But non-arrest does not cure the reality or the condition. And that, in the final appraisal, seems the big trouble with the new system in New York. It takes away the one poor recourse soelety had for dealing with those truly broken human beings. Taking this recurrent jailing system away highlights the need for some other kind of facility for dealing with the common ordinary grunk. If jail is not to be easily available as a "drying out place," and if there is nothing more than a temporary periodic "drying out place" which can be prescribed or offered for these dere-Hots of the streets, then some such place should be provided, for easy access, as a substitute for what has hitherto been the easy jail term.
