Auto Sales Report Fails to Show Trend

DETROIT (AP)—Ford Motor Co., Chrysler and American Motors reported today their combined mid-May auto sales ran 25 per cent ahead of early May, but five per cent behind the May 11-20 period last year.

General Motors, biggest of the automakers, was due to make its sales report public later. Pending GM's report, it virtually was impossible to say whether the industry had reversed its sales slump of April and early May.

Ward's Automotive Reports, an industry publication, did some sales projections and came up with an estimate that industry sales for the 10 days just ended would run about 243,048, compared with 193,488 cars sold in the opening 10 days of opening 10 days of this month.

Auto industry leaders have said the inventory is just about right for the transitional midsummer period in which auto plants will be closed while the changeover to 1967 model production is made.

Byron Nichols, Dodge Division general manager, predicted that Dodge dealers, who had three record years in a row, would not experience the 1966 boom for both cars and trucks.

DETROIT (AP)—State Education Commissioner William Sanders advocated "some artificial mixing" today as a means of achieving education of equal quality for children of different races and economic groups.

Speaking at the first statewide conference on civil rights in the public schools, Sanders urged school systems to proceed with care but to attempt "as much mixing as practical" as a start.

"It is apparent that political maneuvering is going on in the North — particularly in the South — are at a disadvantage in their new setting."

Many, he said, "are identified with poverty and are crowded into the warrens of the poor, sending their children to overcrowded, rundown schools."

Zeller Pleads Guilty NORWICH (AP)—Former state comptroller Fred R. Zeller, who suffered a lopsided defeat as the Republican gubernatorial candidate in 1958, pleaded guilty today to embezzling from his church.

Information in the charge to which he pleaded guilty was altered. When he was arrested, April 14, the information alleged that Zeller as church treasurer, had embezzled \$26,878 from the First Baptist Church of Stonington between Dec. 3, 1963 to Sept. 8, 1964.

Both the amount and time span were revised in the substitute information, which said the former state official took \$27,927.21 from Sept. 6, 1962, to June 22, 1965.

In accepting the plan, however, the board made it subject to various conditions which must be met prior to any actual commitment.

The board's stipulations included that Manchester should reimburse the full per-pupil tuition for the bused pupils, ensuring no cost to the town.

Ky's ruling junta showed its confidence also by assembling a cabinet of military leaders, representatives at a political congress in Saigon to reaffirm its support for the government.

Adrift in Wooden Box

TAMPA, Fla. (AP)—Three men who clung to a homemade wooden ice box for four and one-half days after their 45-foot yacht sank in the Gulf of Mexico reached shore Monday night, rescued by the U.S. Coast Guard.

The Cape Marine was the third ship sighted, and after the first two didn't spot the trio had all but given up hope, Murphy said.

**Vernon Council Trims \$53,000 From Budget Proposals**  
 About \$85,000 was cut from the town's general government budget by the board of representatives at a special meeting last night.  
 Two additional meetings are scheduled by the board, tonight and Thursday night, to make additional cuts.  
 The budget cutting follows last week's budget hearing, at which residents said they oppose a heavy tax increase.  
 Until last night, the proposed budget would have required an 8 1/2 mill increase in the present 48 mill tax rate to about 56 1/2 mills. A mill produces about \$74,000 in taxes.  
 Only three major town agencies were discussed last night, and cuts were made in each of their budgets.  
 Hardest hit was the Vernon Police Department, which lost funds for three new patrolmen, two of six new cruisers requested to replace present vehicles, and funds to promote a patrolman to sergeant.  
 A motion by Rep. Thomas Woff, to reduce the salaries of Police Chief George F. Trapp Deputy, and Chief Edmund F. Dwyer, was not acceded to.  
 The two are slated to receive \$8,500 and \$9,200 respectively. Woff proposed lowering the salaries to \$8,200 for the chief and \$8,000 for the deputy chief.  
 The cost for the three new patrolmen requested by the department was listed at \$10,274. The two replacement cruisers would have cost \$2,800.  
 Other cuts effected in the police budget were elimination of the enlarged parking area at the public safety building, \$2,500; a reduction in printing costs from \$4,200 to \$3,500; elimination of \$300 from the police training budget; elimination of the new post of sergeant, savings of \$234, and the cost of exams for the job, \$300.  
 Fire Departments

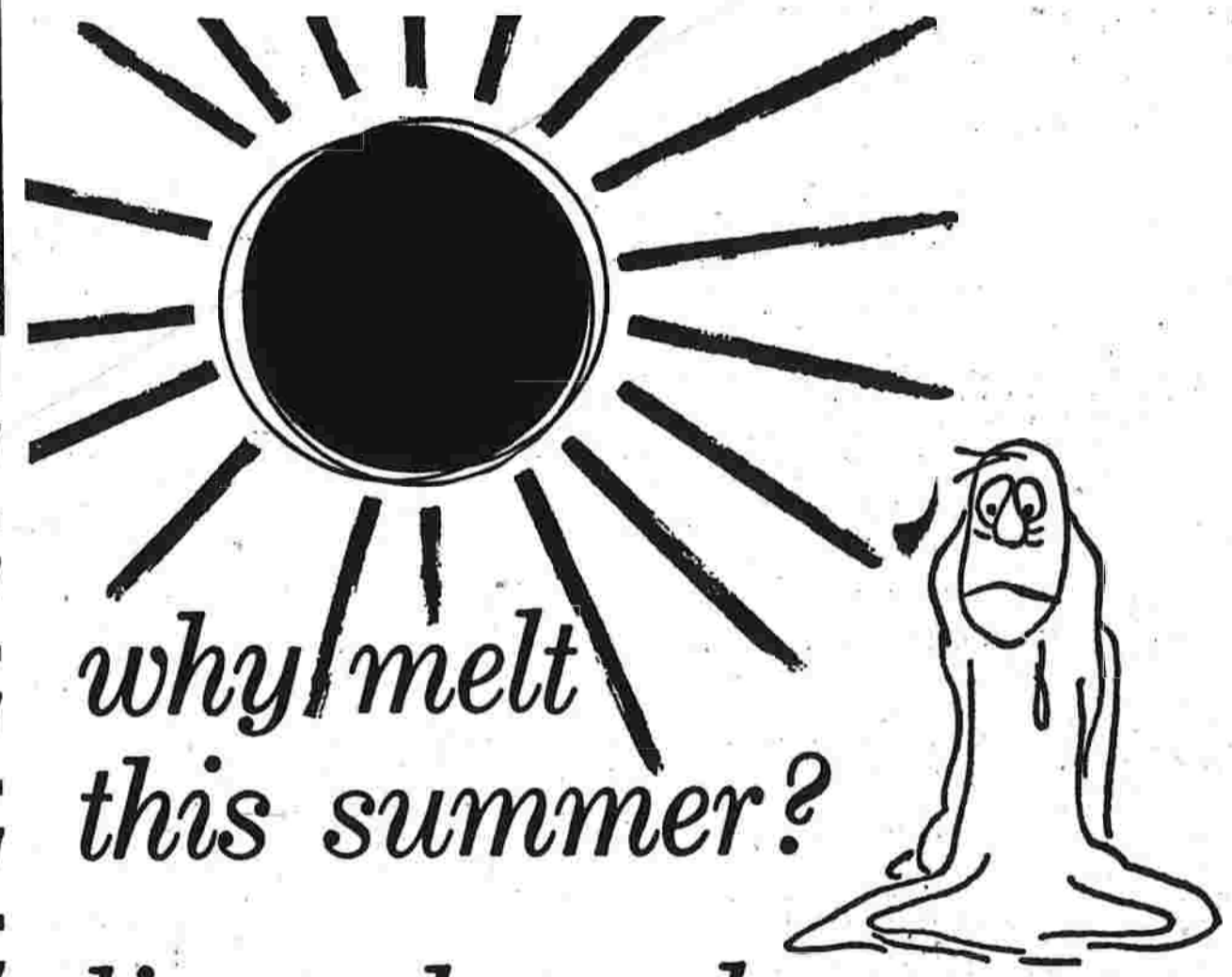

### Bolton High School Wing Seen Not Ready before 1967

Architect Arnold Lawrence tented themselves with a flat floor. Some board of education members said last night they still consider this best, and some were in favor of having a cafeteria-atrium addition to the high school could not possibly be ready for occupancy much sooner than the fall of 1967, year later than requested by the school board.

Lawrence, who has been retained by the PBC to draw preliminary plans for the addition, made the statement at a joint meeting of the two boards requested by the PBC to clarify the proposed wing.

Architect Larry Frazier from Lawrence's office presented a rough sketch, or "scratch," as he called it, of his ideas for the addition.

Frazier's sketch calls for five "teaching stations," separated by folding partitions, in the auditorium-atrium area. Two would be on the stage, and would be used as music rooms, as proposed by the board of education.

The center section of the structure, as suggested by Frazier, is the controversial one. Frazier proposed a lecture hall, lower than the stage, with a slanted floor and fixed seats, able to accommodate its students. By removing partitions, the rear section of the hall could be expanded to make an auditorium with a seating capacity of about 550.

The rear section would be the cafeteria, with a dining capacity of about 240, and with a movable partition down the center to convert it into two rooms, or teaching stations, for study halls or classes. The kitchen would be adjoining.

Lawrence asked for more direction on the requested board of education office, which will be located near the stage, according to the rough sketch. As the sketch stood last night, the addition, to be attached to the north side of the building, will have the cafeteria, lower than the stage and the stage in the back, with corridors and storage areas.

The original specifications for the addition were written in 1963, when Lawrence was drawing preliminary plans for the high school. The area was discarded at that time in the interests of economy. The architect noted some changes have been made in the requirements for the wing, leading them to propose an area with what they term greater flexibility than in either of the two previous proposals.

Both earlier proposals contemplated a cafeteria-atrium addition to the high school building.

Other members of both boards agreed that the lecture hall would be an asset to the educational program and not a hindrance as far as flexibility is concerned, but some asked to see comparative costs.

The question of the discussion was that Lawrence will make arrangements for a tour of the building, and that there will be more meetings by both boards, until agreement is reached.

The wing had been requested by the board of education for this fall, to ease an impending scheduling problem. Because it will take nine or ten months to complete after the construction contract is awarded, the completion date now appears to be the fall of 1967.

The change in plans will force the school board to make revisions in its program for next year, Ligouri said. He did not elaborate, because, as school board chairman Walter Wadwell implied, that will have to be done into at a board of education meeting.

The complete membership of both boards was present last night. The meeting was held in the high school library. It was chaired by PBC chairman Douglas Cheney, and lasted about 3½ hours.

## Third Term Romney Goal

LANSING, Mich. (AP)—Gov. George Romney of Michigan announced as expected today for a third term—one that could propel him to Republican presidential nomination in 1968.

This came only hours after sources close to Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller said the New York Republican leader had made a firm commitment to back Romney for the GOP nomination which twice escaped Rockefeller.

Romney has no announced Republican opposition and the filing deadline is less than three weeks away. Zoltan Ferenzy, Democratic state chairman, is expected to be his November general election opponent.

The term would be four years under a new state constitution which Romney helped write. Romney's first two terms, which broke 14 years of state-house rule by Democrats, were for two years each.

Romney has no announced Republican opposition and the filing deadline is less than three weeks away. Zoltan Ferenzy, Democratic state chairman, is expected to be his November general election opponent.

## Shot in Head, Bolton Youth Is Critical

Richard Hammond, 15-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Preston Hammond of Lyman Rd., Bolton, shot himself in the forehead with a .22-caliber rifle in his bedroom about 5:30 yesterday afternoon.

He was taken by ambulance to Manchester Memorial Hospital and immediately on to St. Francis Hospital. The hospital said today that he is in the intensive care unit with a critical head wound.

Police have been unable to talk to the boy and cannot say whether the shooting was accidental.

The boy, a freshman at Bolton Junior-Senior High School, is an avid hunter and holds a National Rifle Association Staff Shooter badge.

Mrs. Hammond was in the house at the time of the shooting and discovered her son lying on the floor of his bedroom.

The investigation is being conducted by Resident Trooper Robert Peterson and Sgt. Michael Griffin of Troop K, Colchester.

## In Black Case

### FBI Tells High Court Agents Eavesdropped

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Justice Department has sent an unprecedented memorandum to the Supreme Court, advising that Federal Bureau of Investigation agents secretly eavesdropped on conversations between a lawyer and his client—a former associate of Bobby Baker.

The oldest, Washington public relations man Fred B. Black Jr., later was convicted of income tax evasion. But in the memorandum, Solicitor General Thompson Marshall said Black should be given a court hearing.

Marshall's memorandum to the high court was filed Tuesday, indicating that the FBI apparently acted on its own when it "installed a listening device" in Black's hotel suite in Washington three years ago.

The memorandum said that neither the Justice Department attorneys who prosecuted Black nor any other attorney of the Department of Justice—including Atty. Gen. Nicholas Katzenbach—knew about the eavesdropping.

Black now is fighting his 1964 tax conviction and has asked the Supreme Court for the second time to review his conviction.

## Explorer 32 Off in Orbit

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP)—Explorer 32, America's newest orbiting chemical laboratory, lifted into orbit today to begin mapping uncharted regions of earth's upper atmosphere.

The 400-pound atmospheric explorer blasted off at 10 a.m. on the tip of a Delta rocket. Its launch is the first of the busiest seven-day launch schedule in Cape Kennedy history.

"We appear to have a normal flight," a National Aeronautics and Space Administration spokesman said.

Gemini astronauts Thomas P. Stafford and Eugene A. Cernan viewed the launch from a site about a mile from the pad. Their own launch is scheduled in six days.

"We'll get off one of these things," Stafford quipped.

The \$1.8-million satellite, three feet in diameter, was built to beam back data on concentration and distribution of charged hydrogen, helium, nitrogen and oxygen atoms.

This information is useful in learning how to communicate through outer space.

## Coast Guard Fails to Find Rowboat Puffin

FORTMOUTH, Va. (AP)—A Coast Guard search has failed to find any trace of the rowboat Puffin and its two-man crew.

John Hoare, 26, and David Johnston, 34, left Virginia Beach Saturday in the 16-foot craft to row the 3,000 miles to England. They hoped to make the trip in 60 days.

On Monday, however, they were spotted 50 miles off the Virginia Coast, about 100 miles behind schedule, and Tuesday, a Navy pilot reported he saw Puffin about 10 miles east of Virginia Beach, near the Coast Guard Chesapeake light station.

The Coast Guard search was called off and a spokesman said it was assumed that Hoare and Johnston had headed back to shore and might already have landed.

"Station WYBC-TV of Hampton reported it had been in contact with a fishing vessel which said the rowers turned back to sea after receiving from the vessel what they considered a favorable weather report.

While encircled in a wooded area, the man wounded a policeman.

He was finally shot several times after surrendering the boy in a swap for a quart of water.

The youngster, Michael Albee, 7, apparently suffered no ill effects from his ordeal.

His father, Donald Albee, said the brown-haired first-grader was not crying when set free.

Six hours later, he was at the family's home in Terryville, chewing bubblegum and playing with his baseball cards.

Police said the abductor, Albert Bunn, 33, a water company employe, was apparently deranged.

Michael's mother said her son was snatched up by Bunn as he waited with other children for the school bus, seven doors from the Albee home.

"He tried to pick up two girls first," she said, "but they saw him and ran. But then he went for Michael, who had his back to him."

"The father said Michael quoted Bunn as saying 'Let's go for a ride. It won't be a long one.' Bunn drove to a country road on the outskirts of this industrial city and stopped first at a home before leading Michael into the woods, his father said.

State police and officers from several towns and city departments arrived soon after. They knew Bunn was the man they were after, they said, because his auto license number was a blast from Bunn's shotgun.

Policeman Joseph Noera of Bristol was hit in the midsection by a blast from Bunn's shotgun.

## Protest Mark Off Saigon Buddhist Leaders Bow to Mayor's Decision

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP)—Hundreds of anti-government demonstrators scattered before riot police and paratroopers in Saigon today after the mayor banned a threatened Buddhist protest, "march of peace."

The Buddhist leadership bowed to the ban.

Premier Nguyen Cao Ky's crackdown on "his opponents in Saigon as police moved against the demonstrators with tear gas in one of the heaviest downpours of the year.

The paratroops set up positions on streets to the market.

Many units were armed with machine guns.

Ky's opponents demonstrated peacefully in three other cities, including the northern Buddhist stronghold of Hue, while government supporters rallied in Buddhist protest, which fell Monday.

Several persons were injured and a number of Buddhist monks and nuns were arrested in Saigon as police moved against the demonstrators with tear gas in one of the heaviest downpours of the year.
