The second thing Governor Rockefeller said about 1968 was a passage in praise of Governor George Romney of

He expressed his appreciation for the way Governor Romney has taken leadership since 1964 "in developing communition and understanding between progressive elements in our party to the end that as we approach 1968 we avoid the diversity of counsels and the scattering of forces that were so disastrous to us all the last time.

"George Romney's constantly growsture and leadership in Michiga are reflected in a steadily increasing recognition and influence in our party ighout the country." It is only 1966, and the Michigan Gov-

arnor has to accomplish his own reelection this fall, and some new and more compelling Republican Lochinvar may rise out of the West before national conwention time in 1968. But, as of now, it is Governor Romney who is comporting himself in the measured, balanced, gradnally looming larger way which sets him far out ahead of all other possibilities. We think the chances are high that he will be the Republican candidate in 1968, and high, also, that he can be

Spain And Gibraltar

It is indeed a phenomenon to remark rpon that the people and factions of Spain, both under the Franco dictatorship at home and in exile abroad, have found a single cause on which they are

The cause on which they are all united is the cause of the return to Gibraltar to Spanish sovereignty, the end of what they call the "last colony in Eu-

They are united on the idea that Britsin should give up the rock it has held ever since the British and Dutch capfured it from the Spanish in 1704. They are united in scorn for Britain's present day alibi, which is that Britain beleves the 20,000 inhabitants of Gibraltar should have the privilege of selfsetermination—which considering their tradition and nationality, they would be certain to exercise in favor of remainng under British sovereignty.

Just wanting Gibraltar, and being engry with Britain for not giving it up, may possibly be the thing that will give Spain its own national unity again. In he ways the world still seems to cling o in these days, it is conceivable that spain spurred by such a sharp little tanfible issue, might find enough national mity to mount an attack on Gibraltar. some day, and try to take it by force. For this is an issue on which all Spanards, of all persuasions, think Spain is in the moral right.

And it does so happen that the Spanin, on this issue, seem to have all the poral position there is.

About the last time the British had omething of a chance to get on the sear moral side of the issue of Gibralar was during those sometimes visionry days at the end of World War II. when even the doughty Winston surchill, who had sworn not to liquiate the British Empire, and who never id really relinquish, for an instant, the dd and disastrous game of power polics, nevertheless did indulge now and sen in the fanciful contemplation of
