In the same speech, the Secretary of State also performed the neat oratorical feat of substituting mere distance for the nature of involvement. In this passage, he chided those, who in face of the existence of modern weapons on a shrinking earth, "cling to the obsolete notions of a bygone age, who think that what happens next door is necessarily more important than what happens halfway around the world. Some of them ean across the Atlantic-but the Pacific is too broad for them even though it can be crossed in less time than could the Atlantic before the Second World War."

In such a passage, Secretary Rusk was setting up a few sitting ducks, like Walter Lippmann in some of his weaker arguments, and mowing them down without once getting near the real core of any argument about American in volvement and responsibility in Southeast Asio.

The prime lesson of our age is divided in two parts: 1. We do have involvement and responsibility in Southeast Asia. 2 .If we want to follow such involvement and responsibility in a way which will make it possible for both Southeast Asia and ourselves to keep alive, we will have to do so through the United Nations, and not through some unilateral policy in which, while orating against spheres of influence for anybody else anywhere, even next door to themselves, we set ourselves up for perpetual spheres of influence strength next door to everybody else.

On this occasion, the fairy tale which is getting to be more and more the trademark of Secretary Rusk's discussions was a little more ornate and embellished than usual. But, toward the end of his speech, he had to conserve time, and he was back to one-sentence fantasies like "we offered to share our atomic monopoly with the entire world -for purpose of peace" or "we negotiated a peace of reconciliation with Japan and Germany." These two statements have just that portion of truth, in what they claim, and unspoken and perhaps even unintentional deception, in what they do not say, to qualify as expert diplomatic rhetoric. Even were



Pay-In-Lieu

Wall Street Journal survey finds that quite a few industries are offering to buy back vacation time from some of their veteran, skilled employes this summer. They have more orders on hand than they can fill. Their best employes are now entitled to long four week vacations. They find that it is going to pay them to pay some of these employes double pay for giving up two weeks of their vacation, and staying on

lieu," in lieu of vacations, that is, and some unions permit it and some men accept it. Unions which frown on the practice have two reasons. First, the willingness of men to give up vacation time might be taken to prove they don't need that much vacation time in the first place. Second, one of the original purposes of the unions in getting onger vacations for their members was not only to provide them with more leisure and happiness, but also to be created. But if men should get to like their pay-in-lieu, they might be looking for it every year, and make a habit of not taking long vacations, and then the job-creating role of the long vacations would be lost.

And still others have a wary idea that such pleasant little emergency practices have a habit of being claimed as precedents by union bargainers. They visualize, such skittish employers, a future in which the arrival of summer just means the beginning of double pay, or pay-in-lieu, or payola, or whatever it gets to be called if it really works its way into the lan-

The National Seashore

For several summers, during its develepment, the Cape Cod National Seashore has been open to the public, and several million visitors have been there. Now the time has come for its formal establishment, which is to take place at Bastham on Memorial Day, with the federal government officially taking posession in the presence of state and na-

Cape Cod has, countless aspects. There is noise and excitement, but there is also peace and quiet. There is activity ashore and on the water. There are crowded roads and beaches, busy shopping centers, popular theaters and eathaunts that few strangers ever find. Old and new meet on Cape Cod, from statey churches and weathered cottages to

the National Seashore is the natural Cape Cod, the outer side of the lower cape, where the Atlantic suri pounds and the east wind blows and the struggle between sea and land goes on forever. There are miles of white dunes and high headlands, and sheer bluffs torn by winter storms, and offshore to the south are shoals and sandbars that nenace navigation. For centuries ships

along this exposed coast. Geologists regard the outer cape as a rare example of glacial deposits and the violent action of sea on land, accounting for the wide variety of landscapes. As Henry Thoreau noted when he fire went there in 1849, the effects of ocean and weather are constantly changing its outline and formation. The narrow strip that is the National Seashore extends some 40 miles between Chatham and Provincetown, and varies in width from

less than one mile to nearly five. Besides the beaches, this public tract includes woodlands, fresh-water ponds, moors and marshes, all abounding in wildlife. There are trails for walking, bicycling and horseback riding, with guides and rangers, shelters and information centers. Also there are vantage points overlooking the sea where one can rest and watch the waves or follow a distant sail, breathe the salt air and soak up sunshine, envying the buoyant

sea birds as they ride the wind and find Cape Cod is one of five national seashores now administered by the National Park Service, which was created in August 1916, and thus is in its 50th year. The work of improving and expanding the vast park system and of conserving the nation's natural beauties and resources is ever growing. May 30 tradi-tionally marks the beginning of the New England summer season, and it is only a day after the birthday of the late President Kennedy, who in 1961 signed the act authorising the new recreational domain on Cape Cod.—EPRINGFIELD REPUBLICAN
