Belgium Agrees to House NATO's Military Chiefs

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — Belgium today agreed to house the military headquarters of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization but the future location of NATO's political council still is in doubt.

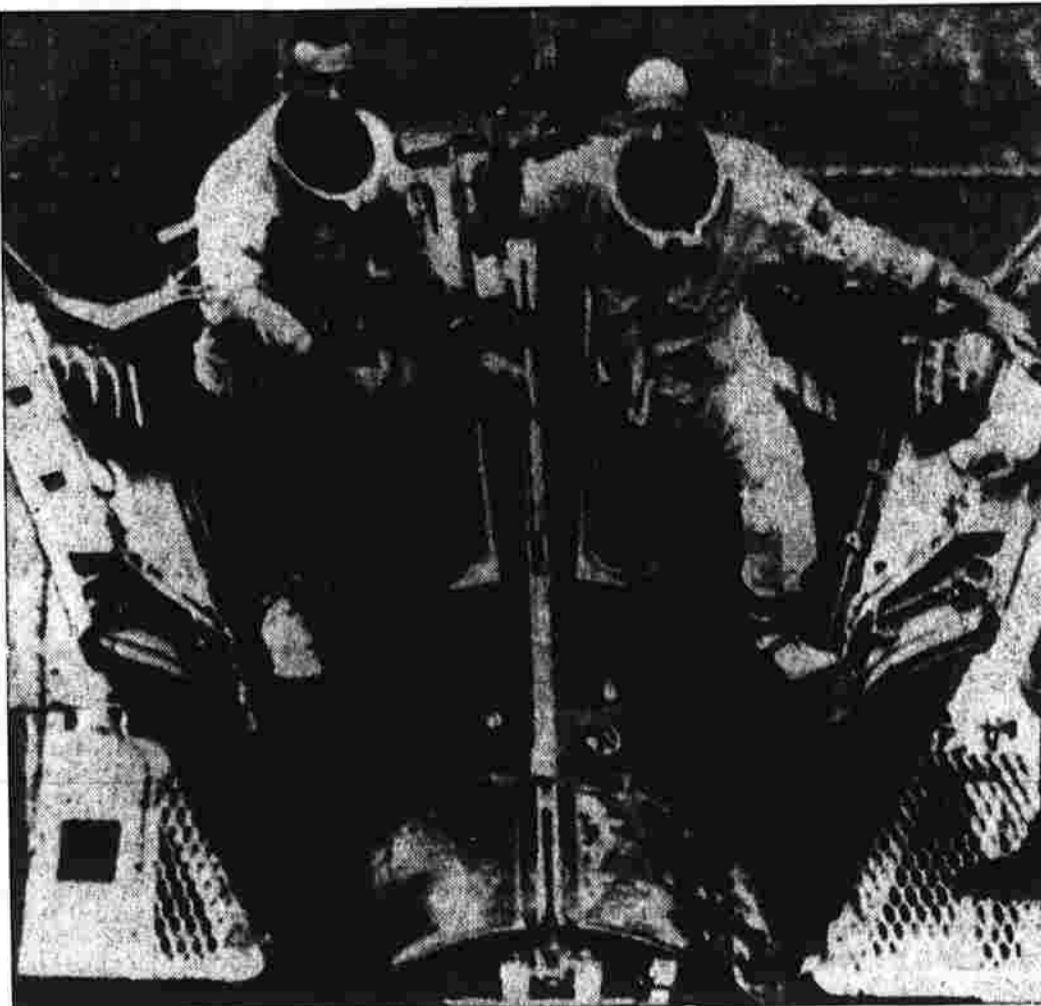
According to sources at the opening session of the NATO conference, Belgian Foreign Minister Pierre Harmel accepted the proposed transfer, but made it clear he was speaking on behalf of the Benelux countries — Belgium, the Netherlands and Luxembourg.

The sources said this was because the Belgian government faces certain political problems in its relations with France, and in connection with its own internal political situation.

The foreign ministers of NATO's members met without France this morning to study problems raised by France's withdrawal on July 1 from the alliance's military structure.

Foreign Minister Maurice Couve de Murville of France joins the annual spring talks Tuesday.

The conference sources said that there had been no vote taken at the morning session, but that the 14 ministers had reached a consensus on the military move. They also agreed on sev-

Stafford Puts Capsule 4 Miles from Target

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP)—The Gemini 9 astronauts, in a near-perfect climax to their sensational and often-troublesome orbital flight, splashed triumphantly to a safe landing in the Atlantic today and received the grateful congratulations of President Johnson.

Astronauts Thomas P. Stafford and Eugene A. Cernan — on his space walk, saying "That little stroll, Gene, was one of the finest chapters in our whole space story."

The President said he would nominate Cernan today for promotion to the grade of Navy commander. Stafford had been promoted to Air Force lieutenant colonel after his Gemini 6 flight in December.

Shortly afterward, President Johnson piloted the new space heroes from the LBJ Ranch in Texas and said, "we're proud of both of you. You have made us all aware of what performance under pressure is all about and that includes courage."

Johnson congratulated Cernan on his space walk, saying "That little stroll, Gene, was one of the finest chapters in our whole space story."

Stafford and Cernan acknowledged the cheers with waves and "thumbs up" signals. Both appeared relaxed and in excellent physical condition.

Command pilot Stafford, whose cool, on-the-spot decisions played a key role in the mission, steered the space ship to a touchdown within sight of the carrier and on-deck television cameras, which relayed the dramatic picture via the Early Bird satellite.

"Pretty close for government work," commented a flight dynamics officer.

On the deck, the hatches were opened and the smiling space twins took up, waved at the sailors and the television cameras, and shook hands with Navy and space agency officials.

They then shook hands with one another and Stafford rubbed his three-day old beard and laughed.

The 17-piece ship's band struck up "Anchors Aweigh" as

Sheppard Trial Unfair Supreme Court Rules

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court held 8-1 today that a deluge of publicity amid "a carnival atmosphere" denied Dr. Samuel H. Sheppard a fair trial in the budgeon slaying of his first wife, Marilyn. It ordered the Cleveland osteopath freed unless the state wants to try him again.

At the same time the court, in the majority opinion written by Justice Tom C. Clark, suggested detailed rules for court control of news coverage in cases of great public interest.

To prevent the "bedlam that reigned at the courthouse," the majority said the trial judge could have limited the number of reporters in the courtroom.

It also said witnesses should have been instructed, and the judge should have tried to control the release of information and gossip to the press by policemen, witnesses, and counsel for both sides.

The judge, it said, might well have banned out-of-court statements by any attorney, witness or official "which divulged prejudicial matters."

The dissenter in today's decision was Justice Hugo L. Black, who did not write out his views. On learning of the decision,

NEW YORK (AP)—The Newspaper Guild of New York has submitted to the World Journal Tribune Inc. the names of 325 guild members who say they wish to leave their jobs voluntarily.

The 325 were among 1,800 guild members who were employed on the three newspapers whose merger created the new corporation.

It is hoped the voluntary terminations will help smooth the way for settlement of the guild's six-week strike against the World Journal Tribune, which has not yet been able to publish.

Norwich Physician Wins Law Diploma

WEST HARTFORD (AP)—Dr. James A. Harkins, a 42-year-old Norwich physician, will soon be able to hang up another shingle. This one will say "Attorney-at-Law."

Harkins, a father of four children, is scheduled to receive his law degree from the University of Connecticut Law School June 13.

The physician, a specialist in internal medicine for the past 13 years, is the top man in his law class of 70.

It has taken him five years to complete the law course while continuing to practice medicine. He estimates that he has traveled 46,000 miles to and from classes during that period.

Harkins said he became interested in acquiring a law degree after reading scores of legal articles in medical journals over the years.

He thought a law background might help him serve as counsel in court cases involving medical problems. But he had other reasons.

"I've had a long-standing interest in law, but I believe that television drove me into studying it," he said.

Harkins said he was watching a dull program one night when he thought: "I could be doing something productive with my time."

The physician developed a study plan to fit into his busy schedule.

"I took only brief notes, jotting down a key word or phrase to remind me of the point made in class by the instructor," he explained. "Then I would use these notes to dictate what I wanted to remember on a recording device. Later I played back the record to keep the points fresh in my mind."

Harkins had recorders in his auto, his home and his office. He was able to listen to his recordings while driving to and from classes.

Peking Purge Seen Start of Power Fight

TOKYO (AP) — The Peking watchers believe the current purge in Red China is the beginning of a power struggle among Mao Tse-tung's heirs.

Following the ouster of powerful Peking Mayor Peng Chen from his party post, some observers predicted a showdown between President Liu Shao-chi and Premier Chou En-lai. Their theory was that Chou had Peng fired for fear he would try to grab Chou's position as premier. These observers said Peng had been maneuvering to become premier under President Liu's protection by blaming Chou for recent economic and diplomatic reverses.

Liu and Chou, both 67, are

China's two most powerful men after Communist party chairman Mao, whose falling health is believed to have touched off the power struggle. Mao is 72 and makes few public appearances.

Those who foresee the power struggle continuing, with the purge catching even more prominent figures, say one of the next victims could be army chief Lo Jui-ching. Lo disappeared from public view last November, one month after high-level party meetings.

Some say Lo may have disagreed with the aims and conduct of the purge, which in the early stages took the form of a campaign by army newspapers against intellectuals. If Lo was a friend of Mayor Peng, so the theory goes, then he also may have been aligned with the forces of President Liu, who suffered a setback with Peng's ouster.

Other observers see the possibility of a clash between President Liu and Defense minister Lin Biao, 57. Lin, who is also first deputy premier, recently put forth new lines of theory on how to implement Mao's teachings.

Ky Nominates Civil Junta, Buddhists Continue Protest

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (AP) — Premier Nguyen Cao Ky's military regime nominated a slate of 10 civilians today to join the 10-man ruling junta but excluded Buddhist extremists opposing the government.

The list included some moderate Buddhists, Roman Catholics and representatives of the Cao Dai and Hoa Hao sects. But the absence of any militant Buddhistists pointed to the imminent danger of a collapse of the political truce between the regime and the united Buddhist Church.

Even before the government published the list, the Buddhist Institute said: "This cannot solve anything but only increase the opposition from the people." A spokesman said the Buddhists wouldn't join the government if asked.

The ruling generals drafted the list of civilians several hours before a deadline agreed last week in negotiations between moderate Buddhist elements

and the Ky regime to end the political crisis.

The list submitted by the junta was revised this afternoon by the 34-man Armed Forces Council, part of the governing military apparatus, then sent back to the junta for approval.

The Buddhist Institute, a commune, repeated demands for the resignation of Ky and the chief of state, Nguyen Van Thieu.

"If the two generals still remain in power with only superficial changes in the junta, it cannot solve anything but only increase the opposition from the people," the commune said.

While the Ky regime attempted to live up to its political pact with the Buddhists, it appeared in for a surprise from the Electoral Commission it named to prepare the ground for the Sept. 11 elections for a Constitutional Assembly.

During a long debate Sunday night, 37 of the 55 commissioners were reported to favor

letting the assembly turn itself into a governing legislature after it drafts a constitution.

This would shorten the life of the military regime considerably and preclude the second round of voting for a legislature which Ky plans. The premier said last month that he probably wouldn't be able to step down until the middle of next year.

However, the junta could reject the commission's recommendations.

While the politicking went on in Saigon, there were these developments in the war:

—The U.S. 1st Cavalry, Airborne, Division, together with Vietnamese and South Korean units, ended Operation Crazy Haves after almost 21 days of off-and-on fighting against the Communists in the rugged central highlands 270 miles northeast of Saigon. The reported enemy toll was 618 Viet Cong killed, 21 captured, 128 suspects

Hurricane Alma Among Earliest Tropical Storms

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — Hurricane Alma, the earliest of the big tropical storms in 15 years, boiled up today in the Caribbean and thrashed toward Cuba.

At 11 a.m., the National Hurricane Center said the winds of the storm had reached hurricane force at 76 miles an hour.

Just six days after the service put into effect its master plan for 1966 storm forecasts, Alma was churning up the waters of the Caribbean 340 miles southwest of Havana and 570 miles from Miami.

Not since May 1951, when a 100-mile storm threatened the Florida coast, has a hurricane sprung up so early in the season. That one looped to the northeast and fell apart in cold air off the Carolinas.

Billy Graham Debates God With British Atheist on BBC

LONDON (AP) — Billy Graham debated the existence of God with a British atheist Sunday night.

The American evangelist, said his faith was "not only grounded in tremendous evidence" but proved by the "laboratory of personal experience."

The panel discussion took place on the British Broadcasting Corp. before an audience estimated at four million.

The atheist, Ian Tipler, a university instructor, asked Graham, "How do you know you are not wrong about the existence of God?"

"Because I have had a personal experience with God," Graham replied.

Another panelist, scientist David Frost, son of a Methodist pastor, asked Graham what proof he could offer for others.

Graham answered: "When Jesus touched the blind man, he gave him sight. He was healed, the blind man couldn't explain what happened. When a person comes to Jesus Christ, he can't explain what happens. But enough people have experienced it for me to know it happens."

If there existed a personal, benevolent God, Graham said, how could he explain war, disease and natural calamities.

"The Bible has the complete answer for all that," Graham said. "Man is struggling against God. He is spiritually diseased. War is just the last stage of the heart's flow all these and in New Haven '4 and '66. 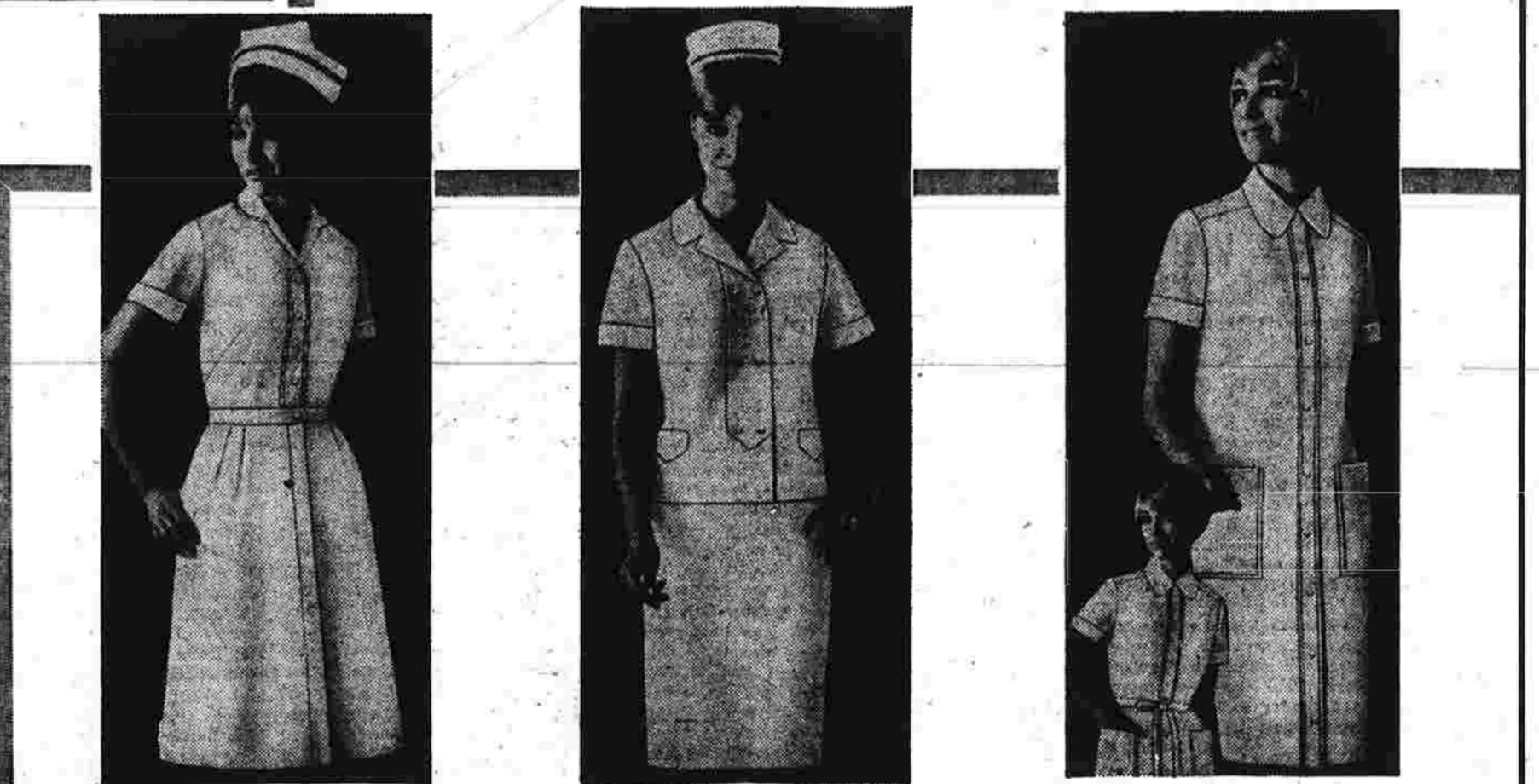

Report From Cantho

Correspondent Neil Sheehan in the New York Times has just reported on conditions at a civilian hospital located at Cantho, in the Mekong Delta, 30 miles south of Saigon.

There, he wrote, "are to be found the unreported casualties of this war—the Vietnamese men, women and children who get in the way of bombs, mines and bullets unleashed by both sides."

His prewar days mirror the agony of the Vietnamese masses who live in a countryside where war is an intimate part of life.

"About 500 civilians, most of them ordinary peasants, enter this hospital each month with wounds of every conceivable variety. They are not taken to the battle statistics published in Hanoi, Saigon or Washington as evidence of alleged military successes."

"These," Correspondent Sheehan continued, "are the Vietnamese, both sides, who are not counted in the statistics. Since there is nothing to be gained by boasting of the wounds inflicted on them, they are officially ignored."

"Yet just as United States Air Force fighter-bombers often hit peasant villages instead of Vietcong encampments, so do guerrilla mines blow up civilians scattered either there or nearby."

"The hospital has only two ambulances and no helicopters. Most of the wounded must make their way to Cantho as best they can. . . . The result of this lack of transportation is that almost all of the wounds are at least 12 hours old. . . . Because of this, almost all of the wounds are infected, and many of the patients are in deep shock."

"No attempt is made to ascertain which side inflicted the wounds and the surgeons who remove shrapnel or bullets are too busy to ask such questions, each being side by side on the same narrow cot in the women's surgical ward. One had been shot in the chest when helicopters strafed the rice paddy where she was working. The other had received lead wounds from mortar fragments when the Vietcong shelled her hamlet. . . ."

"About 500 of the 600 casualties each month require major surgery. The gravely wounded, who might be saved by rapid evacuation, apparently never reach the hospital but die along the way."

"The hospital cannot care for severe burn cases and grave head wounds—there are about two patients with serious burns about each week—and these must be evacuated to the Base by ambulance. The surgeons suspect that some of the severe head cases die from the long, bumpy trip, but the United States and Vietnamese military have refused to carry these civilians in their aircraft."

"There are other problems, such as a chronic shortage of whole blood, which has caused some deaths on the operating table."

"There will be some who will say, 'Yes, this is very sad indeed, but this is what is inevitable in war.'"

"We are tempted to say that just this much limited and localized evidence of what seems to be inevitable is worth being brought to the attention and courage of mankind to abolish the thing. This is evidence and reason enough."
