





A Death Of Feeling, Too? There is something terribly unfeeling and brutalizing about the way the weekly tell of American lives and wounds in Vietnam bounces off all our conscious-

And if we do not seem capable of taking really to heart, really to our sorrow, and really to our conscience, the essualties which would be of most concern to us because they are American, it stands almost without saying that we open our feelings hardly at all to the score of South Vietnamese allies who have been killed and wounded, and none at all to the score as it is estimated for The statistic the news services seem

to like to apply to the statistics from Vietnam is that of the number of casualties in the American Revolution, and this week, by this calculation, more Americans have died fighting for Vietnam than died fighting for the chance to create the United States of America. But if this is an attempt at justification by some process of historical association, it doesn't quite come off. It warns us that we are paying a heavy price in American lives in Vietnam, but tt doesn't convince us that the cause is

as just or as clear as that involved in

our own Revolution. To the contrary,

some extreme views in the Vietnam controversy make the claim that we Americans are fighting against tion, not for it, in Vietnam. But the main reaction of Americans to American easualties in Vietnam seems to be, except for the sorrowful families involved, except for those moments in which the President uses their sacrifice to point up he own emotional appeals for support in his policies, al-

It is as if something in all of us, something in the national awareness, something in the national heart, something in the national conscience, were itself dead-dead beyond feeling, dead beyond any capacity to accept the mental anguish which might be part of so much blood being spilled in a cause still so debatable among Americans them-

As has been said so many times, war has many casualties in addition to those which occur on the battlefieldeasualties in the department of truth, and of feeling. And war's summit brutalization seems to come when it happens that we no longer seem to care how bloody and brutal it has become.
