The state of Illinois retains the death penalty-by electrocution. That means that, if this murderer can be caught, that emotional feeling within most of us -that nothing could be too terrible a punishment to inflict on anybody who could commit such a crime-has a chance of being satisfied.

That leaves this killer's chance of saving his life, in the event he is caught, up to the vagaries of interpretation and application of the factor of sanity. Any man who kills another must be to some degree insane; a man who would senselessly kill eight people in one sequence of events has to be totally insane. But the chance of having the insanity factor govern a trial and verdict does not always follow that kind of logic. The emotion of public horror sometimes steps in, and transforms too much insanity into an assumption of no legal insanity

ounded if when a capture and convicdon are obtained, it develops that this murderer has already had some record which might have alerted society, and perhaps did alert society, to the fact that he had dangerous potentialities. We don't quite know how we are going to We don't know, either, how to prevent them, even when we have warning signals in some individual's conduct. We always have to wonder, in such cases, what kind of trial the madman is going to get, and to what lesser degree society is going to find itself on trial. But mainly, we shudder, at what the component parts of man, this "social animal," can sometimes break down into.

Let's Take A Stand On Vehicle Inspection

On one hand, good sense tells our industry to support periodic Motor Vehicle Inspection for the obvious reasons of saving lives and selling their wares. On the other hand, some autonotive service businessmen fear criticism from hose who will accuse them of capitalizing on ragic situation for commercial motives.

The National Safety Council has named roper vehicle maintenance, along with driver error nd road conditions, as one of the three factors responsible for soaring U.S. traffic fatalities which o at \$70,000 each) in the stallion- of all involved Nashua, obtained

Safety officials freely admit that statistic n deaths caused by faulty vehicles are inconclusive due to the frequently mangled condition of vehicles involved in fatal accidents and the scarcit this can be discerned) are grouped under the broad heading of "Driver Error." There are figures which show this to be the cause of nine out of ten highway accidents, involving a fatality.

Nearly 15,000, or about one-third, of all 196 traffic deaths were included under "Driver Error. but are also more specifically tagged unexplained, or law enforcement officers admit that there is n way to determine how many of these "mystery" crashes were at least partially due to mechanical

For example, imagine that back in 1964, driver in his new car pulled out to pass a truck on two-lane highway in a fairly tight situation. He was perhaps guilty of slight misjudgment and even little recklessness for not waiting for a safer noment to pass. But he drew on his engine's full power and passed the truck with a minimum of room to spare. Now, two years later, we have the same driver in the same car with the same ten dencies in the identical situation. But he's operating s vehicle with possibly 30,000 miles on it. He makes

the same "slight error" or misjudgment. This motorist has been reasonably conscient tious about the safety elements of car care: He has good tires, wiper blades and brakes. His horn works. But halfway around the truck, when he needs it most, the engine, overdue for a tune-up, hesitates when the accelerator is "floored." The result could be tragic,

This kind of accident is likely to be chalked u in the grim book of statistics as "Driver Error. True, the driver was wrong, but he was guilty of double misjudgment . . . improper driving practices and neglect of his vehicle.

With greater public and legislative attention being focused on the deplorable highway slaughter, and consequently the rising sentiment in favor of Compulsory Motor Vehicle Inspection, it is not only ood business, but also the moral responsibility of all those engaged in the automotive service business to point out all mechanical deficiencies in cars

It is generally conceded that the average river does not consider it unethical or "pressure selling" when a mechanic suggests needed repairs. These mechanically-oriented people are the experts their field, and the motorist does not resent honest advice when he takes his car to that expert

Now, more than ever, with Compulsory Motor Vehicle Inspection gaining increasing attention and public support, automotive service people must pre-pare themselves honestly and conscientiously to play their proper role, It is appropriate that all of us engaged in any

phase of the automotive repair industry jump into the fray over vehicle safety, for there is no group petter qualified to provide safety maintenance by he motoring public. This should not be an act of passive participa-

tion, but rather a spirited campaign in communitie throughout the nation. Here is a legitimate and There is no need to be hesitant about promot-

ng safety products and services, encouraging proper vehicle maintenance, or endorsing required The "ax" some critics claim we're grinding
