Tied in Viet Nam Phone Calls to Home Require Much Patience

SAIGON, Viet Nam (VNA)— The first color of dawn was still an hour away as the aged-voiced Gle began stuffing himself into the cramped United States Army call center. "Are you all calling the States?" a drowsy clerk asked. "We are," the group chorused. "Fill out these forms, please." "They, but," a soldier asked, "how long does it take to get through?" "One to four hours." "That long... for a phone call?" "At least..." "I must have heard, not Mars." The men chuckled, filled in the forms and registered themselves on their rear. Flitting home, they knew, like every-thing else here, would require the woe of waiting. The men had arrived at 6 a.m. to be first in line. They were greeted by those who opened at 7, the operators opening up at 7:30 and the first busy signal rang out at 8:15. "We have only two lines open," the clerk said. "Everybody called a lemon. If weather in bed, calls are canceled." Everybody wrinkled a nose. "If you do get through, you may be out of it."



The boys begin waiting at 5 a.m. Sometimes, they don't get wrong numbers or busy signals. He paused breathlessly for a moment, the cracking, barely audible answer. "What happened?" "She said she's a Deer John yesterday." "Tough. Sure glad my gal ain't like that." "She ain't!" "Now, who kissed me off before 2 even left the States." At 8 a.m. Saigon, it was 12 hours earlier in New York. It was 7 p.m. in Chicago, 6 in Salt Lake City and work days end in San Francisco. Conversation in the waiting room was sporadic. Bursts of giggles and then silence. Columbia and Pica mingled as one, "ugh!" he gulped. "Whattya mean, Al who?" It was the morning's first wrong number. Not for Spiritual Gain British Thieves Going to Church

LONDON (AP)— In England, too many thieves are going to church. The trouble is they're going for material gain, not spiritual. Within the last 12 months 1,500 churches have been robbed. A silver water box used for districts, most of them old and highly valuable. Sometimes the thieves—petty ones—just raid the poor boxes. In other cases, churches worth \$14,000 have been stolen. Lead is a favorite loot. Great chunks of it have been ripped from roofs. In the black market, lead brings fancy prices. One church lost its gate. Another's bells were stolen. Nothing is sacred. The altars, with their beautiful crosses, some centuries old, are often targeted. The favorites are Anglican and Roman Catholic churches, for they are older and their trappings more ornate. Many small parish churches in England possess treasures that would cost thousands of dollars to replace. Yet the doors are nearly always open. Those in charge of the churches do not want to hide their treasures. They want the members of the congregation to see them and enjoy them. Yet, this is getting very costly. Churches near main roads are being vandalized more than those on country lanes. Police say this.

Viet Nam Desertions High on Both Sides

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)— A lot of soldiers on both sides are deserting in Viet Nam. Desertions from the Communist Viet Cong are running more than 2,800 a month, American officials report. Against this, the officials say desertions from the South Vietnamese regular army run currently at 6,600 a month, with additional desertions from the regional and popular forces. These figures must be considered in proportion. The government military strength is estimated at 600,000, including auxiliary units. The Viet Cong guerrillas, plus North Vietnamese regulars and village auxiliaries, are estimated to total 200,000 to 250,000. Most deserters from the South Vietnamese army do not go over to the Viet Cong. Instead they return to their homes, go into hiding or filter into the cities looking for work. Some re-enlist later. **Hidden Value**

Drug Case Witness Admits Cooperation with Police

HARTFORD (AP)— Joseph M. Caron, the government's star witness in the narcotics case against a Milford haberdasher, has admitted to cooperating closely with federal and state investigators in Connecticut. Defense Atty. Percy Foreman, who said he will prove the government purchased testimony for \$5,000, cross-examined Caron Thursday in U.S. District Court concerning his motives for assisting in investigations shortly after his arrest. Caron was apprehended at the Mexican border several months before James J. Miller was charged with taking part in an international narcotics smuggling ring. Caron admitted that in agreeing to plead guilty to the heroin charge, for which he received a 10 year term, he also agreed to cooperate with authorities. The 36-year-old Canadian, under cross-examination by Foreman, told of a trip to Bridgeport about four months after his arrest in November, 1963. Caron said he was transported around the Bridgeport area in a station wagon which contained cameras and photographic equipment. **Area Weather**
WINDSOR LOCKS (AP)— Sunny skies and mild temperatures are in store for Connecticut today. The U.S. Weather Bureau says that cloud cover and a light southerly breeze helped restrain the usual drop in temperatures during the night. The approach of a weak, and for the most part dry, cold front caused a few sprinkles. The return to cool weather after the cold front passage today will be slow. As a result, temperatures should rise to higher levels than Tuesday and should get into the 70s with relative ease. The day's heating will add to the instability of the air mass over Connecticut, providing a small threat of afternoon showers or thundershowers. By tonight, cooler air will have penetrated southern New England but brisk northwesterly winds will prevent minimum temperatures from reaching their potential. Saturday will be cooler than today but close to the seasonal normal. **Five-day Forecast**
Temperatures in Connecticut Saturday through Wednesday are expected to average below normal, with cool weather at the beginning of the period, milder the early part of next week, then cooler again toward midweek. Some normal nights and lows are Hartford 70 and 45, Bridgeport 66 and 47, and New Haven 64 and 46. Precipitation may total 1/4 inch or less, occurring late Monday and Tuesday. **PLANT HART'S SEEDS**

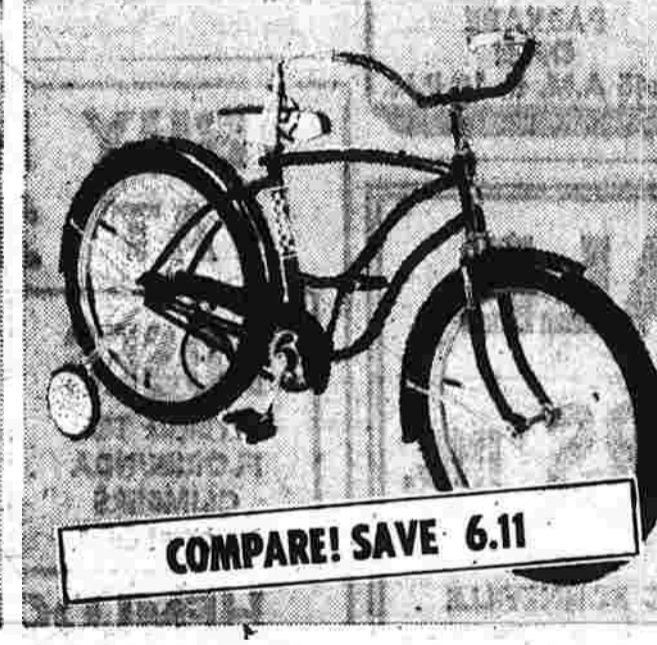

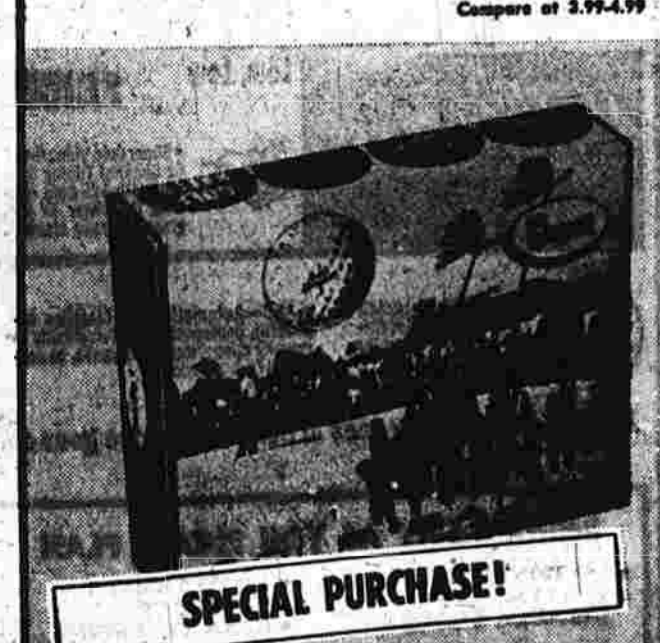

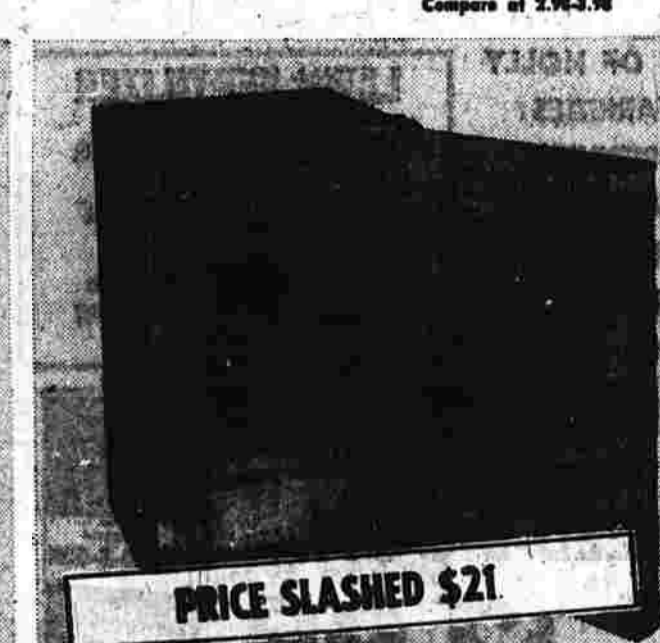

of the kind which has a chance of keeping South Vietnam in existence as something to fight for.

This same law, whatever it is to be called eventually, may now be operating on the other side of the struggle, according to some ideas of American intelligence officers in South Vietnam.

What they are beginning to hear is a reason among the South Vietnamese for the Vietcong guerrillas who still represent the main strength in the field in South Vietnam—a reaction against conditions created by the infiltration of regular North Vietnamese troops which has increased so much during the year we have been bombing North Vietnam.

Now that the estimated 210,000 guerrillas in the field in South Vietnam are finding themselves assisted by an increasing number of regular troops from North Vietnam—as many as 20,000 are supposed to have come down since the first of this year—it seems that they have begun to resent their allies.

It seems the Northerners act as if they were superior to the South Vietnamese. Intelligence officers are beginning to hope—without quite daring really to hope—it is that the driver of the second truck may not have had a chance of escape, either because he began to feel you have made his cause your own.

Being Shameless Is Not Safety

Analysis and testimony may clarify the circumstances which produced yesterday's fatal crash of trucks on Center Street. But, at the moment, the fact of the accident is that neither of the drivers directly involved had much choice or chance.

Certainly the driver who became the instant fatality could not, unless he were contributing some excessive speed of his own to the situation, be considered to have contributed anything to the accident except his life. He was on his own side of the road. Suddenly, another truck hurtled into his path.

The Inquisitors

You can't even put all the blame on the Federal authorities; they are simply trying to carry out the provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. The Department of Health, Education and Welfare is reportedly engaged in a nationwide inspection of hospitals to see if they are practicing segregation—the more manifestation, if you will, of what can justly be called Government by burdogy.

Law In Search of A Name

Nobody has yet invented the name for the law which is obviously involved and working in the situations we are about to designate, but it belongs, whatever its name is going to be, in the same category as other famous laws, like Gresham's on money, Parkinson's on efficiency, and Newton's on gravity.

What happens under the as yet quite nameless law is this: that the heavier force which is introduced into a situation like that in Vietnam, the weaker the side it joins.

It doesn't go quite so far as to say, this new law, that the way to lose a war is to have too many troops fighting in it.

But it comes close to suggesting something like it, and there happen to be three quite serious illustrations of how this strange law may be operating in Vietnam.

In one illustration the law concerns the American outsiders.

In the second, it concerns the South Vietnamese, in their own terrain.

In the third, it concerns the North Vietnamese, the outsiders from the North.

The law of diminishing returns for American soldiers in Vietnam has read this way: the more troops we have there, the less the South Vietnamese consider they own war and the more they leave the fighting to us. Therefore the more troops we send into Vietnam the greater the danger we run of losing the war, if not in the field, then in the minds of the Vietnamese themselves.

Some theorists have also applied a law of diminishing returns to the size of the South Vietnamese forces in the field to fight the guerrillas and their helpers from the North. The reasoning, this time, goes like this: the more South Vietnamese relatives are put in military uniform, the fewer such are available for civilian, agricultural and political activities.

Adding these three trends, these three possible operations of that new law to the fact that we are now conducting a tactical conclusion that if we send a little more help to our friends in South Vietnam and North Vietnam sends a little more help to the guerrillas in South Vietnam neither of us will have any friends left in South Vietnam.

What shall we call the new law? How shall we state its premises? It will probably wind up being called after McNamara, on the theory that he, by violating it, first led to its discovery.

And it might be called McNamara's law. In helping a friend, never help quite so much he begins to feel you have made his cause your own.

They only slightly resemble their American and British counterparts. Foreign-inspired, yes, but the comparison ends there, say the operators. They are French and aim at the pockets of the middle class, the affluent French middle class.

The growing middle class may have been so successful in a few dollars a week for fun and frivolity. The new Parisians who are entering the scene — those from 10 francs — \$2 — is the average evening food and drink bill at most of them. The girls and gaudes — largely American and Japanese — run generally from \$ to 100 francs.

The formula has been so successful that one promoter, Jean-Louis Bataille, plans to lecture the Americans about the success of his Parisian restaurants. He has just attended a trade convention in Los Angeles soon.

All this is a backlash from World War II days when the typical cafe had a stupefied bar, dull yellow walls and unpolished wood furnishings. German occupation brought blackouts and bottled cabbage.

After the war, the typical cafe went on a victory celebration. They hung mirrors, suspended starburst light fixtures, and covered the furniture with bright plastics.

Then the cafe business started going downhill. Some owners sold out for conversion to shoe stores and such.

Psychiatrist Says Current Teen Dress Only 'Passing Fad'

NEW YORK (AP) — The Beatles will get crowded within the next five years and their queening teenage admirers will swap Army jackets and jeans for dresses, a leading psychiatricer predicted today.

"It's all a passing fad," said Dr. Waldemar G. Eisensberg, of New York's former president of the American Society of Psychoanalytic Physicians.

"I see no deep-rooted behavior in the present fashion against the popularity of the tendency of girls to look like boys and boys to look like girls. It's not psychosis. It's not a biological. It's not neurotic."

The psychiatrist said there were definite contradictions in these patterns.

"For instance, the boy will let his hair grow like a girl's and then opt for a beard, which is very masculine. On the other hand, the girl let her hair fall naturally over her shoulders and put on boy's pants."

"That proved there is nothing very serious about it. It's strictly a revolt against the world started with the parents first, then older teenagers and finally the secretary of defense."

"They share at older people in the street — as if they're enemies — and some burn drift cards. But after a while, girls have their hair cut off again and the boys will start drifting toward the feminine side. Then we will all look back and weep for another wave."

Eisensberg blamed the girls for turning their boy friends into their counterparts.

"Girls, teenagers especially, don't know man types," he said. "They no longer want to be dominated. They want boy companions who are subordinate to them in strength who are called 'drag west.'"

"This naturally appeals to some boys. This is their weapon against the popularity of the muscle-bound athletes. They let their hair grow, they adopt feminine attitudes and the girls swoon."

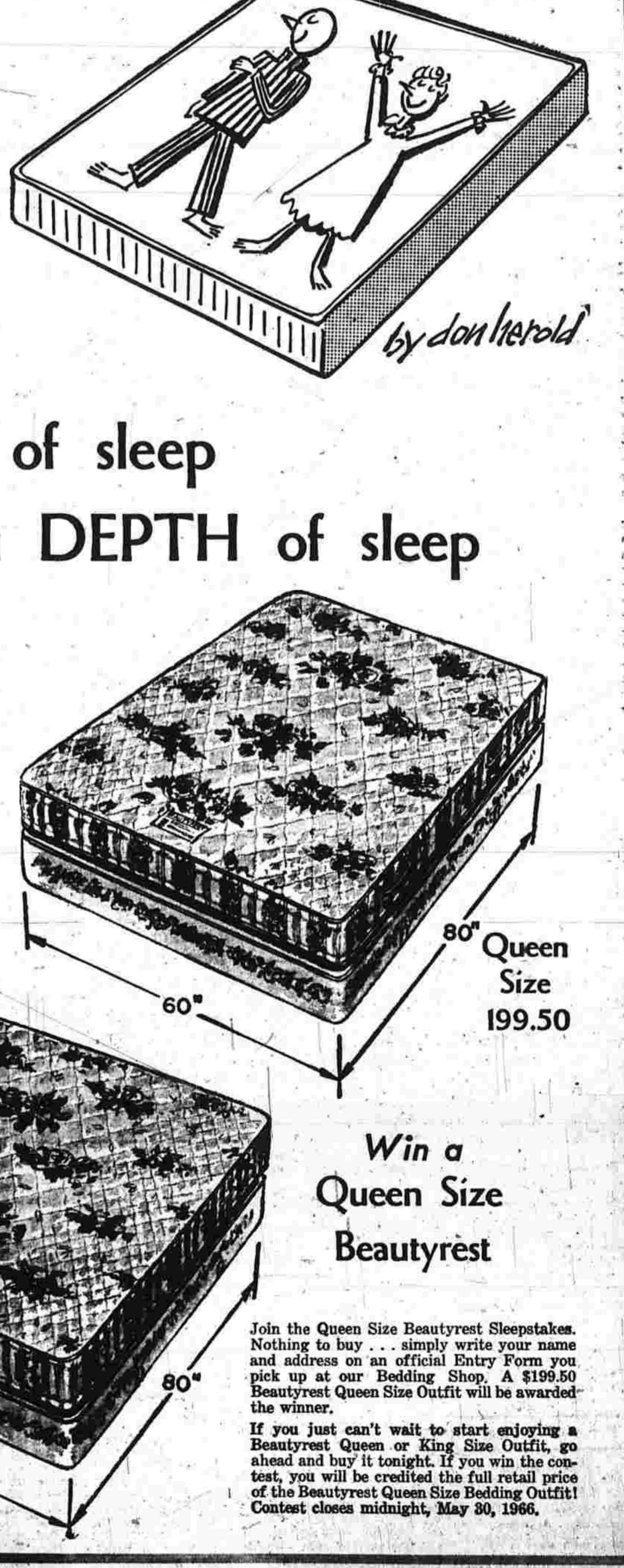



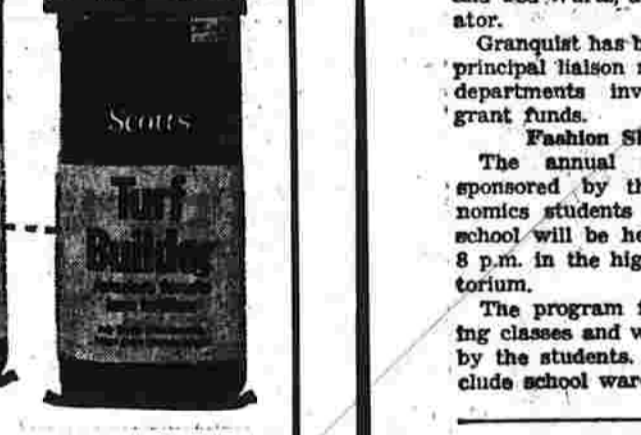

South Windsor Mayor Sees Fund Action After Trip to Washington

Mayor James Throws said last night his meeting in Washington yesterday with federal agencies of Housing and Urban Development and the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, was "most heartening."

The mayor made the trip to discuss some of the roadblocks in the way of the town obtaining funds from the federal government for the proposed sewer system.

The other problem left to overcome, the mayor commented, is the question of a treatment plant to discharge the sewage. Under present interpretation of the legislation, only towns that have a treatment plant are eligible for funds.

Specifically, funds are restricted for sewer lines only. Mayor Throws said, however, that the approval of the agency involved has been received for a "pilot plant" for the town, wherein the sewer lines and treatment plant could be constructed simultaneously.

The two departments involved in granting the aid have proposed that the town having an approved plan for a treatment plant and that the money would be received initially and not disbursed to the town until the contract for the treatment plant and lines are let.

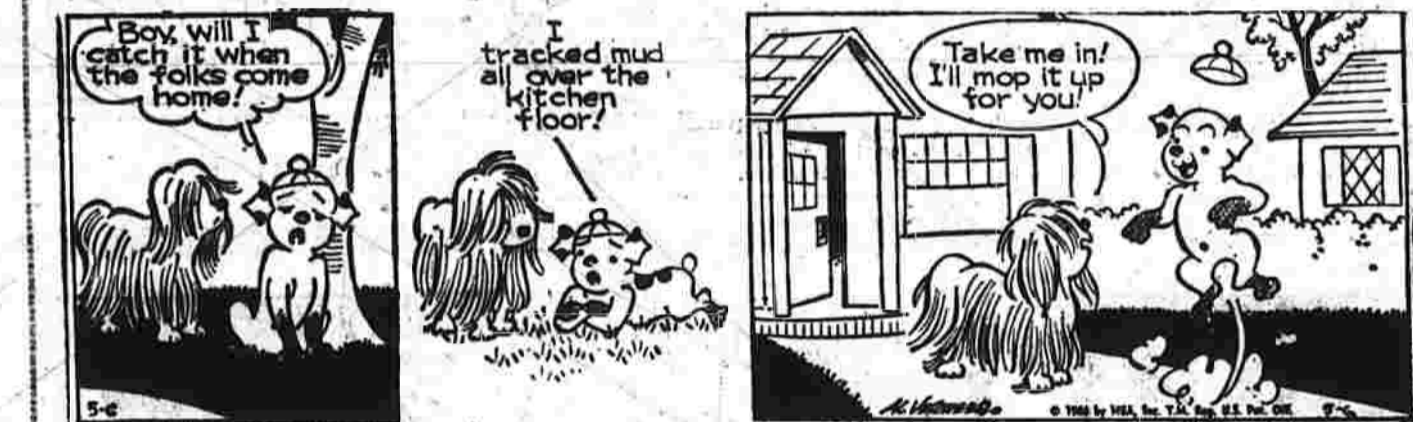

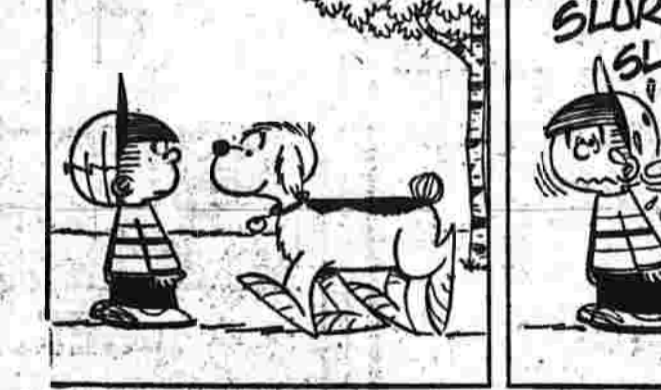

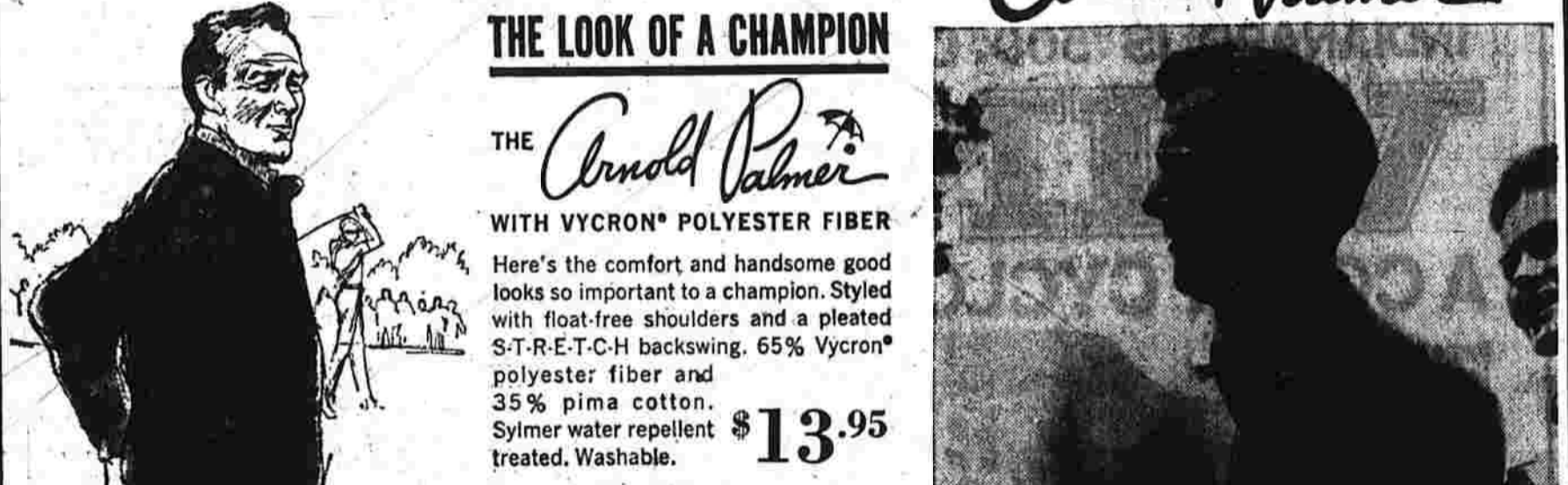
