



queste help to reopen the closed wards "I have no idea."

The Floyd Hospital in Rome, Ga., is starting its own nursing school in September to try to meet its own nurse shortage. "We are constantly striving to solve our problem," said Administrator Fred M. Walker Jr. "I'm not trying to low-rate the medicare problem, but we already have shortages."

A report to President Johnson on the status of medicare preparations agreed that there was a significant shortage of health personnel—and that the medicare program would have an impact in those areas where shortages already exist.

"The answer to such shortages is to increase the number of long-term solutions. But gradually increasing the number of nurses training facilities will increase the number of nurses available to the government," he said, "we can increase the nursing staff which is now extremely low among general hospitals."

Dr. Tenorio D. Caruana, a Los Angeles surgeon, put it this way: "I've heard, I've read and I've listened and I've looked. Right at the present time in Los Angeles there are large hospitals that are having a hard time to get adequate, competent nursing help."

"I know of three hospitals whose census of occupied beds is down not because beds aren't available but it's just not available. Next: The patient and his family are going to find a way."

## Four Workmen Killed by Heat

BRIDGEVILLE, Ill. (AP)—Over the heat killed four pipe inspectors Wednesday while they worked in a 2,800-foot-long tunnel in a coal mine.

The 600-degree heat struck the men when they were about 1,500 feet into the tunnel. A spokesman for the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater Chicago said the men were killed by heat.

The spokesman said the air in the pipe became hot after pumps, which pump air through the pipe, were shut off so the men could check the pipe for leaks.

Ventilation becomes minimal in the pipe after the pumps are stopped, the spokesman said.

Officials investigated after the men had been in the pipe for about two hours. Alex Walker, a structural engineer, and Ed Ward Krupa, a pipefitter, were among the dead.

Walker collapsed and Krupa dragged him out. Both men were taken to a hospital but were unable to be revived.

## Patent Medicines Backed for Sale in Food Stores

HARTFORD (AP)—If "patent medicines" such as aspirin can be sold over drug store counters, they can also be sold over food store counters, a state commission was told Wednesday.

"If a drug is low dangerous medicine such as aspirin can be sold over drug store counters, it should be taken off and placed under prescription," said Irving J. Janes, chairman of the Connecticut Pharmaceutical Association and State Shop.

The issue of patent medicines was raised at a Hartford lawyer, said that if patent medicines represent a potential danger, this is because of the way they are used, not the places where they are sold.

The hearing was held by the Commission to Investigate and Study Potentially Harmful Drugs.

The opposite point of view was taken by Raymond Merrier, past president of the Connecticut Pharmaceutical Association and State Shop.

"I can't see how responsibility merely by placing a warning on the package," said Merrier, noting that many patent medicines contain drugs which, if bought separately, would be sold over drug store counters. Aspirin, he said, "is the leading cause of death among infants in the whole country."

Walter Adams of Southington, president of the State Council of Senior Citizens, said, "We don't want to see standard drug restricted to drug stores."

### Court Clears Survivor of Nazi Camps

**NEW YORK (AP)**—A Jewish survivor of Nazi concentration camps has been cleared of assault charges for punching a policeman. He had aimed his blow at a Times Square demonstrator wearing a Nazi storm trooper uniform.

The charges against Wolfgang Silberberg, 48, were dismissed Tuesday by Criminal Court Judge Francis X. O'Brien after the state's Atty. John Collins said he had insufficient evidence to prosecute.

Silberberg, who had been in eight Nazi camps, happened on the demonstration by the National Renaissance party May 14.

He aimed a punch at one of the demonstrators but instead struck patrolman Jay Putim.

Silberberg, who lost his family in Nazi gas chambers, said at the time: "I saw black boots and all I could remember were the terrible beatings and hunger I had known."

A Good Concession: Somewhat Juan Bosch, the Dominican scholar in politics, has never quite had what it takes to be the successful example of that particular breed.

But one thing Juan Bosch has now managed, to his great credit. He has managed, in spite of all the wild and woolly temptations besetting him, to concede that the election was a valid election, and to concede that he himself lost.

This is a good reading of the final vote result, which stood 754,400 votes for Dr. Joaquin Balaguer, the President-elect, as against 517,783 for Mr. Bosch.

It Can Rain Here

The professionals in the United States Weather Bureau have notified their descriptions of drought conditions in the Northeast from "extreme," which was the word they used back in March, just before we had the driest April on record.

There has, at long last, been a change in the location of the winds which make rain.

When these meet, as they have done over the Michigan peninsula or a hope-less case, they find him discussing what we should be doing in Vietnam now that we are there even though we should be there.

The composite Romney thus sounds, as friendly commentators have already pointed out, something like Senator Russell of Georgia, who talks almost the same way about not wanting us to be in Vietnam but about escalating for real since we are there.

Or, if one wanted to be something less than downright friendly, one might say that both Senator Russell and Governor Romney sound like a combination of Senator Fulbright with former Senator Goldwater. Unfortunately, the Fulbright side is represented merely by spilled milk sentiment over what might have been, while the Goldwater side happens to be the one where the proposed future action is.

Although such developments and appointments remind our cynicism to stick around and never, who else almost do not really justify our hopes. How would any of us who hoped to run for President in 1968 stand on Vietnam in June of 1967? Who in public life would find it easy to resist such a clever combination of stances, half-pleasing to both the hawk and the doves, and enough of a present strategy on the whole, at least to make possible and feasible some safe landing on whatever side of the fence subsequent events may indicate?

The city now has the power to issue a payroll tax, but never utilized - payroll - taxing power, the first \$1,200 of an employee's annual salary would be exempted from the tax. The law will be revised to provide more generous exemptions in the lower - wage brackets.

For those earning \$10,000 or less, the first \$3,000 will be exempted. For those in the \$10,000-\$20,000 bracket, the first \$2,000 will be exempted. For those in the \$20,000-\$30,000 bracket, the first \$1,000 will be exempted. There will be no exemption for those earning more than \$30,000.

A provision will be made also to apply the tax to self-employed persons.





**Vernon Council to Discuss Return Of Embezzled City Funds**

Just how much money the town will be reimbursed for an embezzlement from the old city of Rockville will be aired before the board of representatives Monday.

Mayor Thomas J. McQuaker disclosed today that an attorney representing the former deputy tax collector of Rockville, William F. Luddecke, will bring up the controversy over the restitution of funds before the board.

Luddecke pleaded guilty to forgery and embezzlement, and, in February, received a suspended two-to-five-year prison term and was put on two years' probation.

Since then, several meetings have been conducted in an effort to have the shortages made up to the town.

The point of the controversy is this: Luddecke pleaded guilty to defalcation of \$1,631.19, but an auditor's report, in which the shortage was uncovered, disclosed that a total of \$4,841.69 was missing.

Luddecke maintains that he is liable only for the lesser amount; town officials, who feel they are backed by state law, insist that the entire \$4,841.69 be returned.

The auditor had listed the smaller figure as the amount missing that they could prove had actually been received by the town. The larger sum was probably received, but there is no audit confirmation that it definitely was—so there is some dispute over its restitution.

The town took over all the assets and liabilities of the city when the two were combined last year.

Mayor McQuaker said today that, "As mayor, I can take no other stand than to expect the entire amount, as set forth in the auditor's report, be returned to the town."




