A.T.&T. Finances Under FCC Scrutiny

WASHINGTON (AP) — The financial structure of American Telephone & Telegraph Co. is under the scrutiny of the Federal Communications Commission today.

Both system officials lead off public hearings in the FCC probe with testimony that "good and ever-improving service depends on our ability to earn."

The FCC announced the unprecedented investigation last week to discover just how much the company is earning on its interstate and foreign communications services — including long-distance telephone service — and how that really needs to earn to maintain and improve its service.

AT&T officials, consultants and advisers will testify before FCC Chairman Rosel H. Hyde this week and again in the next several days. They will be asked to answer questions by including state utilities officials — begin later this summer.

All of the Bell System testimony already has been submitted in written form to the commission. Company witnesses will review that testimony and answer clarifying questions permitted.

You Should Know... John I. Garside Jr.

Ask GOP Town Director John I. Garside Jr. how he feels about politics, and he'll answer "I love it." Next to his family and his job, he rates politics, "black suits and all," his greatest interest.

Garside has been a director since December, when he was chosen to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Francis DeLoach.

And that's the first most Manchesterers know of him, for he had resided in town at the time for only two and a half years.

He says now that he likes Manchester so much that he regrets that he didn't move here sooner. And he might have, for he moved to Berlin from Brooklyn, N.Y. in 1958 because he was advised that "one doesn't move east of the Connecticut River."

If John Garside wasn't born to be a politician, he most certainly would be a doctor. He has lived it and breathed it from the time he was two years old.

He was born in Hartford, on Oct. 18, 1908, but moved with his family to West Boylston, Mass., in 1928. His father, until his death last January, was at one time or another a member of every board, agency and commission in West Boylston, and served on the board of selectmen for years.

The elder Garside was a registered Republican, but he believes in the fact of the fact that, never in his lifetime, did he vote for a Democrat. One day when he was asked if he can say the same, laughs and parries the question.

Incidentally, that laugh, paired with a mischievous sense of humor, are looks for his stock in trade—selling.

He is a salesman, and has been since 1948, while still an undergraduate at the University of New Hampshire. He first worked as an announcer (he says that he was also chief cook and bottle washer) for Radio Station WHEB, in Portsmouth, N.H.

Peace Pact OK KUALA LUMPUR, Malaysia (AP)—The Malaysian Cabinet today endorsed a peace agreement designed to end the three-year undeclared war with Indonesia, but a formal pact still has to be signed.

Deputy Premier about Raak said the Cabinet endorsement covered the principles he and Indonesian Foreign Minister Adam Malik hammered out last week in Bangkok, Thailand.

"We now look forward to real peace and stability in Southeast Asia," he said.

Czechs in Contrast PRAQUE, Czechoslovakia (AP)—In contrast with Romania, Czechoslovakia's ruling Communist party called today for "broader inclusion" of the country's economy into the Soviet-promoted pact allowing each East European country specific economic tasks.

The party published a resolution adopted at the 19th congress last week and calling for economic guidelines within the Communist counterpart of the European Common Market.

Romania has spurred Soviet integration schemes in favor of independent industrialization and closer trade ties with the West.

Bus Plunge Kills 15 SEOUL, South Korea (AP)—Fifteen persons were killed and 44 others seriously injured Monday when a bus plunged down a 30-foot cliff near Chongju, 100 miles south of Seoul, police reported today.

Most of the victims were high school pupils returning to Chongju after weekend visits with their families in the country.

Air France Strike PARIS (AP)—A strike by flying personnel almost paralyzed Air France today.

Foreign planes and crews were chartered for flights. All Air France flights from Orly Airport were canceled.

BOSTON (AP)—Negro parents say they are physically and mentally exhausted after sending 500 children to school in predominantly white neighborhoods during the past school year.

But they say they're so pleased with the results that if they don't resolve their dispute with the Boston School Committee, they'll double the program next year—even if it costs \$100,000.

"We're tired, physically and mentally tired, but it's something we've got to do and perhaps they should be made to feel that way," Mr. Edson Jackson, one of the Negro parents, said of the School Committee.

"We're going to keep up more long-range planning, more long-range pressure. We can't afford to let the children sit there and vegetate."

Starting on the first day of school last September, the children climbed into cars and station wagons, taxis and chartered buses to leave their predominantly Negro neighborhoods in Roxbury and Dorchester.

Their parents have been feeding with the School Committee for three years over the quality of the schools there. They staged two one-day school boycotts and a protest march and marching, of protesting physically.

Mr. Jackson said, "We were not fit to do anything else—we do have some new facilities planned for the fall but we won't say what they are now. But they're more sophisticated."

The State Board of Education has withheld \$4 million in education aid to Boston because it says the city has failed to comply with the new state law requiring that racial imbalance be eliminated in public schools.

The city faces a possible loss of \$16 million in the end of the year. The budget for public schools is about \$46 million.

Tolland New Subdivisions Previewed, Ordinances Changed, by Board

The planning and zoning commission viewed preliminary plans for several proposed subdivisions, which would contain a total of 226 homes, at a meeting last night. Only portions of the plans were submitted for the commission's approval.

The commission in agreeing to limit the location of new package stores, said it does not want to limit liquor sales permits which would traditionally be allowed chain grocery stores or drug stores wishing to locate in Tolland. Such facilities should be encouraged to open in town, the commission says.

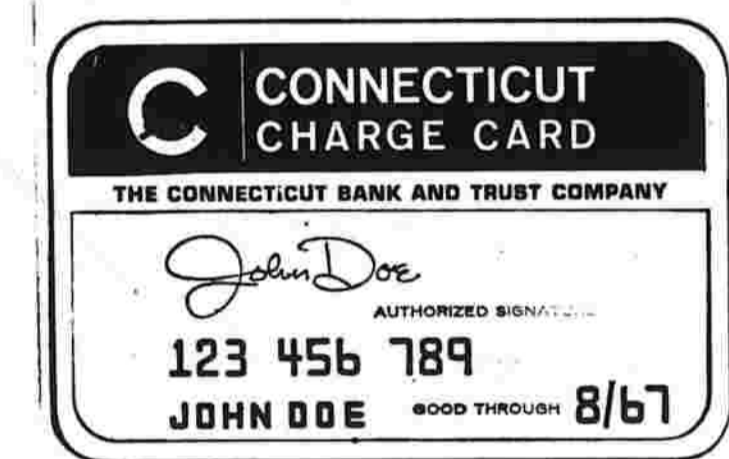

Ford's Pitching Future Uncertain As Yankee Prospects in Flag Race

NEW YORK (AP)—Why is Ford's pitching future so uncertain today as the New York Yankees' prospects in the American League pennant race?

Ford, whose recurring arm troubles kept him out of action during the Yankees' resurgence last month, was lost to the club for at least two weeks Monday when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list.

The 27-year-old southpaw, No. 1 man on the New York staff for more than a decade, has a strained, inflamed ligament inside his left elbow and is unable to throw without pain.

He injured his arm in California May 6, one day before Ralph Houk replaced Johnny Keane as manager and the Yankees started a climb from the league cellar.

New York has won 17 of 26 games since then, moving into its first six, four games under the .500 mark.

Ford, however, has pitched only three innings during that stretch, lasting two innings at Kansas City May 13 and only one in his last start May 24 against the Angels in New York.

In Cleveland, where the Yankees opened a three-game series against the league-leading Indians on Tuesday, Houk said Ford has been ordered to rest the ailing arm for at least a week after a conference with Dr. Sidney Gaynor, the club physician.

There is speculation that Ford will be traded to another team, but it will be of little value to the Yankees for the remainder of the season.

"The doctor doesn't think it is that serious," Houk said. "I'm hoping he's right. But I'll have to figure on going along without Whitey for awhile."

Ford, who underwent surgery in October, 1964, for circulatory blockage in his left shoulder, bounced back last year and completed a 36-13 record.

His record this season was 9-8 but he had an excellent earned run average of 2.63.

In 16 seasons with the Yankees, he has won 252 games and lost 100, for the top won-lost record among active pitchers.

Knuckleball Row Open to Outsider

NEW YORK (AP)—Dennis Higgins finally has crushed the Chicago White Sox' bullpen and Knuckleball Row may never be the same again.

Higgins, a 25-year-old right-hander who won a job this spring on a bullpen crew dominated for the past three years by Jim Lonigan, Ed Fitz and Hoyt Wilhelm, tossed four perfect innings Monday night, completing a 5-1 victory over California that stretched the Sox' winning streak to five games.

The 24-year-old rookie apiece eight seasons in the minors—the last five as a relief specialist—before his impressive showing in spring training and an injury to 42-year-old Wilhelm opened the gates.

When Wilhelm fractured the middle finger on his pitching hand, Higgins was tabbed by Manager Eddie Stanky to fill in alongside Phil and knuckleballer Bob Locker.

He has made 11 appearances, all in relief, and allowed only five earned runs in 26 innings of White Sox pitching. He has a 1.80 ERA while striking out 20.

"Higgins is simply great," Stanky said after the 4600-3 right-hander pitched 2 2/3 innings of scoreless relief in a double play that struck out two batters.

"He really fires the ball," Stanky said.

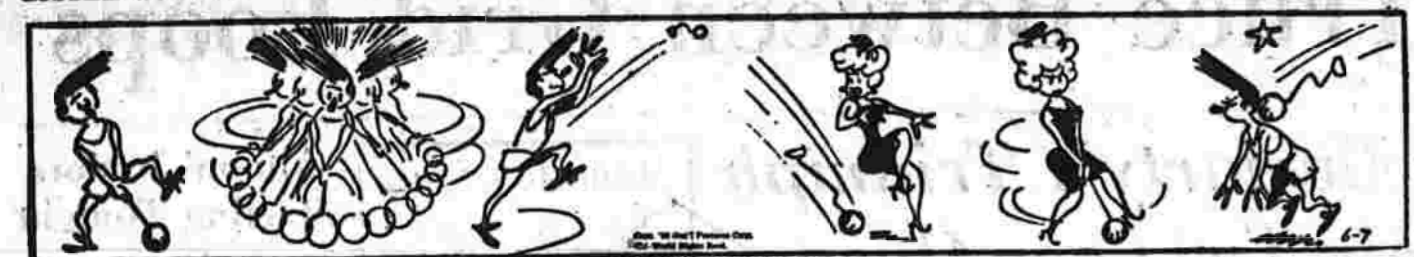

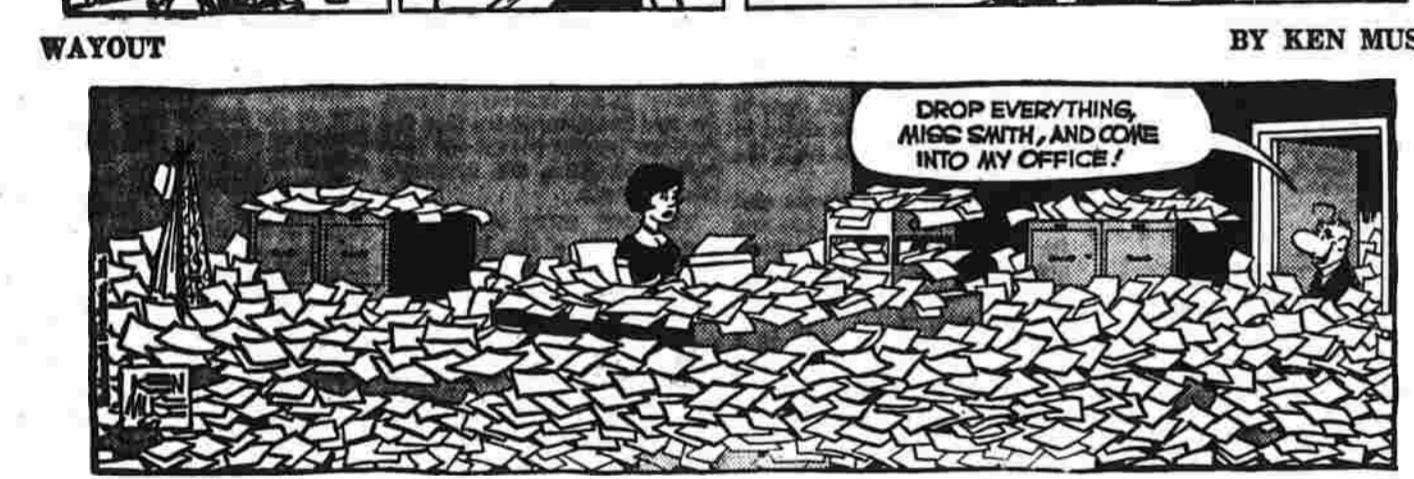

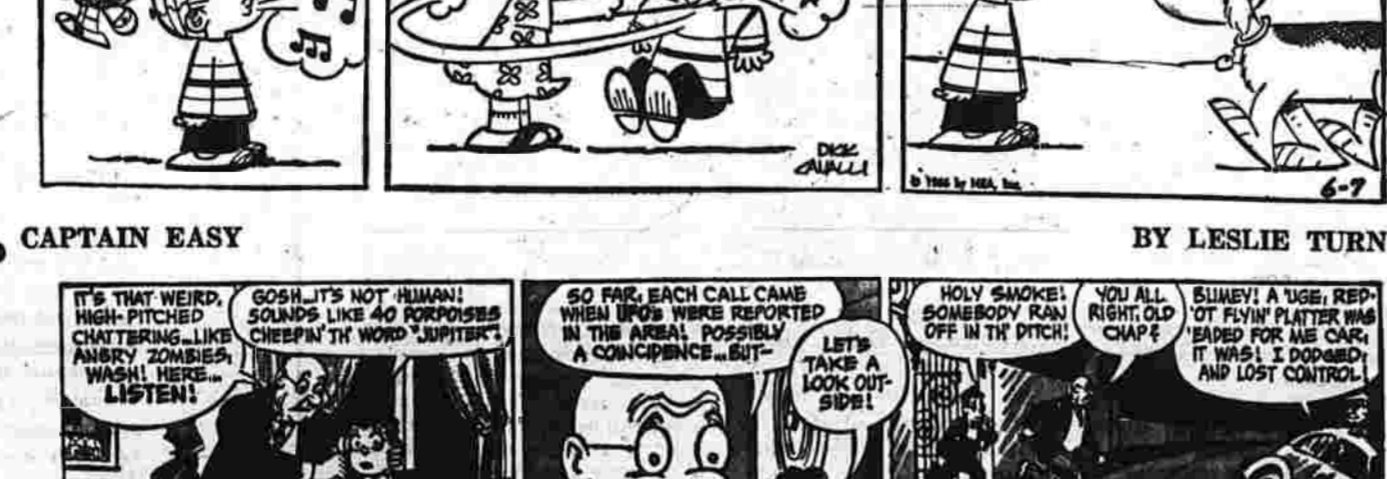
