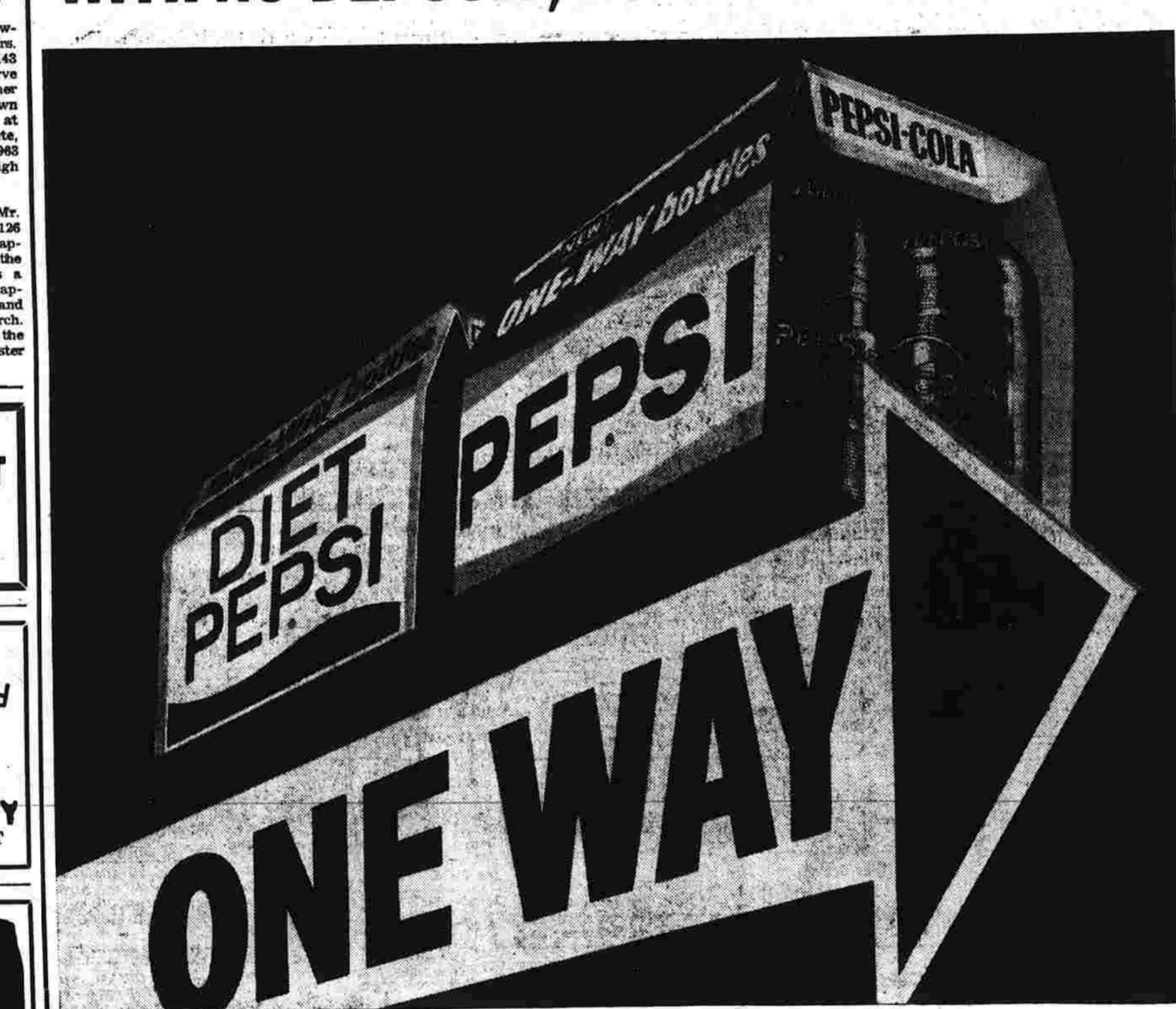

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by elections in South Vietnam—the previous gesture one in which we asked the Security Council to put the question of Vietnam on its agenda? Or would we place U Thant's anguish over the issue of Vietnam more accurately, and where it belongs, which would be on the number of times Washington turned an accurate record of the Secretary General's own efforts to try to get something going toward peace in Vietnam? Secretary General Thant is the chief officer of a world organization supposedly dedicated to peace, to law against war. But we, the world's greatest power, have never consented to submit our role and our performance in Vietnam to world judgment or to world peace making efforts. We have insisted, instead, that the United Nations should, as a courtroom in which we would be prosecutor and judge, and if it ever wants to work for peace, do so by backing up our views, our decisions, our actions. We, the great founder and financial supporter of the United Nations, have kept ourselves as far from international conduct, in Southeast Asia, as the Chinese Communists, who are not even members of the world organization. And it is not what a Secretary General gets from his biggest and best member, would it be strange if he should approach the end of his term with some feeling of bitterness and futility? As the day for U Thant's decision nears, there will no doubt be something of an international campaign to see that he stays on, and the United States will probably come into the headlines as one of the great forces moving to persuade him not to resign. And, in the amenities of world politics, there may be no more of a hint than this that the thing which came closest to driving him to do so was not the military or the notorious lawbreakers in the world, but the conduct of the world organization's best friend and most valued supporter, three shogin blaits into his own skin to say that he is reacting just the way a white man would, and what is wrong with that? WASHINGTON—The latest intelligence from the U.S. mission in Saigon shows that, finally, after years of rosy propaganda and half-hearted defectory facts, social and economic programs in the hamlets and villages of South Viet Nam are making perceptible progress. Between 1962 and 1965, for example, 7 million textbooks for school children were distributed throughout South Viet Nam. For this year alone the goal of 6 million additional textbooks is on schedule. New classrooms and teachers are growing at roughly equal proportions. The commodity import program for rice, sugar, cement, condensed milk, and other primary items for the reconstruction program is now moving about twice as fast as a year ago. In August, 1965, 107,000 tons of non-military imports were unloaded from ships that had to wait in the Saigon River for more than a month before unloading. The monthly rate of imports is now 200,000 tons and the unloading time has been sharply cut. These statistics reflect the change in attitudes and priorities since President Johnson ordered the doubling of troops in a systematic way how the peasants really feel about the Communist Viet Cong. Under cover of taking a census, these survey teams ask innocuous-sounding questions which hopefully will bring the government its first look at political motivation of the peasants. For years, Washington has been celebrating the peaceful

\$675,652 Budget Adopted; Tax Rate Set at 46.5 Mills

A town budget of \$675,652 has been approved by Hebron's state has been received in recent annual budget meeting. Members were: Chairman, Raymond J. Bart, board of finance chairman, Howard E. Porter, Fire Chief John Kutynski, Civil Defense Director, George Olgan was re-elected to a three-year term on the regional board of education. The treasurer of the board is Mrs. Joan Roberts and Mrs. William Wilke, tournament chairman. The women have met with golf pro Don Zabli to discuss their plans for the year. An annual picnic will be held on the rectory grounds, starting at 12:30 p.m. Flowers on the altar Sunday were given by Acorn and Marie Porter, in memory of their father, Claude Jones. ### French Forces Future Depends on De Gaulle

BONN, Germany (AP) — Whether French forces stay in Germany or pull out seems to many of their officers to depend on French President Charles de Gaulle's getting his way with his allies — not on the needs of Western defense.

"It's a long time since he stopped thinking as a general and began to think as a politician," one ally said.

De Gaulle has told President Johnson that he no longer wants to take part in an integrated system of defense but will fight at the side of his allies if they are the victims of "unprovoked aggression." He will decide.

This reporter has just returned from a four-day visit to the French forces in Germany. The French have over 70,000 men in this country, more than the British but only about a third as many as the Americans.

It was broken out tomorrow the French would — in theory — come under Allied command. Masses of men and their army would be at the orders of Gen. Andrew P. O'Shea, commander in chief of the First Army in Europe and commander of CENTAG, the Central Army Group of the allied forces.

Some 10,000 French airmen would become part of the 1st Allied Tactical Air Force, also under an American.

De Gaulle announced that he is pulling out of this kind of integration on July 1. The other allies object, especially the United States, Britain and West Germany.

### Panama Government Cites

PANAMA (AP) — Lack of popular support and prompt government action apparently were the main reasons for the collapse of student outbursts in Panama's two chief cities this week.

A high government official who had dealt with many such outbursts, said he was convinced that professional agitators touched off the wave of destruction Monday in Colon, Panama's second city at the Caribbean end of the Panama Canal.

Protesting the unsolved slaying of ultra-rightist student leader Juan Narvas Fajardo, about 500 students rampaged through Colon, stoned National Guardsmen and burned the City Hall, post office and national lottery building.

Two students were killed in clashes with guardsmen, but authorities believe the deliberate destruction of public buildings and smashing of store windows kept the demonstrators from attracting general popular support.

Authorities had been ready for trouble ever since student leaders began charging that agents of the Security Investigation Department killed Narvas Fajardo. They had hoped to avoid a clash that might provide the agitators with a martyr.

When violence erupted in Colon, however, the government quickly sent in a crack unit of the National Guard. When the disorders spread to Panama at the other end of the canal, President Marco A. Robles closed all high schools in both cities and surrounded the University of Panama campus with troops. This deprived agitators of student rally points.

Unlike previous riots which have been aimed at "Yankee imperialism" and sovereignty over the U. S.-controlled Canal Zone, Monday's outbreak was aimed solely at the Panamanian government.

The presidential press office said the riots were led by Communist elements following directives of the Tricontinental Conference of Revolutionaries in Havana last January. Hardcore agitators in Panama, many of whom have been trained in Havana, Moscow and Peking, usually seize on student causes as a peg for outbreaks.

The mysterious death of Narvas Fajardo, who was found on a roadside near Colon with a crushed skull, provided a natural springboard. The government has denied any responsibility in the student leader's death.

Wisniewski, 38, an attorney, would serve until Jan. 18, 1970, if confirmed by the Senate. He has been serving in the \$18,000-a-year post since August, 1964.

### 48 Fire Calls Month of May

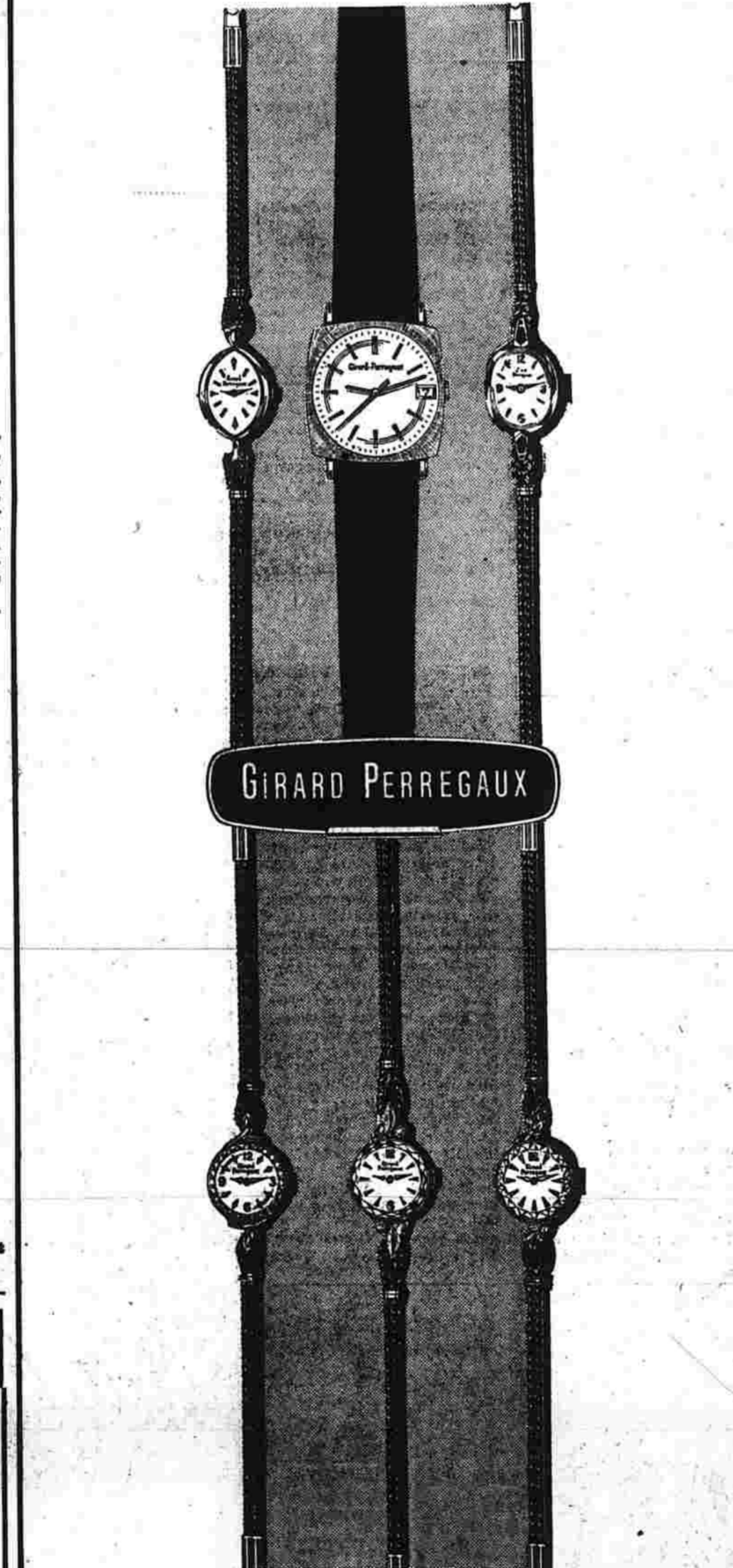

### In Hollywood Morse Hopes For 'Good' Film Role

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — "I hope I get a good picture. Why can't I get a picture? I think I really deserve a good picture."

Robert Morse was soliloquizing about his movie career, which he believes has journeyed from one disaster to another.

"Even my friends say I deserve a good picture," he continued. "They say to me, 'Bob, you're a good enough kid — a little crazy now and then, but you never hurt anybody. You really ought to have a good picture.'"

Morse was making these comments in his dressing room on the set of "How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying." He is playing the role created by Linus Sanderson on Broadway, that of window-washer who ascends to presidency of a huge wireless corporation.

I hazarded the possibility that this could be the good picture he so earnestly seeks.

"You'd think so, but who knows?" he commented doubtfully.

Stubby, straw-battered Morse began his film career — except for a featured role in the 1966 "Matchmaker" — with "Honey-moon Hotel." The film was supposed to be a triumphant debut for him and another Broadway star, Robert Gould. It was such a bomb that it was sold to television almost before the film print was dry.

Next came "The Loved One," about which he commented: "They made that one like they were playing the piano with their fists."

The results are not yet in on "Oh Dad, Poor Dad, Mama's Hung You in the Closet and I'm Feeling So Bad." Morse's third starring film. It had not yet been released.

The filming of "How to Succeed" without Bobby Morse in the lead would have seemed maniacal, since his eccentric style contributed in large measure to the show's success. Yet it seemed for months that the role might fall to a movie "name."

"That never worried me," said Morse. "I kept reading about how Tony Curtis was all set for the part, or Dick Van Dyke, or Jerry Lewis.

"But I knew that was only publicity to keep interest in the movie alive. I realized that no castings would be made until a director had been set."

The Mirisch brothers selected David Swift to direct and all hands agreed that the lead should be played by Robert Morse. Also cast was the original, Rudy Vallee.

"Go, I hope it's a good picture," said Morse earnestly. "Don't you?"

### Pricing Art

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) — How artists price their works of art — and why purchasers should choose certain prints or paintings — was the subject of a recent study at Pennsylvania State University by Harold Altman, associate professor of art.

Altman concluded that prices are set largely through comparison, although personal need of the artist can be a factor. Again, size may influence price. Some French artists actually price their work by the square inch of canvas involved.

For anyone about to buy a print or painting, Altman gives this advice: Don't go overboard on what is currently fashionable. Buy only if it gives you real pleasure. Learn something about the artist's background and whether or not he is recognized by museums, critics, and collectors — and never buy a work of art simply to fill an empty space.

Florida 'Handle' Alma Target

Residents of the panhandle beaches, who went to sleep in the belief they were safe from Alma, awoke today to find themselves next in line to receive the hammer blows of her wind and rain.

Florida's death toll from the hurricane rose to three when the body of an unidentified woman wearing a life jacket was picked out of angry seas under the Sunshine Skyway Bridge at Petersburg.

Alma, already weakened since she crossed Cuba with peak gusts of 117 miles an hour, may come to the end of the trail over the Florida panhandle and southern Alabama.

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
