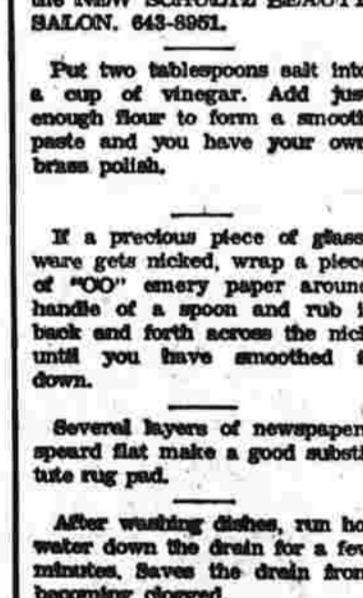

U.S. Moving 'New' Army Into Battle

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States is putting pretty much of a new army into battle in Viet Nam this summer.

It is just about a year since American troops arrived in sizable numbers and began building up to the present 270,000-man force.

Now, and during the coming six to nine months, many of these troops will be returning home after one-year tours of duty.

But the troop turnover will be neither sudden nor complete. The army intentionally staggered its replacements. It sent some draftees who had as little as two or three months in the country to their two-year Army service.

Others had five or six months to serve. Three more soldiers are replaced in less than a full year.

As an additional shock absorber, replacements are made by individual soldiers rather than whole units.

Hence, any given unit may receive a lot of new faces—some have recently—but there will be a sprinkling of combat veterans on hand.

Gen. William C. Westmoreland, commander of U.S. forces in Viet Nam, says it takes about one month for new arrivals to become acclimated to the hot and muggy Viet Nam's heat.

More Money Sought for Milk Fund

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Senate appropriations subcommittee has recommended a \$10-million increase over the amount President Johnson asked for school lunches, a special milk program and farm milk research, sources reported today.

The President proposed \$220 million for electric loans and \$85 million for extending rural telephone service. The House added \$10 million for the telephone program.

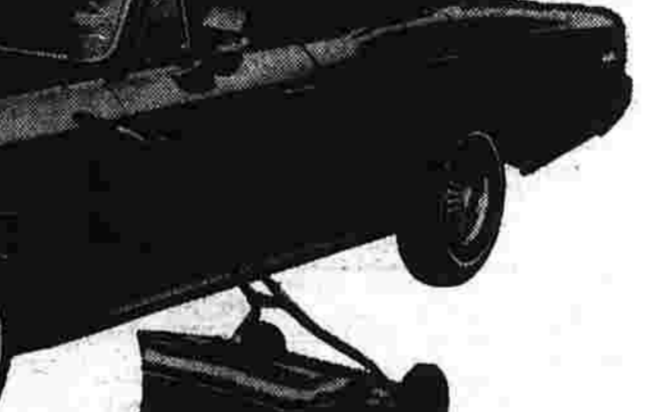

Indonesia Near Economic Failure Despite Rich Natural Resources

JAKARTA, Indonesia (AP) — drinking and relieving them. "Indonesia may improve itself in the canal. They have no money and no future. — by the year 2000," the retired government official said. Then his voice trailed off and he stared moodily at the wall.

His depression summed up the widespread pessimism in Jakarta, a nation increasingly rich in natural resources but poor in income for one in every seven.

Despite its poverty, the annual gloomy reports by Western analysts that Indonesia is on the brink of economic collapse, Indonesians will keep going. It is a nation of contrasts, a nation where millions of its people live without shoes and only wear to sleep, but a nation where old money runs out of the ground. It is a nation where rubber trees sprout where seeds drop, where rice fields swirl in the eastern rivers across the volcanic land.

The wealth of Indonesia also lies in its quinine, pepper, tin, iron, oil and coffee.

But since Indonesia declared its independence from Dutch colonial rule in 1945, it has made little headway in building a stable economy. In cold figures, Indonesia owes \$4.4 billion in foreign debt. The interest rate alone comes to about \$70 million each year, equal to Indonesia's estimated export earnings for this year.

That the poverty of this rich land can be seen in the people who struggle with it. In a major city in central Java, women work 16 hours a day sitting on a dirt floor making mats, the impregnated cloth for which Indonesia is famous. They earn seven rupiah a day, the equivalent of seven cents on an open market exchange rate.

A former ranking government official in Malang, central Java, is forced against his pride to take in boarders to make ends meet.

In teaching Jakarta, thousands live along the turgid canal, lacking city, cooking, bathing, see this year when he saw people buying flowers for a major Moslem holiday. If they can afford flowers, they can afford food, he declared.

Failures in Indonesia's economy can be traced to Dutch colonial rule. In the 300 years the Dutch ruled these islands, they did almost nothing to build a foundation for an Indonesian economy. Yet Indonesia, directly or indirectly, provided income for one in every seven Dutchmen.

The Dutch installed a dual economy, one for hard cash in export-import dealings run by the Dutch. The second was a haphazard schedule to many parts of the island. It was geared to the existence level only. Chinese were used as middlemen between the Dutch and the Indonesians, to the profit of the Chinese.

But despite this ground, the failures over the past 20 years are difficult to explain to government officials. Much of the blame is laid simply on the lack of practical foresight.

One noted author on Indonesia commented: "Like the Russian general who didn't like war because it destroyed discipline in the army, Indonesian leadership has tended to treat serious economic reform as if its purpose were to destroy the harmony of the people's poverty."

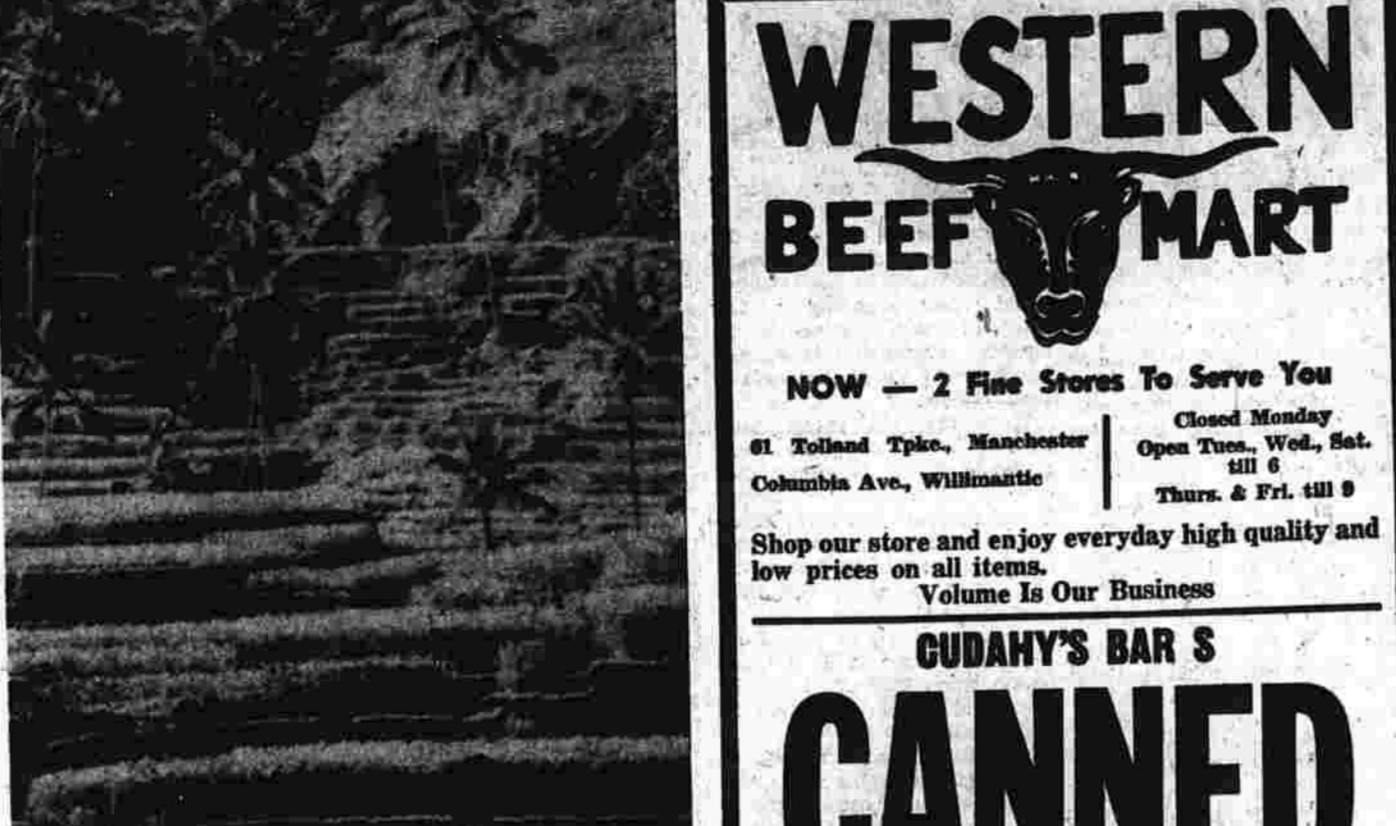
Flashes of life in Indonesia point up the pressing needs of the people. Transportation is highly erratic, almost non-existent in many areas. Trains run sporadically and are so over-crowded some passengers ride vegetables and even, chewing betel nuts and nursing a child. The people, however, were sensitive about having their pictures taken. They complained their hair not fixed. Both are understatements since the clothes were full of holes and the hair full of lice. But the rebels stop for eggs on the next island which they sell at a profit before they come again.

Ships waiting to come into port at Jakarta have to pay large bribes to get berthing and they will be kept waiting weeks in the cutter harbor. Once unloading begins, great amounts of cargo may be pilfered. Soldiers have openly robbed several ships.

A market scene in the central Java city of Purwokerto pointed, cannot be ignored.

Vernon Meeting Cuts Budget \$37,000, Approves It; Tax Is 53 Mills

About 400 town residents last night cut \$37,000 from the proposed town budget for 1967 before approving it at a two-hour town meeting.

After the meeting adjourned, the board of representatives met long enough to set a tax rate of 53 mills for the coming year—an increase of 5 mills over the present 48.

The cut of \$37,000 from the proposed \$5,064,391 budget was proposed after two hours of debate that saw the rejection of several proposals to cut the budget figure.

It was Town Treasurer Raymond Spelman, a veteran legislator, who came up with the parliamentary move that saved the day for the budget proposal.

Spelman observed that "it appears that we are here to adopt a budget, and we don't want to go over a five-mill increase."

"Let's recess for five minutes," he said, and the board of representatives worked on their budget.

The five-minute recess lasted 25 minutes as representatives and members of the board of education talked.

But, when they returned, they told residents that they could insure a 53-mill tax rate by slashing \$37,000 from the budget. It was approved about 20 minutes later, at about 11 p.m., at a total of \$5,027,391.

It was obvious when the meeting started that there was much opposition to the proposed budget, which carried a predicted tax increase of between 7.5 and 8.5 mills.

A large number of persons who favored adoption of the budget were also present, including many town employees—teachers, policemen and public works employees.

Objectors to the budget voiced satisfaction over the course of education budget, but wanted cuts made in the general government budget.

David Howe, in a prepared speech presented at the start of the meeting, proposed that the budget be cut \$250,000, with only \$50,000 coming from the school budget.

Mayor Thomas J. McCook noted that Howe's cut would force the town to operate next year on less than was allocated this year.

"You are saying that you want less service than you had this year?" the mayor asked.

Howe's amendment was rejected.

Rasley Proposal

Also discussed was a proposal made last week by Rep. George Rasley, who said he would be returned to each department head for five per cent reductions.

Last night, Rasley explained that his proposal entailed salaries or fixed costs, but would result in a budget reduction of about \$100,000.

"There's no one here who wouldn't operate their home with a cut of five per cent in their budget," Rasley said.

Rasley's proposal and another which would have lessened the reduction to three per cent, were rejected, when Rep. William Smith noted that most of the cuts in the general government budget are fixed.

Smith noted that, of the \$2,700,000 general government budget, about \$700,000 is earmarked for salaries and fees and another \$600,000 for bonds and interest.

Only the balance of about \$1,400,000 could be cut. A five per cent cut of \$70,000, Smith said, would result in a budget of \$1,330,000.

Town officials were able to salvage a proposal for weekly town-wide refuse collection. Although the collections are listed at a cost of \$38,000, Mayor McCook noted that, if the proposal were rejected, not all of the costs would be eliminated.

The services which would be eliminated might include some pupil transportation, libraries, the entire athletic program, music, art and advanced programs for bright students.

During the evening, several persons voiced interest in attracting new industry to town to help alleviate the tax burden.

One thing that attracts industry, Dr. Ramadell said, "is a good school system."

James Brennan, chairman of the school board's budget committee, noted that the board had already cut \$216,000 from the budget request of the school administration before it was ever presented to the town.

Because of a classroom shortage, the school board this year rented classrooms in several buildings around town. One of the classrooms for elementary children in the Vernon Grange hall on Rt. 30.

Gordon Gibson of Hartford Township, who identified himself as a grantee officer, charged the school board with "sloppy administration" in running the schools.

In the Bronx, the lone congressional candidate backed by Democratic leader Charles A. Buckley, Rep. Jacob H. Gitlin, won renomination.

tests indicated his hormones were not functioning normally in 85 per cent of the group.

Perlestein postulated that when synthetic hormones 7-8 is given in large doses the antibodies go after this agent, permitting the natural hormone to function normally.

Perlestein said 90 per cent of his overweight patients with thyroid problems could be put on excess pounds.

He said it was precipitated by a stress situation such as an operation, fracture, a psychic problem or birth of a child.

"It is felt these obese individuals are literally born to become fat, that some particular stress tips the balance and an antibody situation then develops which binds the thyroxine that they produce in unusable form," he concluded.

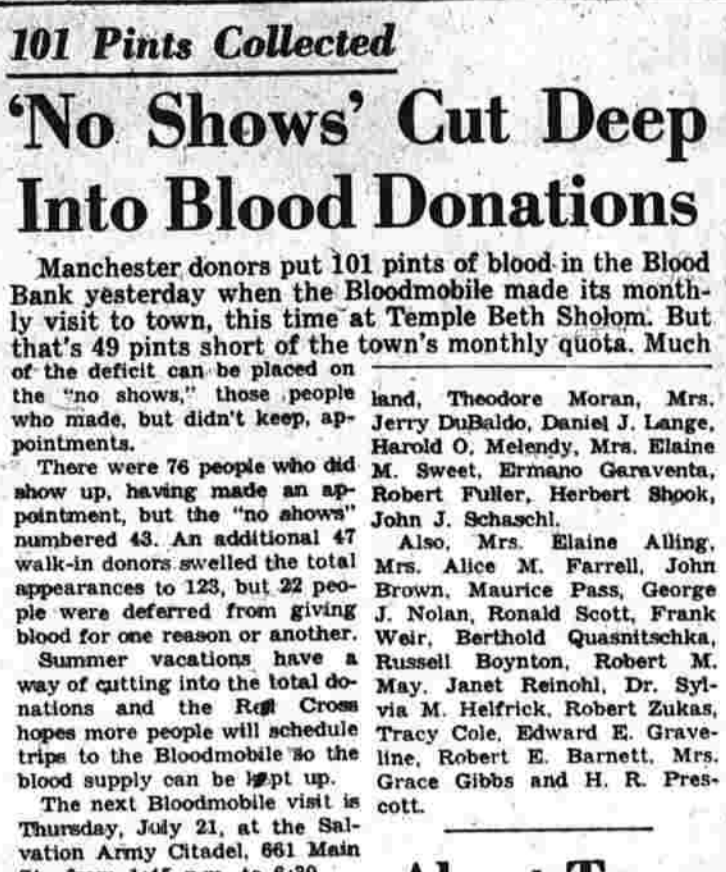

Presses CIA Checks
WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. J.W. Fulbright, chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, says he will press for a show-bill vote July 24 on the move to broaden Senate surveillance of the Central Intelligence Agency.

Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy, D-Minn., a member of the committee headed by the Arkansas Democrat, had introduced a resolution to create a nine-member committee on intelligence operations to replace the seven-member subcommittee of Armed Services and Appropriations Committee supervising the CIA.

The new committee would include three senators each from the armed services, appropriations and foreign relations committees.

Hospitals Lag
WASHINGTON (AP) — Administration officials say 82 per cent of the nation's hospital beds have been certified under the Civil Rights Act to participate in Medicare when it starts Friday.

But they expect to see the slow progress of many hospitals to comply with the anti-discrimination provisions necessary before hospitals can take part in the health insurance program.

President Johnson was told Tuesday that only 36.6 per cent of hospital beds in Mississippi have been certified under the Civil Rights Act. Mississippi is the only state with fewer than half its hospital beds certified.

But officials also noted that 63.1 per cent of the hospital beds in Georgia and 62.6 per cent in Louisiana are barred from participation.

Arms Cap Feared
WASHINGTON (AP) — The Republican Coordinating Committee wants Congress to set up a blue ribbon committee to study the future U. S. defense posture.

The committee would be headed by Sen. J.W. Fulbright, chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. It would include members from both parties.

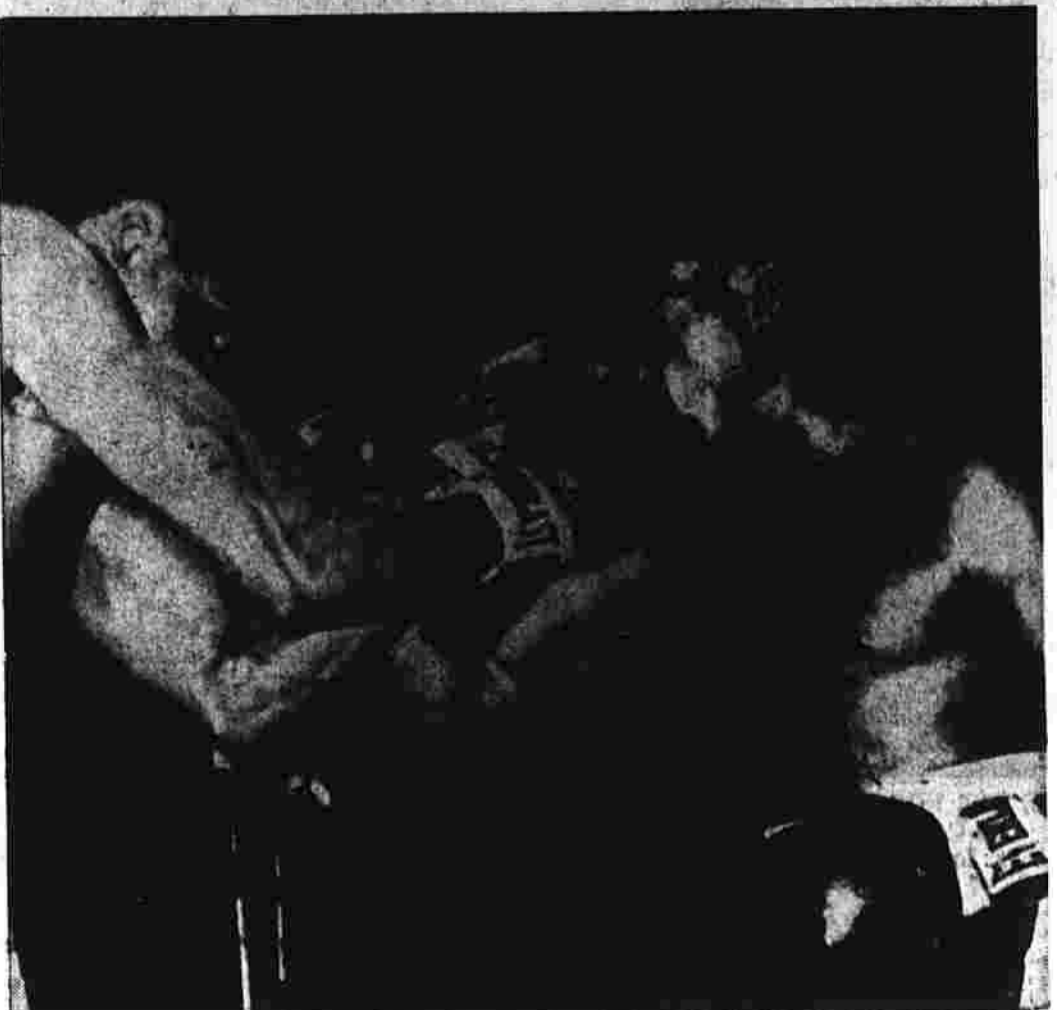
