It was timely, except that it was in complete error in its timing. What Secretary General Thant said

"The United Nations Charter is . . . in terms of practical politics, far ahead of its time. But if governments and peoples will persevere in the effort, both private and public, to come to terms with the world as it now is, they will begin to find in the Charter a most useful mechanism for their protection and for the regulation of their affairs, rather than what it seems to be now-a catalogue of good intentions and, sometimes, a useful last resort in times of trouble."

And what the Monitor did with this, beyond sticking "Far Ahead Of Its Time" in the title of its editorial, conmight indeed be far ahead of its time, but added that "so too was the Constitution of the United States when it was first drafted."

That latter statement merely comcounds the error which has us embroil-

The Constitution of the United States was not far ahead of its time at all. It came just in time, in fact, to create and save this country. In fact, it got itself written a little late-almost too late.

The United Nations Charter is not "ahead of its time" either. It is very late. It is at least two World Wars and some 50 or 60 million casualties late. There is a very grave immediate question whether it has got here in time. The hour is unbelievably, shockingly late. That's the way we would, if we could, spread the message about the

peating the Secretary General's phrase, and some wise, true things to say, as "Nationalism is still one of the most potent forces in the world and can slip

all too easily from an idealistic into an aggressive stance. The newly independent nations have used the UN to assert their nationhood, often with a pretension that outstrips their power. And the great powers have used their power often with only hypocritical lip service to idealism.

"In the last resort, if will be the super-power members of the UN that will make or break the organization. To begin with, they must resist the tempta-Hon to go too far in settling the affairs of the world through dialogue outside the UN. And secondly they must take the UN seriously as an expression of the hope of mankind."

And let us all realize, above all, that the UN is the most overdue, the most felayed, the most tardy delivery made by the twentieth century. Seldom has anything been so far behind the necessity for it, and it has come on the scene just in the nick of time, providing we aren't too sick to make room for it and

Good News On Economic Front news if this country's business commusity is now experiencing something of a et-down in its optimism.

A survey of the "Boom's New Mood" en the financial page of the New York firmes the other morning noted the ight money situation, the doldrums on e stock market, and the slowdown of number of business activities, and then observed the following:

Psychological change has been more putte and dramatic than the changes

taking place in the economy. Hopes had soared too high earlier in the year when the advance was running at an unsustainable pace. Now that things are proceeding more leisurely, hopes seem to be dipping too low.

"The influence of sentiment has often een exaggerated. But psychological attitudes can be important. The expansion owes a lot of its long life and balance to the restrained behavior of businessmen in its early days, when they were haunted by fears that the economy was inherently prone to sluggishness. "As a result they avoided excesses-

n inventory accumulation and in pricing-that kept the boom orderly. "But the very length and strength of the boom helped to bring a change in psychology. Once businessmen began to think that the expansion was not only for real but also forever things began to get out of hand.

"What is happening now is an adjustment from the abnormal projections that had become the norm last winter. No one knows just what hes ahead, but veryone-investors, businessmen, connumers seems to recognize that the expectations have been out of line with What all this is saying is that this

country has at least some kind of chance of adjusting itself gradually and sensibly to some of the realities of its economic situation instead of meeting them all abruptly in one big disastrous erash landing on top of them. If we can deliberately and consciously

take it easy with the prosperity we have, we might even be able to nurse some reasonable portion of it along, instead of losing it all in one fell depres-

A timely dash of moderate pessimism can be, in this circumstance, the best kind of good news.

It rains cats and dogs, and it rains on the just and the unjust, and sunshine follows it, and there is still more alarm if it rains on St. Swithin's Day, which it did not this year, than if it did. The Captured Airmen

The North Vietnamese threat to try, and possibly execute, captured American fliers is one more depressing development in a depressing war. And because it is so emotion-packed, it is all the more necessary to try to view it calm-

Even as it is, the plight of the men is sad enough-paraded before taunting mobs and, judging from the photos, perhaps suffering other mistreatment as well. The idea that they might be tried and put to death as "war criminals" is evoking heated reaction here at home; one Senator warns that the U.S. would, in that event, make a desert of North

Understandable though the reaction is, it is not calculated to contribute to the most intelligent prosecution of the war. Hard as it is to say it, the national interest requires that the war be waged in accordance with the best military judgment, without regard to the fate of the airmen or to public outcry or to rancer within the Administration.

Actually, the Hanot regime presumably seeks to influence America's conduct of the war. It is violating the Geneva Convention, to which it is a signatory, on the ostenshible ground that the U.S. is waging an undeclared aggressive war; the contention is nonsense because the Convention applies to wars declared or undeclared. The real point is that it is the nature of Communists to abide or not abide by the niceties of international law as it

In this case it seems likely, as C. L. Sulzberger suggests in the New York Times, that the Communists are attempting to use the fliers to ward off further broadening of the war against North Vietnam; sealing off Haiphong harbor, for one example. In other words, they might try but not execute the prisoners unless the U.S. did undertake significant expansions of the attacks on

We obviously cannot pretend to know whether expansion is dictated by military need. All we are saying is that it should not be done in reprisal; nor should new targets be rejected, in hope of saving the fliers, if such raids are deemed necessary for the war effort. The American purpose is to bring the war to an acceptable conclusion, and that must be the guiding consideration. It will be a bitter thing if Hanoi carries out its threats. But when a nation is pitted against Communists, it has no reason to expect anything but Commuelty. - WALL STREET JOUR-
