Anthony Eden's Plan

The world is full of negative analysis of the situation in Vietnam. Nobody is at a loss to describe how hopeless the situation seems; how much, as in this space yesterday, it seems like a Greek tragedy, grinding our world remorselessly toward its own destruction and fall.

The business of proposing solutions is slightly more difficult. It is difficult because it is bound by necessities which can seem just as inescapable as the necessities which bind all the actors in the drama to the kind of plot which leads on toward their death. It is difficuit because the decisions that might be involved in making the first turns toward the prospect of peaceful settlement could require a great deal more courage than that required merely to go on toward enlargement and deepening of the tragedy.

Since solutions are so much more difficult than non-solutions, anybody who claims to have figured out a way out deserves considerable attention. Anthony Eden, who has lived as much of the history of our time as anybody

now alive, has been bold enough to try to chart out a solution. His proposals do not, in our opinion, suffer from being summarized into very few words. He says that the one thing both Communist China and the United States agree upon is that neither wants the other to be in Vietnam. He suggests, therefore, that we both agree to stay out of a neutral belt to be established out of at least three portions of former French Indo-China. He notices that Cambodia and Laos are already in such neutral status, except for infringements upon their neutrality by both parties fighting in Vietnam. He would have South Vietnam be added to these two, plus North Vietnam if North Vietleftover or design, as the case may be, nam should so choose, which he does

Once his neutral belt had been estabfished, he would have some such plan as the United States Mekong Delta development brought into effect, to buttress the economy and the society of the neu-

With this as a condition of solution which might some day be arrived at there cannot be too much serious quarrel. The dangers in it would obviously be much less than the dangers everybody is facing now. The risks would be minor, civilized risks compared to the total risk being taken in Vietnam now

But, even if everybody in Washington were united on Eden's destination as a good ultimate goal, the worst and sharpest trouble would arise over the taking of the first step toward such a goal. I would all have to begin, in Eden's view, with something like a cessation of American escalation in Vietnam—with such a military gesture as would be involved, for instance, in some drawing back of American force out of its confact with the enemy. We would, to be specific, have to begin by doing something to reduce, rather than keep expanding, the scale of the fighting in

In order to bring itself to this, Washington would not only have to decide that Eden's ultimate goals are practical, out it would have to make its own fundamental decision as to whether it really wants a settlement or a victory, a negotiated peace og a war to some kind of

Many of us have thought, from the beginning of the deep American involvement there, that the proper strategy for us, in line with proper goals for us, would be to be there but only to stand and resist. Every crucial Washington decision so far, however, has been wedded to the opposite theory, that the only thing we can do is keep putting in enough more force to carry the war enough farther to beat the enemy into some kind of diplomatic submission. Anthony Eden's plan might be a solution, and a solution with honor, but who can persuade Washington to put something the this on its planning table?

The Statistic Speaks

Sometimes blunt facts are more rational in their naked selves than when they are balanced into reasoned appraisal and analysis and judgment. That's the way it is, we think, with the latest statistic of weekly American casualties in Vietnam.

What it says over and over sgain, is too many, too many. What it says, sharply and emphatically, is that this has ceased altogether being a minor or limited war and has become one of the major conflicts in our

national history. What it asks, with its brutal insistence, is whether we really know why.

To accept a sandwich blind from the hand of another is to surrender one's fate and will and judgment into the hands of others, and too many of us, all over the world, are just taking what is being handed to us these days. 

The Poage bill would require the licensing of dealers furnishing animals to research facilities and would authorize the Secretary of Agriculture to fix humane standards for the handling and ransportation of such animals. It would not restrict in any way the number of animals that could be purchased or the handling of them during actual research

Yet spokesmen for science have opgantly as though it sought to forbid research entirely. One witness at the House hearings asserted ominously that it would constitute "a serious threat to the health of all of us" and declared that similar legislation now in force in Pennsylvania has resulted in "strangulation of our flow of appropriate experi-

Decent care of research animals may somewhat increase the cost of handling them and may entail some inconvenie for pet thieves and animal dealers. But the idea that it will imperil science is one of those hobgoblins of the medical mind. Enactment of the Poage bill is dictated by elementary decency. — WASHINGTON POST


