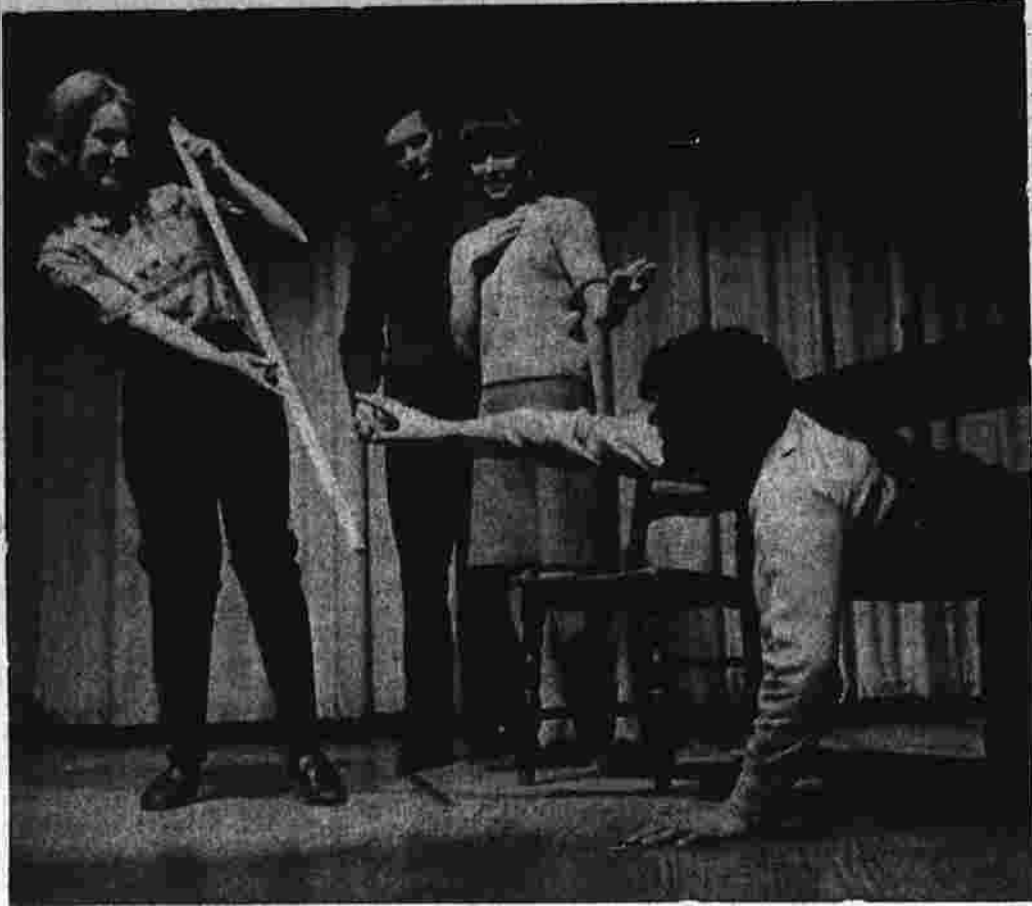

Vote Districts, Fund Subject of Hearings

Public hearings will be conducted Tuesday night on two proposed ordinances, one to increase the town's voting districts from the existing five to a recommended seven, the other to establish a Survivors' Benefit Fund for town firemen.

The hearings will be held in the Municipal Building Hearing Room, at the board of directors' 8 p.m. meeting. The voting-district ordinance has the backing of the Republican and Democratic Town Committees and, if approved, will provide for three State Assembly Districts and seven voting districts, to be used for the October town elections and the November state elections.

The other ordinance, creating a Survivors' Benefit Fund, would approve town contributions totaling about \$17,000 annually, based on five per cent of the firemen's salaries. The men themselves would contribute one per cent of their salaries.

In other business Tuesday night, the board will consider: 1. The acceptance of a quitclaim deed from James McCarthy and William Peck for a two-lot parcel at Lawton and Weaver Rds. — the site for a proposed Manchester Green Firehouse.

2. Authorizing the general manager to sign an agreement with the Metropolitan District for water and sewer services on W. Middle Tpke., opposite Wickham Park.

The Brandeis Corp. of Hartford, on Monday night, will ask the Town Planning Commission (TPC) for a special permit for the construction of 314 units in 10 buildings on the south side of W. Middle Tpke., between a par-three golf course on the west and the Wilbur Cross Parkway on the east.

The corporation will be required to sign an agreement, freeing the town of all water and sewer costs, now and forever. Authorizing the general manager to sign agreements with Case Bros. and with Mrs. Shirley Thrall, in connection with reconstruction of and improvements to Glen Rd. sanitary sewer installations.

The TPC, on Monday night, will be asked to approve the proposal, which includes a transfer to the town of a 40-foot right-of-way on Glen Rd. The town would then widen and improve Glen Rd., from Spring St. to a point approximately 600 feet north. The right-of-way would extend from Spring St. to Highland St.

The town sewer department would spend about \$700 for sewer main enlargement (from 8 inch to 10 inch), and road improvements would be completed by town highway crews. All other costs would be borne, mainly, by Case Bros.

4. The adoption of a resolution for Case Mt. acquisition, authorizing the manager to file an application with the state under the federal Open-Space Program. Approval of the application would permit the town to go ahead with preliminary appraisal and survey plans.

5. Action on a request from the Manchester Community College for an access right-of-way from S. Main St. to the college's Nike site campus. The proposed road would skirt the Manchester Country Club's golf course and would not effect the playing area.

6. Approval for the renewal of the fee schedule for the Manchester Country Club, as set on Feb. 9, 1965.

7. The adoption of a resolution, establishing a 9-member Action Commission for Senior Citizens. The proposed commission would supervise the activities of the Senior Citizens' Center, would clarify the needs and services for all of Manchester's senior citizens, and would check into the possible state and federal funds, available for local activities.

The new agency would either replace or would work with the agencies which are now involved in senior citizen activities—the rec and park department, the rec and park advisory board, the Human Relations Commission, and the Economic Opportunity Councils.

Builder Asks Zoning Unit For Variance

An East Hartford builder, Vincent J. Edgar, who is constructing home in the Ferguson Rd. area, has requested the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) to grant him a variance to maintain one of the dwellings, almost completed, closer to the sidelines than regulations permit.

His request, and four others, will be up for public hearings when the ZBA meets on April 18 at 8 p.m. in the Municipal Building Hearing Room.

Edgar, in his application, states that the dwelling, on the west side of Ferguson Rd. and in Residence Zone AA, has one corner which is nine feet seven inches from the sideline. Regulations require that the building must be 15 feet from the sideline.

He admits his error and states that the measurements are correct for the dwellings he is constructing on adjoining lots.

The other requests to be heard are: 1. From George and Shirley Converse, a variance to divide a parcel of land at 52 Wadsworth St., in Residence Zone B, into two lots, for the purpose of constructing a two-family dwelling on one. Both lots, if split, would have less area than required by regulations.

The lot now measures 120 feet frontage by 140 feet depth. If split, one lot, with an existing building on it, would measure 85 by 140 feet. The other lot, to measure 55 by 140 feet, would be the site for the proposed two-family dwelling.

2. From Walter Cepik, a variance to convert a two-family dwelling into three-family at 80-82 Garden St., in Residence Zone B, plus a variance to construct an outside stairway on the corner lot building.

The proposed construction would be on a lot which would have less area than regulations require: 3. From Anthony Botticello, a variance to erect a breezeway and garage at 595 Hilltown Rd., in Rural Residence Zone, which would be closer to the sideline than regulations permit.

Botticello proposes to build within 10 feet of the sideline—regulations require a 15-foot sideline: 4. From James M. Rufini, a special exception to have a General Repairer's License and a Certificate of Approval at his service station at 116-118 Center St., in Business Zone II. In addition, he is seeking a variance which would permit him to replace an existing sign which is closer to the street line than regulations permit.

In May of 1956 the ZBA approved the construction of the station at that location, and in February of 1957 it granted a special exception for a limited repairer's license. Last September, it approved a variance for the construction of an additional bay.

The fees, in the same order, are now \$2, \$3, \$3.50, and \$3.50. Monahan, in recommending the new schedule, said that it is in line with those of neighboring towns.

Time Governs Fate Of TV Plot Heroes

NEW YORK (AP) — Jim West was dangling by handcuffs over a boiling pit of acid and his pal Artemus Gordon was taking on a veritable army of villains in an effort to save him.

A dinner guest, watching "The Wild, Wild West" while embroidering a needlepoint chairseat, peered over her glasses and inquired calmly, "What time is it?"

"Twenty after eight by my watch," your reporter replied. "Well," she said, "they'll be working pretty fast now to get

him out of this mess before the last commercial."

This was the casual comment of an ordinary, average television viewer — the kind included in all Nielsen rating samples. And her reaction gives a pretty clear indication of the sophistication of viewers who have been exposed, night after night, to entertainment written by formula and the clock.

Just as everybody knows there will be either one big shoot-out or one big fist-fight to climax every western, everybody — well, almost everybody — can predict the action and even the lines around a dozen or so stock situations which, by some unwritten law of television, crop up in every action series.

"Honey West," on ABC, will be coming up soon with an episode about a suicide-bent man on the ledge of a building. My friend with the needlepoint knows that plot very well. Honey, the fearless lady private eye with the high style clothes, will ultimately climb out on the ledge. We will be treated to frequent dizzy-making shots of the street and traffic far below. Ultimately the distraught character will climb in whimpering or be hauled to safety.

Of course there are many variations of the mad-bomber plot with the hero frantically working on the deadly device within seconds of explosion time. There is the serviceable "hostage" ploy with the unshaven bad guys — one is usually wounded — holding an innocent family at gunpoint as minions of the law surround the house with tear gas and bull-horns.

With this obvious shortage of basic situations that can be built into rigid time periods, television's continuing attraction obviously must come from other quarters — good writing with some novel twists in the plot's path, better than average acting and interesting production.

Busy Backus Sings Praise For 'Island'

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Wry on the rocks Jim Backus could scarcely be doing better this season. The evidence:

1. On Easter night he heads up a CBS color special, "Marineland Carnival," also starring Chad and Jeremy and 76 per cent of the Beverly Hillsbilles—Irene Ryan, Max Baer, Donna Douglas.

2. During the summer he will host a CBS variety series, "Continental Showcase," featuring top European acts in the Jackie Gleason time period.

3. He is beginning his third year as Thurston Howell III in the outrageously successful "Gilligan's Island."

4. He continues to bumble through various mediums as the myopic Mr. Magoo.

All this is very gratifying to Backus. Especially the money.

"It's nice to know that I am building up an annuity at long last," he reflected. "I figure 'Gilligan's' can go another two or three years, and then I'll be set for life.

Cobb Will Portray Loman Role Again

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Willy Loman, classic symbol of the futile search for success, will be reloading his sample cases on television next.

Willy is the leading figure of Arthur Miller's "Death of a Salesman." In presenting the play May 8, CBS performs the novelty of featuring the actor who created the role: Lee J. Cobb.

That was something Hollywood never thought of. Fredric March played Willy in the movie version.

"Naturally I was disappointed when I wasn't offered the movie," says Cobb. "But when I saw the film, I considered myself lucky. It looked as if it had been made by the enemy."

Cobb was among friends when he performed Willy at CBS Television City this spring. Opposite him was his original costar Mildred Dunnock, and it was the first time they had done the play in 17 years.

"I didn't need makeup this time," the actor commented ruefully. "Before, I had to deepen the facial lines and hide the baby fat."

"Death of a Salesman" may represent a turning point in American television, as it was indeed a milestone in American drama. The idea of CBS, the fun-and-games network, putting on a serious play in prime time is remarkable.

Cobb assured that "Salesman" was made with few compromises.

"I was impressed by the serious attack that the creative people took toward the play," said

the actor. "Cuts had to be made to fit into the two-hour span. But the sense and impact of the drama wasn't hurt. They kept the spirit of the original."

He admitted that he had hoped to play Willy again, but wasn't sure he would.

"There have been a few offers over the years, but I didn't want merely to tour the country with the play," said Cobb. "I thought I should wait until enough time had elapsed to allow a fresh attitude toward the play."

The versatility of Lee J. Cobb is demonstrated by the fact that he can swing with ease from Willy Loman to a stock television Western to a campy spy farce. During the past four years he has been the dramatic mainstay of "The Virginian." But his life on the range appears to be ending.

Cobb's plans include a sequel to "Our Man Flint," in which he played the apoplectic chief of the far-out secret agent, James Coburn.
