### Sierra Club Hits IRS on Conservation

By WILLIAM C. WERTZ

 That indefatigable champion of conservation, the Sierra Club, has suddenly discovered that the Internal Revenue Service is curious about how it spends its money.

The club suspects that the IRS' interest may not be entirely divorced from the fact that it is embroiled, again, in a fight with the federal government.

In fact the executive director of the Sierra Club, David Brower, charges that the tax agency is "trying to scare us" with an investigation.

The IRS is trying to determine if a "substantial part" of club funds are used in an attempt to influence legislation. If so, says the IRS, contributors no longer will be permitted to deduct club dues and fees from their income taxes.

"It's a gut blow, a low punch," said Brower in an interview. "If they get us, it will be a blow to conservation groups all over the country, and conservation can't afford to be timid at a time like this."

The Sierra Club never has been timid.

In the 74 years since it was founded by California nature lover John Muir, the club has grown into the nation's most influential conservation organization. Today it boasts 20 chapters and more than 40,000 members across the country, all dedicated to the preservation of what's left of the American wilderness.

Right now the club is waging two major battles. It is trying to block construction of two dams on the Colorado River outside Grand Canyon National Park, and it is advocating creation of a 90,000-acre Redwood National Park in Northern California.

The campaign against the Grand Canyon dams, triggered the IRS investigation.

The club received a handwritten warning from the IRS less than 24 hours after it placed advertisements in the Washington Post and the New York Times urging readers to oppose legislation that would authorize construction of the dams.

"How can you fight a warning that vague?" Brower asks. "How much is 'substantial'?"

What constitutes "influencing legislation?"

The club argues that the dams would not be used to store water for the thirty cities of the Southwest. Instead, it contends, they would be used as "cash registers" to raise money for other water development projects through the sale of electricity they would generate.

This money could be raised more efficiently by building steam generating plants, powered by the Southwest's abundant coal reserves or by nuclear power, the club argues.

Secretary of the Interior Stewart L. Udall has offered to compromise by eliminating one dam from the project, but the Sierra Club won't go along.

"We want to preserve the free-flowing river throughout the entire canyon," Brower says. "It won't be a victory unless it is."

**Travelers Fly Hemisphere To Reach Destinations**

**NEW YORK (AP)**—A goldfish supplier in Missouri caused the airline to be held up, as it is in Washington, D.C., where the strike against five major airlines became evident, negotiators in Washington worked against a union deadline of 8 p.m. EDT, today.

TWA reported Tuesday that the strike had forced one of its freight customers, Ozark Fisheries of Bluefield, Mo., out of the world's largest suppliers of live goldfish, to shut down.

Shippers of other perishable goods also were affected. Maine lobster dealers sought alternate routes south and west for their products.

Some frustrated air travelers jammed trains and buses or rented cars, but others waited the airways, often spending extra time, effort and money to find a way to their destinations on airlines unaffected by the strike.

"It's like it was in World War II," said a spokesman in San Francisco for American Airlines. "People are camping out here in the terminal."

In Los Angeles, a Continental Airlines spokesman said one flight was delayed half an hour while authorities searched out a standby passenger who had raced past ticket takers and locked himself in the plane's restroom.

A woman showed up wearing dark glasses, the spokesman said, and claimed she was blind. After she was put on a plane and it took off, he said, she removed the glasses and began reading a magazine.

One Los Angeles passenger bound for Miami got there this way: Western Airlines to Seattle, Canadian Pacific Airlines to Tampa, another rented car to Miami. Another reported took the same trip: Varig Airlines to Panama City, then Braniff to Miami.

In the East, operating carriers reported unusually heavy traffic to Montreal, where U.S. passengers apparently were seeking Canadian air routes across the continent.

Tourist and convention business across the nation was reported seriously affected.

The situation in Miami was a "grade A disaster," said a hotel official, estimating lost tourist business at \$400,000 a day.

In New York the estimate was \$700,000 a day, and the Kansas City Hotel Association said business was off one-third to one-half.

Railroads and bus lines did banner business and so did many of the nonstruck airlines.

Other operating airlines, however, reported business down because there were fewer trunk flights to connect with their feeder routes.

In Seattle, a spokesman for Great Northern Railway reported expected business up 30 per cent but admitted not all the customers were happy ones.

"Many airlines customers are anxious and visibly upset because they are not flying," he said.

What's the government doing to open employment opportunities for Negroes?

"There is no more uply and urgent crisis facing this nation today than the economic security of Negro Americans. Negro unemployment is of disaster proportions.

That was the consensus of the recent White House Conference On Civil Rights. It called for sweeping action by government and business to ease one of the nation's most painful racial problems.

At the same time, the Labor Department reported that Negroes have gained substantial ground in employment over the past decade. But it cautioned that they might lose most of it in the next decade unless they won a bigger share of skilled and white-collar jobs.

The federal government has moved on several fronts to combat not only the problem of less Negroes but also the equally serious dilemma of Negroes employed below their levels of skill and education.

### Vernon Mayor Warns Police Over Towing Policy

Mayor Thomas J. McCusker has warned that he will suspend any policeman who disregards orders regarding the towing of wrecked cars from an accident scene.

His statement came in the wake of a complaint from four town garage operators who hired a lawyer in an effort to keep the towing jobs from being sent out of town.

### Tolland Dump Rules Are Outlined

In a letter to the board of representatives, read at their meeting Monday night, Atty. Gen. Abbot Schwabel said that the Vernon Police Department uses an out-of-town garage for towing most wrecked cars from accident scenes.

Atty. Schwabel said that the local owners feel that police should contact local garages for towing service "where the car owner at the scene does not indicate a choice of garages."

When questioned yesterday, Trapp said that he had knowledge of the situation. "It's the first I've known of," Trapp said.

Mayor McCusker made the list available to the public. According to the list, from Sept. 27, 1966, when the mayor's first directive was issued, and March 31, 1966, an out-of-town garage received more than 40 calls, or almost twice as many as the local garages combined.

Atty. Schwabel took issue with the comment that the out-of-town firm had no major requests.

"I don't believe that there were that many requests for any one garage," Atty. Schwabel said. He added that police officers at the scene could "reg-ally" call a specific garage, then radio the "recommendation" in as a choice made by the motorist.

On March 28, Chief Trapp sent a letter to one of the local garages promising an end to the problem.

At the end of the letter, Trapp includes a "List of Towing Services." Three of the telephone numbers listed are wrong.

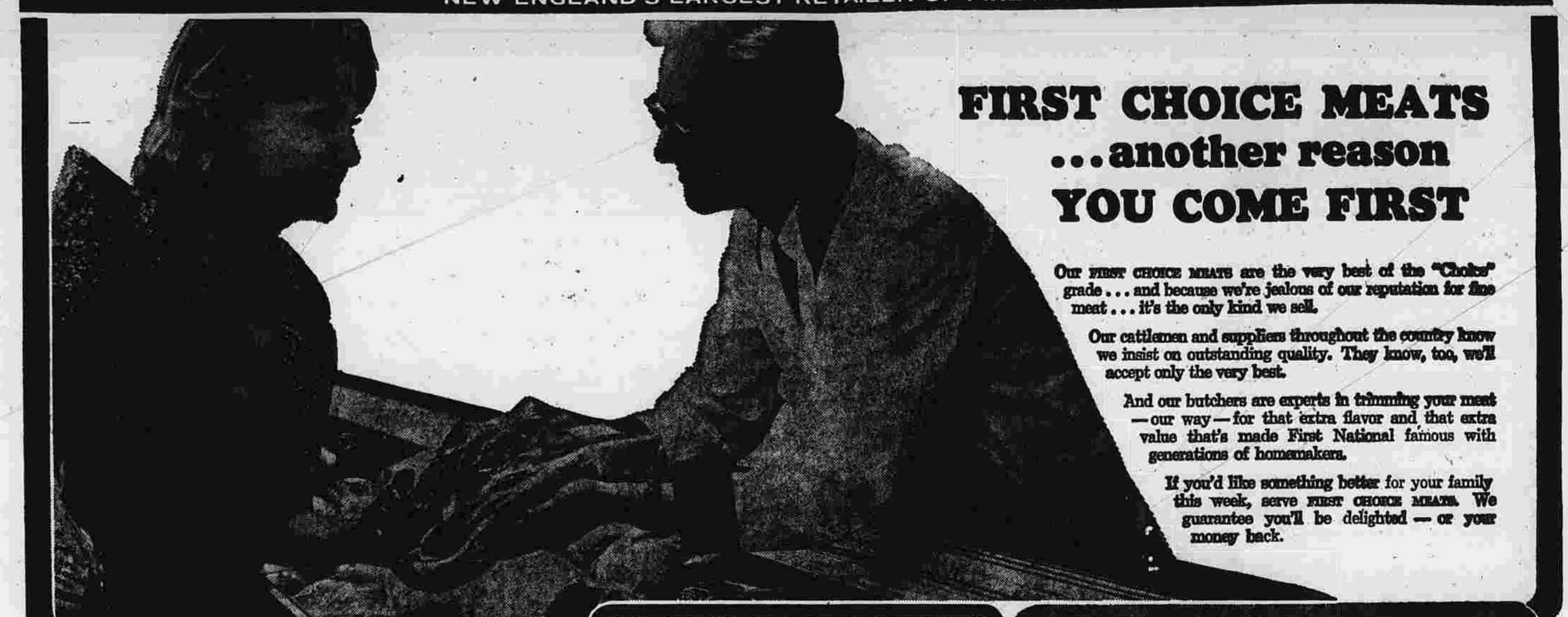

**Bristol Picks Chief**  
BRISTOL (AP)—The Board of Police Commissioners named Capt. William J. Mead Jr. chief of the Bristol Police Department Tuesday night.

Grace was appointed chief in 1964 in the wake of a police burglary scandal. He has been hospitalized frequently during the last several months.

**Firms Studying Ways to Catch Night Sunlight**  
SEATTLE, Wash. (AP)—The Boeing Co. has received a government contract to look into ways of making the sun shine at night.

The \$125,000 award is for a study of the feasibility of orbiting a huge satellite to reflect light from the sun on to the dark side of the earth.

The award was made Tuesday by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, reu reports. Receipts reported from the 1965 Census of Business were \$568 million; in the 1963 Census, one of two trustees of the bankruptcy trust, said advanced manned missions for billion.

**NHRR Trustee Asks Interim Finance Help**  
GREENWICH (AP)—A trustee of the New Haven Railroad went to the heart of Connecticut's commuter belt today to say the need for interim financial aid for the line is growing more vital.

The reason, said Richard Joyce Smith, is the "indicated delay" in the merger of the Connecticut and New York Central Railroads, which will include the New Haven's operations.

Smith, one of two trustees of the bankrupt line, said extended litigation by other railroads will delay the merger.

Speaking before the Greenwich Rotary Club, Smith said the potential delay in the merger "makes the interim role of public authorities in providing the trust with needed funds more important than before."

"We trustees are conscious of our responsibilities under these new circumstances and will promptly seek realistic commitments from the states in which we operate."

The New Haven serves Connecticut, Massachusetts, Rhode Island and New York.

Commuter service will be kept up at its present levels through Dec. 31 by means of state and federal subsidy agreements. New agreements remain to be negotiated to cover service beyond that date.

Smith said the New Haven has been "living off steadily declining capital for many years and are now at the point where, in my opinion, we cannot continue to function very much longer as an independent enterprise."

"All concerned now recognize the urgency of the situation," Smith said, that "public interest without public action will not save even the West End commuterville service, between New York and Connecticut."

Smith struck a brighter note, however, in saying that once the New Haven's current problems are solved, "it ought to be possible to attract more off-peak riders to our trains."

This would be accomplished, he said, through the infusion of new capital, streamlining of service, and an increase in the "productivity of our facilities."

**Truck Driver Dies**  
NORWALK (AP)—A truck driver from Pennsylvania who had suffered burns over much of his body in a crash three days earlier died Tuesday in a hospital.
