However, sales for the quarter were off only 2.7 per cent from previous second quarter. This year's quarterly sales figure was \$5.501 billion, compared with \$5.657 billion in the same period last year. GM Chairman Frederic G.

conner and President James M. Roche explained the drop saying the early part of last year's production and sales increased abnormally as a reaction to The officials also said second

quarter earnings were affected by lower unit sales, increased construction costs, and higher costs for labor, materials, engineering and tooling. Earnings per share for the second quarter were \$1.90 compared with \$2.23 a share one

year ago. The company reported net income for the first six months of \$1.14 billion against \$1.275 billion for the first six months of 1965. Sales were down \$12 million dollars from the all-time high in the first half last year of \$11.215 billion.

Second-quarter unit total for GM was 1,253,201 passenger cars, with a first half total of 2,-604,213. A year ago the figures for passenger cars were 1,386,-527 and 2,771,965, respectively.
