



When Kill Is All That County When, the other day, United Nations Secretary General Thant described the war in Vietnam as especially barbarous, he was not necessarily thinking only of some of the quaint habits of some of the Asian participants on both sides, or of the civilizing influence of American napalm.

The war in Vietnam gets its particularly barbaric aspect from the fact that It has shaped itself almost exclusively into a war of casualties, a war of annihilation, as contrasted with other obdectives in other wars.

The prime object in Vietnam is not so much to gain or occupy ground as it is to kill. It is not so much to score an old fashioned victory in any given battle as it is to kill.

television or read in interviews, is the way American soldiers in the field are thinking of their mission. And if this is the way the fighting reported from the field, it apparently is also the way it is designed and planned in the high strategy behind the lines. There is, apparently, a certain kill ratio which is satisfactory to Washington. Perhaps it is a three, to one ratio, in which we are satisfied it

we are sure three of the enemy die for every American who dies; perhaps we are willing to keep this up, on this ratio, for as long as the enemy is willing to die three for one. In other wars, casualties have no been the all in all, the end in themselves, they seem to have become in Vietnam. Other wars have had more clearly defined battle lines, fronts, geo-

graphical objectives; they have even, on occasion, sought to gain something called victory at a minimum cost in lives. But the peculiar nature of the struggle in Vietnam has shaped its strategy differently; the taking of lives is the one objective and technique of battle which is clear and logical. Always one obvious route to victory, it has now come to be considered the only route available in Vietnam. Human beings come to the end of their day and judge it a very good and a very successful day if the crop of corpses out in front of them has been high. Being in this kind of war must be

breeding two kinds of reactions in different kinds of people, one a reaction in which one lets the savage urge to kill, kill, kill come to the surface and take over one's life for a phase, the other a reaction in which there may be some beginning of a resolve to find out which way the world is really heading-forward toward civilisation, or back toward barbarism more senseless than envihing found in the most primitive states of nature.

The argument Prime Minister Wilson used in this situation ran as follows: Prime Minister Wilson and his government are determined to work through the United Nations on world issues. For the first time in history, "a British government has had the guts to admit that pendence in the ability to wage war as a separate national undertaking is a hing of the past."

But, "if we believe in peace-keeping through the United Nations, and in making our contribution to it, we have to be there, or expable of getting

For that reason, Britain must have posts at distant points overseas and mobile forces ready to operate from them, to do the bidding of the United

Also, the Prime Minister told his party, the world needs somebody out in the Far East to act as a buffer-barrier between the Americans and the Chinese, to keep them from plunging hemselves and everybody else with them into the tragedy of World War

We are glad to know this is what Britain is up to and what Britain is doing. We didn't know, and we were wor-

Now that we do know what Britain is up to, we think it's fine, and we wish more nations would show similar sense and dedication to realism, more awareness that no nation can fight wars alone, and more recognition of the United Nations as the proper channel for

Jitneys

A headline in the Wall Street Journal the other day brought back to American life an institution almost for-

The jitney, in case young people have

never heard of it, was the thing which solved the transportation problems in the great industrial cities of this country during the feverish production years of World War I. The existing troley cars weren't numerous enough or on the right streets to serve all the new war industries. Owners of private automobiles began sticking signs on their windshields and picking up passengers on any street corner, charging 10 cents for any reasonable ride. Sometimes the passengers would pack themselves onto the running boards, which were strong strips of flooring running outside the car doors. If you had a car, you could run a litney on routes and at times to please yourself. And, in time, there were jitneys which, for larger fares, sometimes as high as 75 cents or a dollar for 20 miles, would make scheduled

In relatively short time, the jitneys were improved upon. Somebody designed a bus. Companies were organized to operate buses on certain designated routes. The bus companies came under formal public supervision.___

The great episode of unregulated spontaneous, free enterprise in the field of mass transportation was over. The bus companies expanded their

routes, improved their equipment. In the meantime, however, the circumstance which had spawned the litneys in 1917 and 1918—the ordinary man's lack of his own car-was being steadily altered. Finally there came the day when so many people had their own cars that the need for bus service diminished Routes were abandoned and constricted companies disappeared; people, who, for all their ownership of their own cars, still wanted cheap transportation back and forth from work organized themselves car pools, in which, in effect, they had their own specially chartered jitney for their own special ride.

Meanwhile, however, the problem of random transportation inside some of the larger cities has grown more serious, and what the Wall Street Journal was reporting the other day was that the old-fashioned jitneys are now beginning to make their reappearance, raiding the bus stops, charging bus fares, but, unlike the buses, frequently taking their customers down side streets to their doors.

Anybody who owns a car and is willing to take his chances can get into the jitney business. It is, of course, illegal. Operating a jitney is like being part of the underworld. But it makes a good income for a lazy man who may not like to work too many hours a day. And there are people who appreciate a servwhich is quick and informal and tailored to their own timings and desti-

Eventually, of course, it may happen once again that the jitneys make so much money that somebody starts organizing them into companies, with the companies applying for franchises which will keep other jitney companies off their routes. If there are enough people who are in need of transportation, somebody will find a way to provide it for them. Somehow, however, there ought to be a better formula for 1966 han to go back to that of 1918.
