ring, there is much of it that is new. This highly important decision by a one vote margin comes not from the United States Supreme Court, the highest court in this country, but from the International Court of Justice, the highest court in the world.

of civil rights, as some of the controversial decisions from the Supreme Court have done ,to the distress of our reactionaries, the decision from the International Court of Justice retards the cause of civil rights, to the distress of the world's liberals, by refusing to take any court jurisdiction over the way South Africa, with its policy of Apartheid, is administering South-West Africa, a territory it holds and governs as a man-

The division of the 15 judges voting in the International Court of Justice is of some interest.

The judge from Communist Russia voted on the side of the angels, and on the side of the United States, and on the side of civil rights progress. But the judge from Communist Poland voted not to disturb South Africa in its denial of rights to people with black

If the Communist judges split, so did the judges representing democracy. Britain, Australia, France, and Italy helped throw the case out. But Nationalist China and Japan sid-

ed with the United States and Russia in the losing minority. One might gather, from this, that the judges voted in accordance with their individual opinions as judges rather than according to nationality or ideological alignment.

This, whatever the result in any given case, would be the way it should be. And one has to concede that the judgment of the majority, however benighted it may seem in result, had a right to take its grounds and express them as it did. It was necessary, said the majority judgment, "not to confuse the moral ideal with the legal rules." The duty of the Court, it said, "is to apply the law as it finds it, not to make

There will be those who will see in this one vote decision by the World Court a telling rebuke to some of the one vote decisions in our own Supreme Court. But the main thing to be seen is the

judicial process working out in the world in something of the same way sometimes the highly unsatisfactory same way - it works out in our nation. The important thing, if it can be managed in the world, is to sustain the idea and form of the law even when there is disagreement with its precise functionings.

Renewal And The Architect Now that parts of Springfield are

crumbling before demolition ball and bulldozer, thoughts of what private and public renewal will do to the city's mage are a bit tardy. But we trust the result will deserve better than the horrified reaction that New York City's new face has evoked from the prominent architect, Philip Johnson.

Mr. Johnson, in his commencement address at Mount Holyoke College, bemoaned the passing of Pennsylvania Station, the building of superhighways that cut off the water view, the replacement of the plaza at 59th St. and Fifth Ave. by the "super cheapy" being erected by General Motors Corp., the "ruining" of Brooklyn Bridge by a double deck. These and other changes occurred, said Mr. Johnson, because . . . we cannot, or as I believe will not, make our environment a place of beauty, our cities works of art." More than beauty, he added, Americans cherish money and utility. "But we are in 'Napoleon's words, a nation of shopkeepers. We mistrust the De Gaulles of this world that talk of glory, and we are not going to change."

Perhaps it would be unfair to speculate in what Mr. Johnson might have said about Springfield's downtown and North End urban renewal programsthough he had projects similar to Riverview Apartments in mind when he said. ". . . we used to have slums, now we have superslums." He might have found more character in the homes and stores of old Ferry St., for instance, than in the shiny structures that will replace But for an architect's view of the lo-

cal program, the words of Pietro Belluschi are more pertinent. Mr. Belluschi and Edouardo Catalano are the architects for the "New Springfield," the downtown development program of the Springfield Central Business District, Inc. They do, of course, have a personal stake in what's going on-but this includes having impressive credentials to uphold. Mr. Belluschi, retired dean of the MIT School of Architecture and Planning, sees the American city as "an institution that cannot die" be cause of the "opportunities it affords; the culture it can generate; the monuments it can build; the exchange of goods, services and ideas it can offer. . . ." He sees Springfield "rising to the challenge of self-renewal with vigor and determination."

There is after all, no reason for a city or a nation to think of its "shopkeepers" as undesirables-or its wage earners or anyone else who contribut to its economic stability. Their work is translated ultimately into cultural assets. It took labor, as well as cultural aspirations, to build Egypt's pyramids and the Parthenon of Greece. -SPRINGFIELD UNION



Wilson Returns LONDON (AP) - Prime Minister Harold Wilson returned empty-handed from his Moscow peace mission today to face Britain's worst economic crisis in 17 years.


