# Manchester: Past Places, People

Notes: The following memoir was written and tape-recorded for the unit on Manchester history in the elementary schools by Miss Ann McGee, a Manchester native and a former teacher of English in the local secondary school.

"In Father's house there were many mansions." Father's many mansions were furnished in the first eighteen years of the 1900's in Manchester, Conn. Father's children were the fortunate heirs to whom the mansions were bequeathed. The inheritance was lacking in monetary value but it seemed with some value as its counterpart must have existed in numerous other communities of the United States.

**Chestnut Season**

An autumn Saturday afternoon found Father and the children tramping through the woods, each carrying a stout stick. Father leads the way, with the children following with the sticks in search of the fallen chestnuts. After several hours of exciting adventure, an adequate supply of the sweet treasures had been placed in father's basket.

At home, mother supervised the roasting on top of the coal stove, a technique that required skillful attention. (At chestnut time in Manchester, many children were at the North Manchester Railroad Station to await the arrival of the chestnut train and to view its unloading.) Unfortunately, the chestnut tree might end this family sport.

**Cross Day**

The pre-dawn expedition on Circus Day in Manchester was a yearly highlight. About 8 a.m., father waked the children and the hurry and excitement of rapid dressing and breakfast filled the home. By 4, almost every father and his sleepy children were at the North Manchester Railroad Station to await the arrival of the circus train and to view its unloading.

Elephants with swinging trunks, dancing bears, more white horses, caged wild animals and the gay calliope were a few of the attractions which lent a special magic to the early morning atmosphere. School youngsters knew this was the beginning of a glorious day. At 10, they would be released from school to the Manchester's Main St. (under the supervision of their teachers) to see the circus parade.

**Christmas**

Fortunate were the children whose father knew the owner of a woodland, as it was illegal to cut a Christmas tree without the owner's permission. Father, pulling the sled, and the children tramped through the snow searching for the perfect tree. After careful consideration of shape, height, and kind, the decision was made and father's sled began the chopping process. The tree was roped to the sled and the merry group trudged home.

Everyone in the family helped with the decorations. Corn was dropped and strung on long, thin strings to make graceful festoons; little fingerbread boys were baked and frosted for their perches on the tree's branches; the unsized, fragile balls of the previous Christmas season were carefully unwrapped and arranged on the tree; the filmy Christmas night gowns were clipped to the branches and the little red candles were placed securely in their holders. Father was the custodian of the candles. He was made by father the day before in a hand-operated ice cream freezer. It was a joy to watch father push the rock and see from the container, carefully lift the ice cream, remove the agitator, and expose the luscious delight within. The ice cream that clung to the blades of the agitator tasted better than the compact ice cream itself.

**May Basket**

Long before May Day, baskets were constructed ready for the final touch. The day before May Day, big brother and sister guided the little ones along brooks to gather the early spring flowers needed to enhance the beauty of the colorful baskets. On this day, mother and children produced some made candy delights: fudge, peanut, and molasses goodness. Big brother was the official molasses candy manufacturer. His battered hands and muscular arms were needed to convert the liquid gold to hard, brittle ropes. Flowers and candy were finally needed in the dainty baskets. Early in the evening of May Day, the box of delivery bags, stowable, as the child crept to a friend's door, pushed the bell, and dashed away leaving the precious May basket on the veranda. The recipient gave chase, caught the sender, and said "Thank you, Miss."

# Tide Turns for U.S. In Battle for Trade

NEW YORK (AP)—The battle for trade has turned in the United States favor for the first time this year but the war is far from won.

At stake in the struggle to boost exports still higher are the good name of the American dollar, the supplying of sufficient funds to lubricate world trade in general, and even the degree of inflation on the home front.

In January and February, exports were soaring ahead faster than imports were gaining. Now the Commerce Department has good news—even if it proves to be only a temporary respite.

In March this country exported 9 per cent more dollars worth of goods and services than it imported, a gain of \$2,194,400,000, exports topped imports by \$217.1 million.

The gap between exports and imports will have to be much more than that, if the drain of dollars overseas is to be stemmed. That is because the U.S. favorable balance of trade for several years now has been too small to offset all the other forms of dollar outflow. These include foreign aid, military spending, U.S. military outlays abroad, and private investment in foreign securities, loans and business expansion.

Results of this long-standing deficit in the total balance of payments have been less loss of U.S. gold reserves as other nations turn in their own exports, but so far unsuccessful—runs were the largest ever.

# Iron Curtain Smuggling Becomes Profitable Work

VIENNA (AP) — Smuggling across the Iron Curtain has become a profitable business — boosted by the scarcity of consumer goods in Communist Eastern Europe and the appeal of Western products.

The great tourist stream that treads eastward each summer, on holiday or weekend, gives smugglers a chance of trying to slip across the Iron Curtain under the noses of customs officials.

Nearly four million cars entered Yugoslavia last year and Czechoslovakia border checks are fixed a dozen times under the dashboard; filled the space around the engine with watches and built a special compartment under the floor for lighters and ballpoint pens.

A typical case of modern smuggling was told by a Czechoslovak customs official, Frantisek Mikulak of the Mikulov checkpoint.

"One day last August I had to take care of a long line of cars with weekend tourists" and Austrians visiting their relatives in Czechoslovakia," he said.

"I checked a Vienna driver in an American-made car who was making his 28th trip to Czechoslovakia. I took a closer look at his car and noticed that the space behind the rear seat was rather large.

"While I bent over for a close examination, the driver smoked more and more nervously."

"I called a mechanic who unscrewed the wall behind the rear seat and pulled out 100 mg. iron coats that had been neatly stacked in his secret compartment."

Another smuggler passed the Mikulov checkpoint 4 times in nine months, shuttling back and forth with foodstuffs, watches, radios, transistor radios and leather jackets for Czechoslovakia and Czechoslovak carcases and antiques for Austria.

The had organized 15 young people into a group. Each had a specific task — purchasing, transport, storage and distribution.

A Vienna chauffeur stuffed the seats of his car with money, fixed a dozen radios under the dashboard; filled the space around the engine with watches and built a special compartment under the floor for lighters and ballpoint pens.

A young student tried to enter Czechoslovakia on a bicycle and a rucksack with 500 pairs of women's stockings.

The same goods that appeal to Czechoslovakia pay off on the Hungarian black market. Numerous tourists have been sentenced by Hungarian courts for smuggling radios, watches, and other goods.

Smugglers who get caught face prison terms of several years, fines equal to the duties they would have had to pay for contraband goods, and confiscation of goods they were caught with and the car they transported them in. If they are foreigners they are expelled from the country after having completed their prison sentence.

# Refugees from Tibet 'Making Do' in India

DARJEELING, India (AP)—Established by some Tibetans in Darjeeling, mountain sides, Tibetan refugees have a significant view of their homeland trailing away to the far northern horizon. All they can do is look.

The Chinese Communists are firmly in control of Tibet. The Tibetans who escaped the Red seven years ago have little prospect of going home again.

Of the estimated 50,000 Tibetans in India, about 6,000 are scattered over the hill farms and tea plantations of Darjeeling District.

Their problem is how to stay alive in a foreign country — and with typical mountain industriousness, the Tibetans are getting on with the job.

Farm cooperatives have been established by some. Others have jobs on road construction projects or tea plantations. But the real success story is the "self-help center."

Six refugees started the center in a dilapidated cowshed on four acres of abandoned land. Now 500 workers make the export Tibetan handicrafts, especially carpets, to 16 foreign countries.

Total sales run about \$30,000 annually — not bad for these mountain people who fled Tibet with nothing more than the few personal possessions they could carry.

Most of the center's sales are in the United States, Germany, West Germany, Denmark, Switzerland and Japan.

The center, established with more than 6,000 Tibetan refugees are being educated in English-language schools that, while maintaining a Tibetan flavor, also prepare their graduates for Indian technical schools and universities.

Self-help is the rule at schools, too. Youngsters work in vegetable gardens and do other odd jobs.

Alert enterprises run through the Tibetan community.

Several refugees who heard Americans like purchased Lhasa Aspoo dogs established a small kennel and now sell small, fluffy puppies overseas for as much as \$100 a dog.

Aside from Indian government aid, the Tibetans are being helped toward their goal of self-sufficiency by the American Emergency Committee for Tibetans Refugees and the YMCA.

Americans established a 15-bed hospital with three doctors and four nurses.

Schools have been set up for Tibetan children, many of whom lost their parents in the 1959 Tibetan uprising against Chinese rule.

The Tibetans are being helped toward their goal of self-sufficiency by the American Emergency Committee for Tibetans Refugees and the YMCA.

The great tourist stream that treads eastward each summer, on holiday or weekend, gives smugglers a chance of trying to slip across the Iron Curtain under the noses of customs officials.

Nearly four million cars entered Yugoslavia last year and Czechoslovakia border checks are fixed a dozen times under the dashboard; filled the space around the engine with watches and built a special compartment under the floor for lighters and ballpoint pens.

A typical case of modern smuggling was told by a Czechoslovak customs official, Frantisek Mikulak of the Mikulov checkpoint.

"One day last August I had to take care of a long line of cars with weekend tourists" and Austrians visiting their relatives in Czechoslovakia," he said.

"I checked a Vienna driver in an American-made car who was making his 28th trip to Czechoslovakia. I took a closer look at his car and noticed that the space behind the rear seat was rather large.

"While I bent over for a close examination, the driver smoked more and more nervously."

"I called a mechanic who unscrewed the wall behind the rear seat and pulled out 100 mg. iron coats that had been neatly stacked in his secret compartment."

Another smuggler passed the Mikulov checkpoint 4 times in nine months, shuttling back and forth with foodstuffs, watches, radios, transistor radios and leather jackets for Czechoslovakia and Czechoslovak carcases and antiques for Austria.

The had organized 15 young people into a group. Each had a specific task — purchasing, transport, storage and distribution.

A Vienna chauffeur stuffed the seats of his car with money, fixed a dozen radios under the dashboard; filled the space around the engine with watches and built a special compartment under the floor for lighters and ballpoint pens.

The same goods that appeal to Czechoslovakia pay off on the Hungarian black market. Numerous tourists have been sentenced by Hungarian courts for smuggling radios, watches, and other goods.

Smugglers who get caught face prison terms of several years, fines equal to the duties they would have had to pay for contraband goods, and confiscation of goods they were caught with and the car they transported them in. If they are foreigners they are expelled from the country after having completed their prison sentence.

And when, under the inevitable, the impossible choices set up at one level are not taken, our only recourse seems to be to make the next set of choices even more difficult for much higher stakes.

It would all be devastatingly simple if only the other fellow would give up. But nobody is willing to be that other fellow, the one who gives up.

### Soviet Trained Pilots Believed Flying MIGs

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—  
American airmen in  
Saigon believe that MIG  
jets they are encountering over  
North Viet Nam are flown by

Many school boards in the South which voluntarily desegregated have been claiming foul over the new Office of Education rules for compliance with the Civil Rights Act.

The hours say that even though they agreed to lift metal barriers, the regulations make it tougher for them than for other boards which were forced by court order to desegregate.

Although the Supreme Court's historic school desegregation ruling came more than 14 years ago, fewer than one per cent of the Negro pupils in Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana attended classes with whites, the Southern Education Reporting Service said early this year.

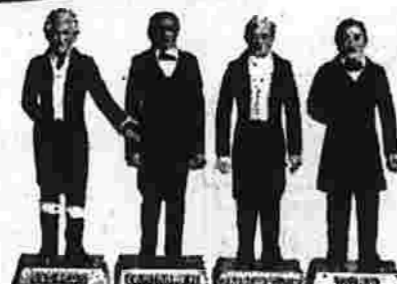

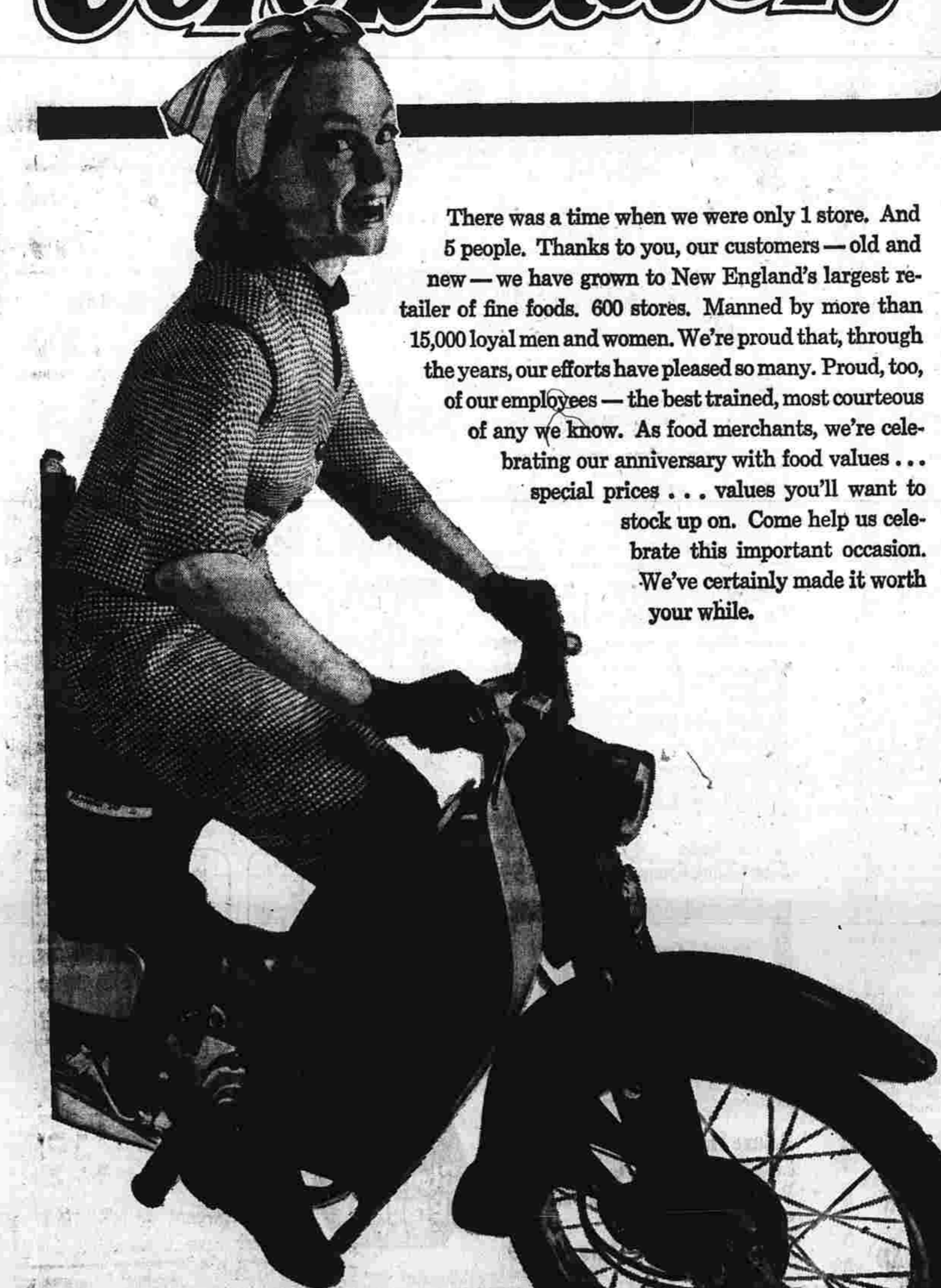

### Vernon Engineering Budget Is Opposed, Police Request Pared \$14,362

Proposals to create a police detective bureau and a town engineering department were discussed last night by the board of representatives.

The discussion, second in a series of meetings, was held by the representatives to consider Mayor Thomas J. McCusker's proposed budget for the coming fiscal year.

Although time did not permit a discussion of the pay raises for the department heads, Mayor McCusker said he will propose "several changes in the budget, especially in salaries and other areas."

Town employees, including police, school teachers, and public works workers, are in unions. Only department heads and a smattering of secretaries do not have contracts for salaries.

Police Chief George Trapp asked for three new patrolmen and the appointment of a sergeant.

"We are getting tied up and need more for investigations," Trapp said.

His department is asking for a budget of \$221,817 for the current year, a \$12,000 increase over last year.

Included in the budget request is an appropriation for six new patrolmen to be used by the department.

McCusker noted that last year the police committee urged that cruisers be replaced every year.

Trapp said that the cars drive an average of 50,000 miles per year. A \$2500 investment will cost policemen and visitors to the Public Safety Building to get a car of similar value. The town would purchase a water cooler.

The budget provides for a \$1000 pay raise for Chief Trapp, and a \$1250 pay raise for Deputy Chief Edmund F. Dwyer.

Other items in the police budget are \$5788 for gasoline maintenance, \$1200 for postage for parking tickets mailed collect to the police department.

A \$4000 increase in the budget for four crossing guards is for the hiring and equipping of four new guards, caused by the opening of the Vernon Center Junior High and the renting of additional classrooms around town because of a classroom shortage. Guards are paid \$8 a day, and must be provided with uniforms, raincoats and supplies.

Mayor McCusker noted that an increase in salaries for Civil Technicians would save the town money.

He reported that if salaries for the department head \$1000 or more, 50 per cent of the costs are reimbursed from federal funds.

Therefore, he raised the salary of civil defense director Edmund F. Dwyer from \$500 to \$1300 for the coming year. The deputy CD director \$700 to \$1000. Police Lt. Emilio Felio, the deputy director, does not now receive a salary for his efforts.

Dwyer noted that Pelligrini is in charge of the 12 fallout shelters around town, has allocated \$31,222 for maintenance of the shelters during the past two years, and will conduct instructional courses for 12 fallout shelter managers.

Pelligrini, Dwyer said, is presently attending a CE course in Manchester on his off-duty time.

The town's traffic authority is requesting a budget jump from \$1000 to \$5389, but most of the increase is a paper transfer.

The major costs are for repairs to parking meters and paint, supplies and traffic signs, formerly listed under the public works department budget.

Proposed is the purchase of 800 gallons of paint for lines on

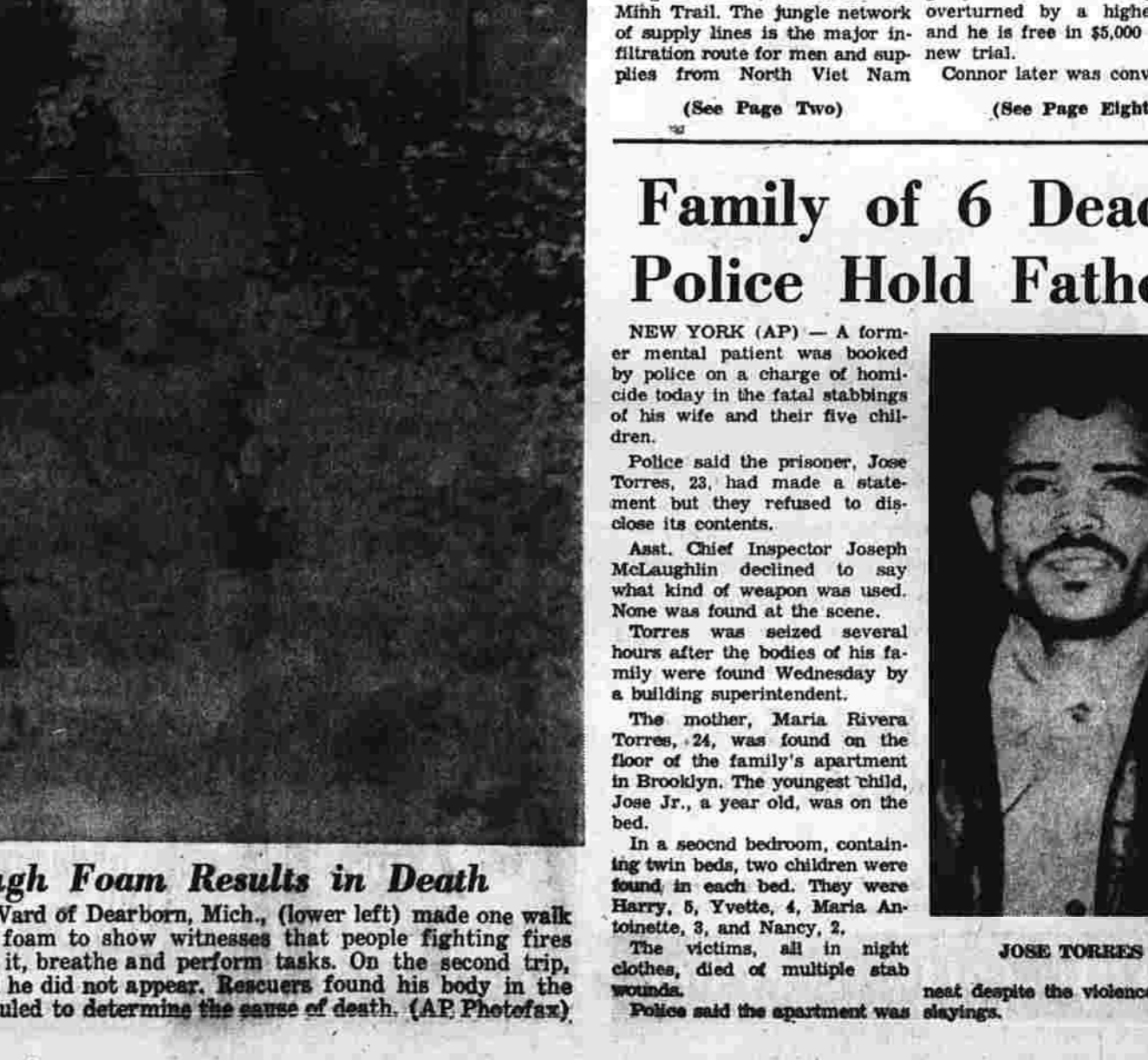
