### Vernon School Board, Town Debate Haste in Budget Transfers

The town board of education voted last night to delay action on a request from Jay M. Ellinger, the town's director of administration, that it transfer funds within the school budget to compensate for shortages in some accounts.

Dr. Raymond E. Ramsdell, superintendent of schools, noted that although some accounts are in the red, it has been customary to wait until later in the fiscal year to make the transfers.

Mayor Thomas J. McCusker said the board should not request that the town's budget be amended until the town's fiscal year is closed.

Dr. Ramsdell reported that the board had approved a motion to ask Ellinger to wait until the end of the school year for the changes.

"We don't go into their (the town's) budget," quipped Arthur Callahan.

Dr. Ramsdell noted, however, that it doesn't matter if the town transfers are made.

The board approved a motion to ask Ellinger to wait until the end of the school year for the changes.

When Town Treasurer Robert Denting brought the situation to his attention, he said he asked Ellinger to contact Dr. Ramsdell and ask that the funds be transferred within the board's account.

"I am not interfering in the functions of the board of education, nor its administration. I simply want to run the town in a businesslike way," McCusker says.

### Viet Political Mess Frustrates Americans

WASHINGTON (AP) — Frustrated American officials see little they can do about the political violence in South Viet Nam except to ride out the storm and hope for the best.

Monday the Defense Department confirmed reports from Saigon of what was called a temporary decline in bombing operations against the Viet Cong.

Other informants reported more generally that the political unrest was beginning to limit ground military operations.

The objective of the military pressure is to break the Viet Cong will to fight by convincing the leaders and the rank and file that they cannot possibly win.

U.S. policy on the political crisis is defined as one of giving advice but not trying to dictate or impose a solution.

Officials here apparently would like to see temporary continuation of the present military directorate whether or not that included Premier Nguyen Cao Ky.

Until Monday, top U.S. officials were reporting that the American people and government eventually will tire of the conflict and its political ramifications.

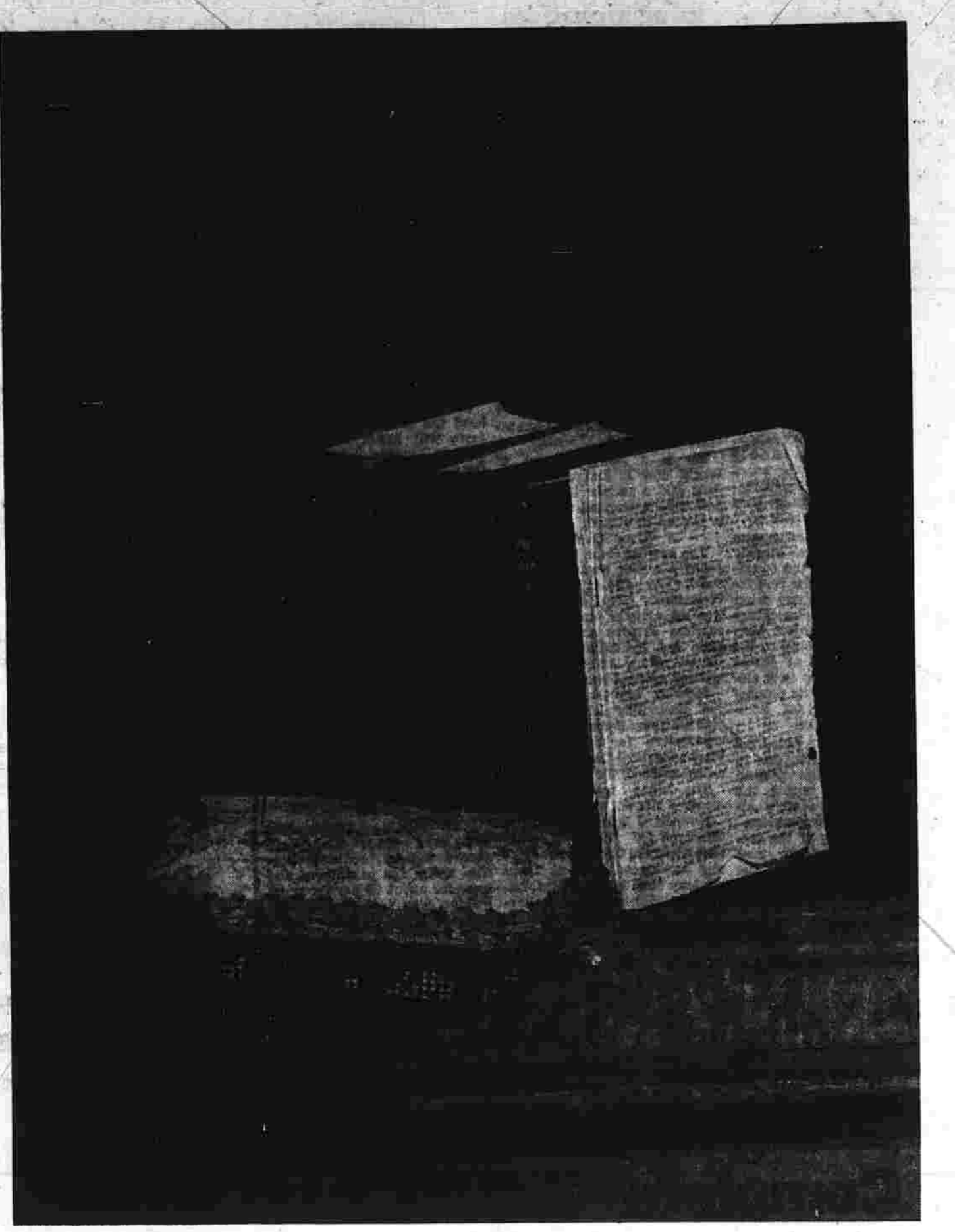
